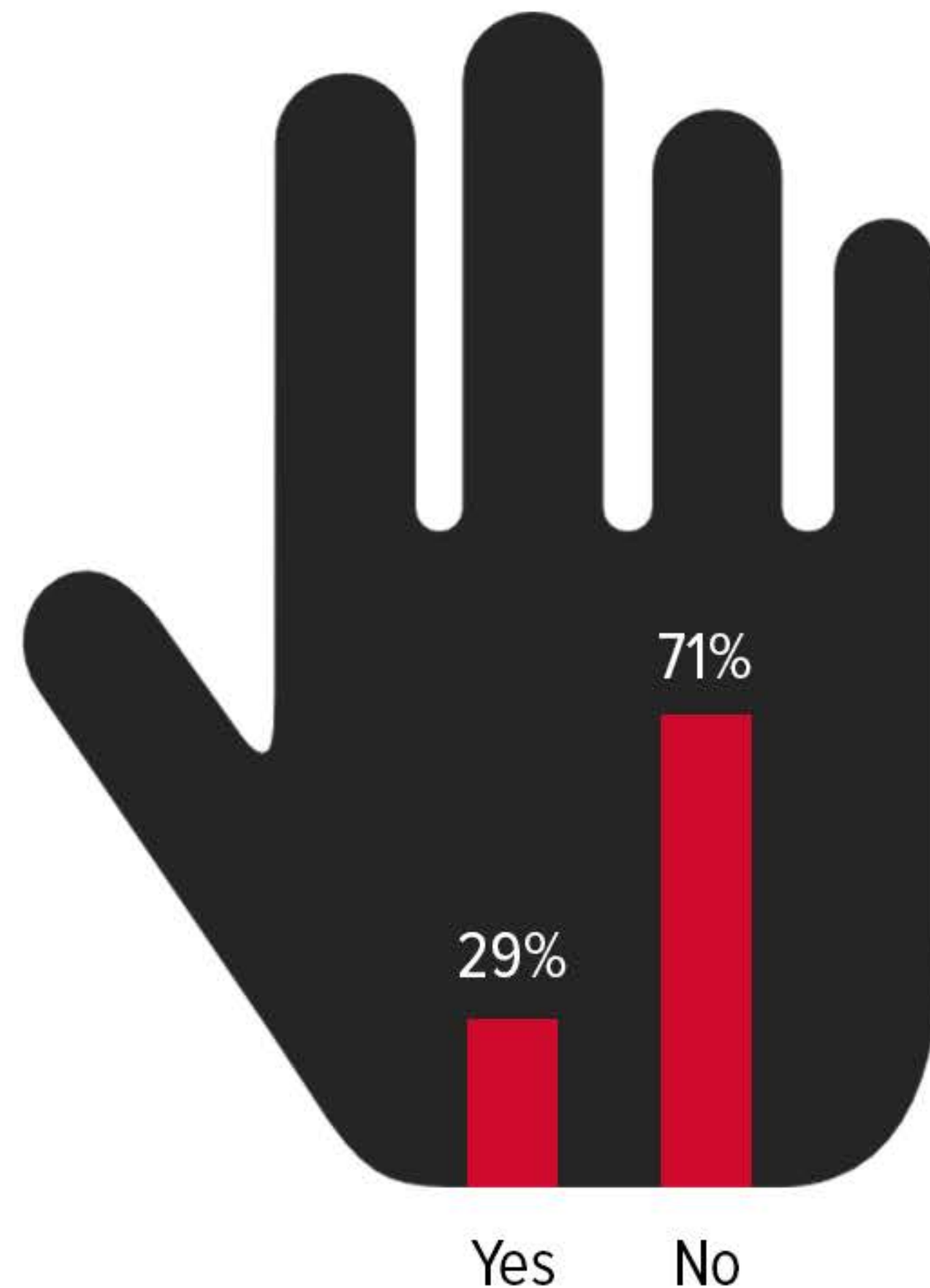

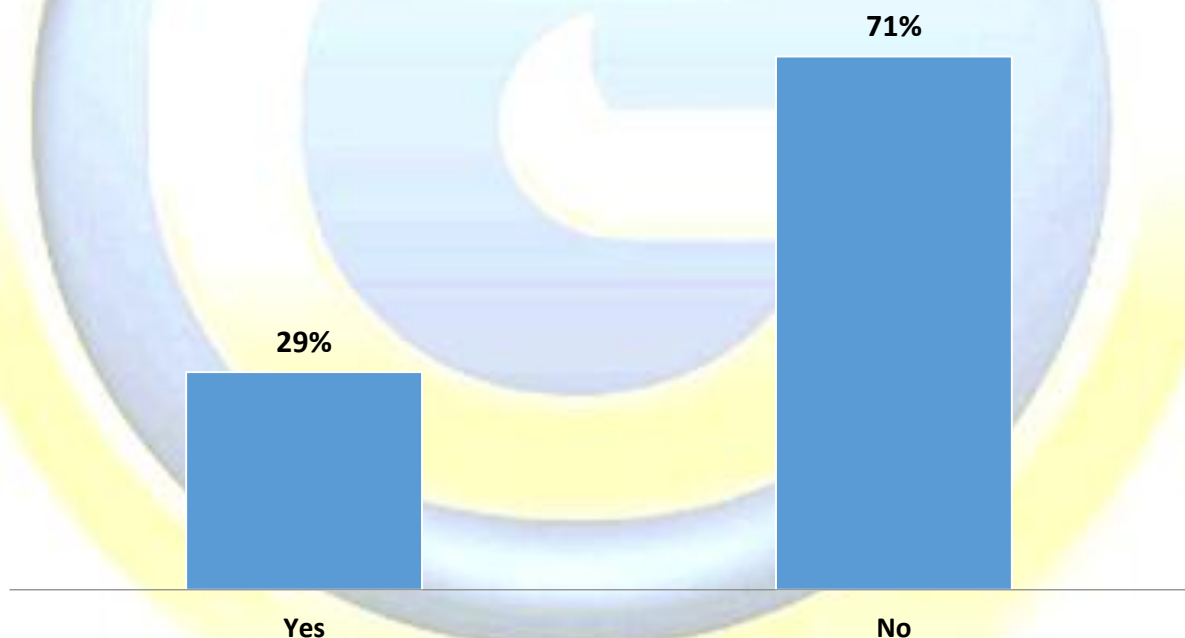
**Nearly 1 in 3 (29%) Pakistanis claim to have shown their hand to a palmist.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 1 in 3 (29%) Pakistanis claim to have shown their hand to a palmist.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Have you ever shown your palm to an astrologer, or even to a non-professional palm reader, such as a family member or friend?” To this only 29% said that they had while 71% said that they had never shown their palm to a professional or a non-professional palm reader.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1738 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, June 25 – July 02, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
