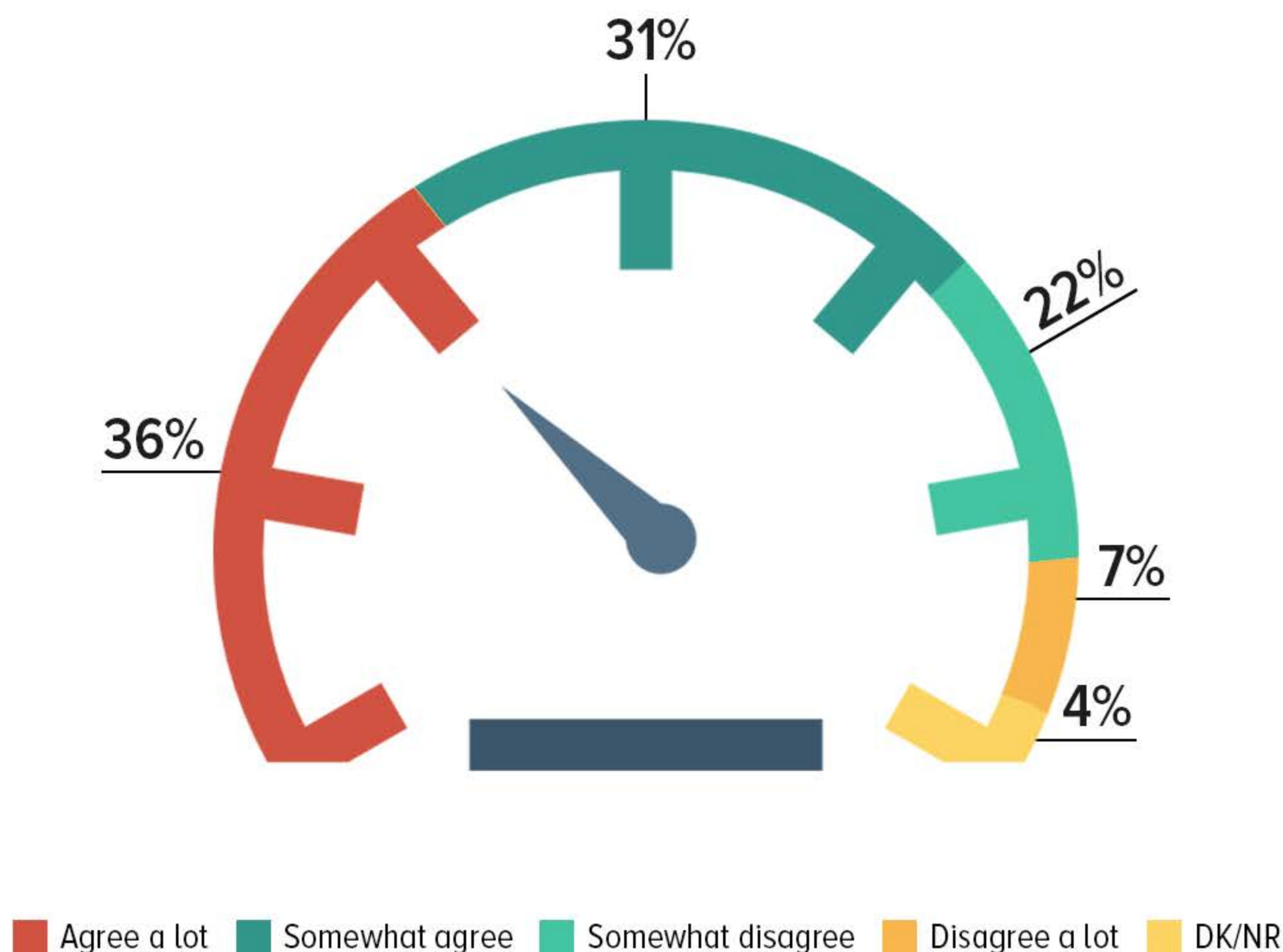

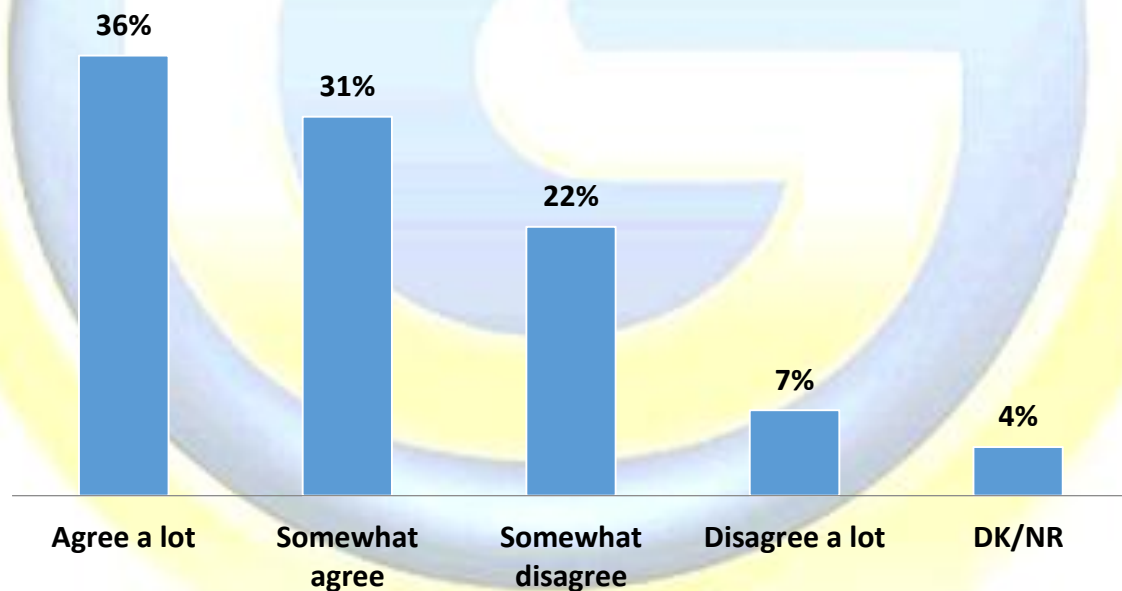
**Over two third Pakistanis (67%) think that the risk of being caught while over speeding in the country is small.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, over two third Pakistanis (67%) think that the risk of being caught while over speeding in the country is small.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: *Risk of being caught over-speeding in Pakistan is small.*” In response to this question, 36% said they agree a lot, 31% said somewhat agree, 22% said somewhat disagree and 7% said they disagree a lot. 4% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1543 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, June 04 – June 11, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
