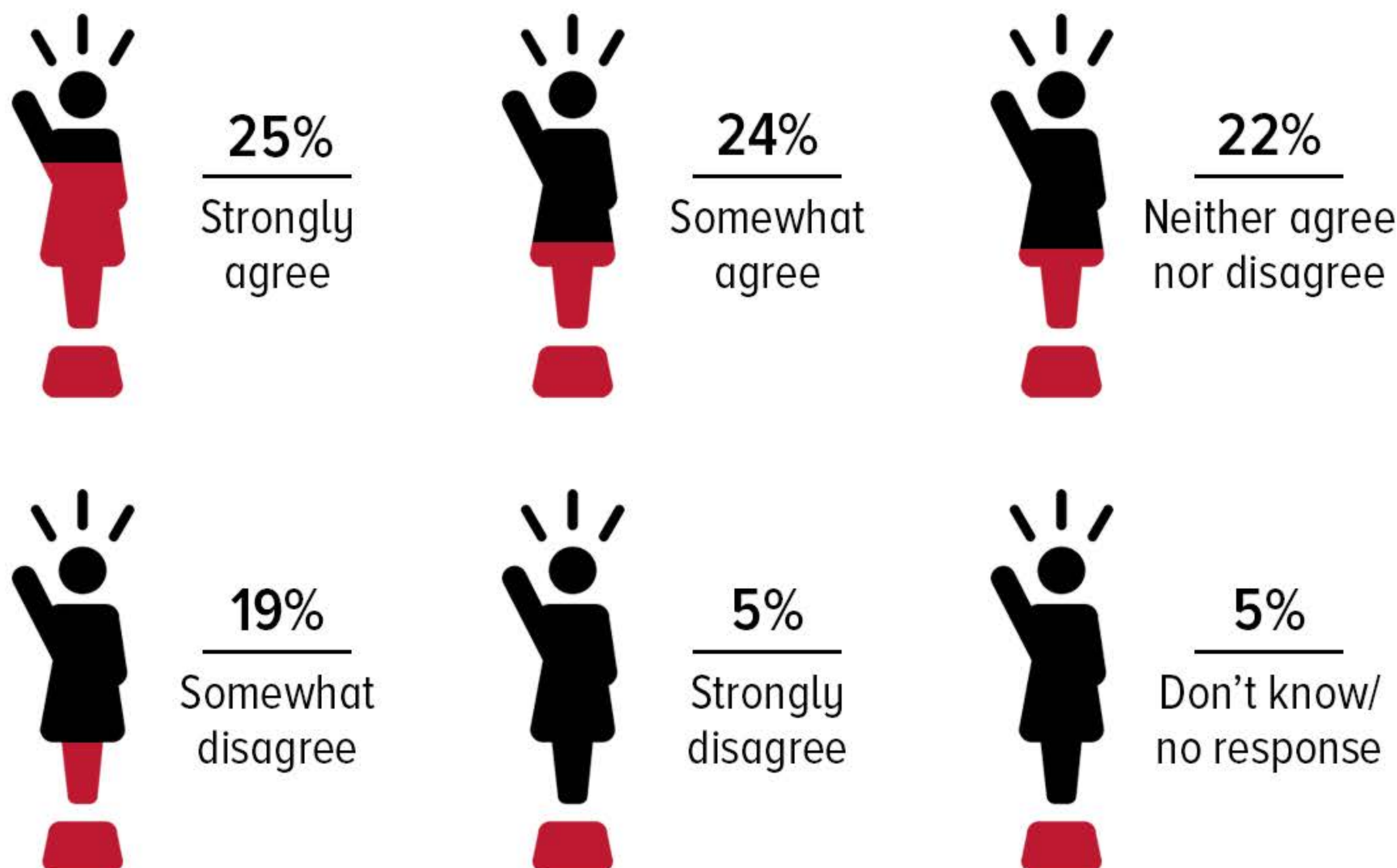

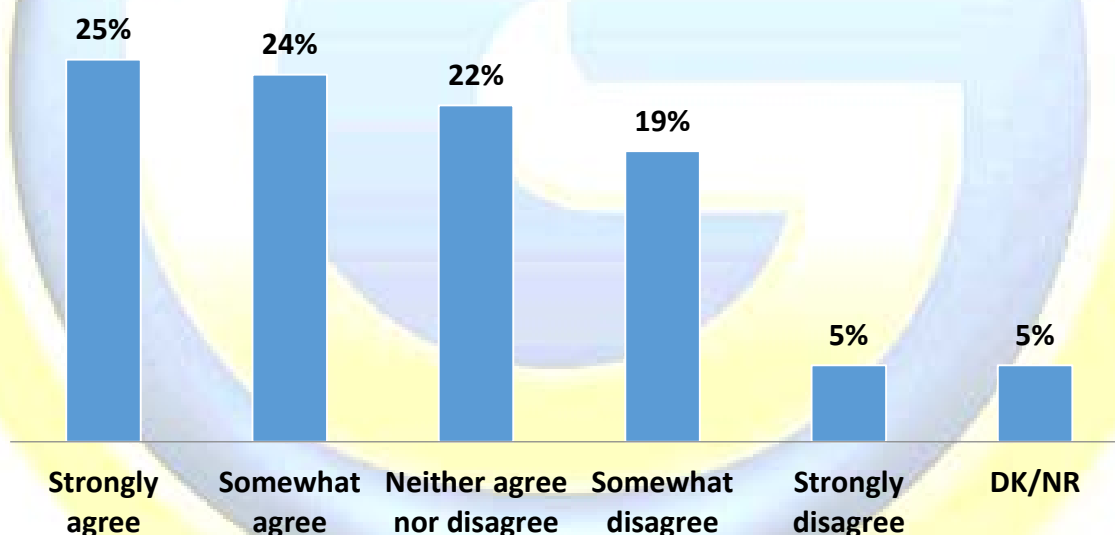
**Nearly half Pakistanis (49%) believe men to be better leaders than women. 24% say otherwise.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly half Pakistanis (49%) believe men to be better leaders than women. 24% say otherwise.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Please tell, to what extent to you agree or disagree with the following statement: *Men generally make better leaders than women.*" In response to this question, 25% said strongly agree, 24% said somewhat agree, 22% said neither agree nor disagree, 19% said somewhat disagree and 5% said strongly disagree. 5% did not know or wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1607 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, April 30- May 7, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
