Employment: 10% more urban Pakistani women than men believe that a woman should be allowed to work outside the home.

According to the findings of the World Justice Project Report on *The Rule of Law in Pakistan* based on a Gallup Survey in urban Pakistan, respondents were questioned regarding their views on women's role in the society. 59% of female respondents agreed that women should be able to work outside of the home, whereas only 49% of men shared this view.

The findings show that nearly 3 in 5 women in urban Pakistan and 1 in 2 urban men believe that a woman should be allowed to work outside home. Women in more "traditional" parts of the country are generally known to be restricted to the inner boundaries of the household and expected to fulfill their gender specific role of raising the family and managing the household affairs. However, with the rising inflation rate in the country, more and more couples are also realizing every day the impossibility of feeding the family in one person's salary.
