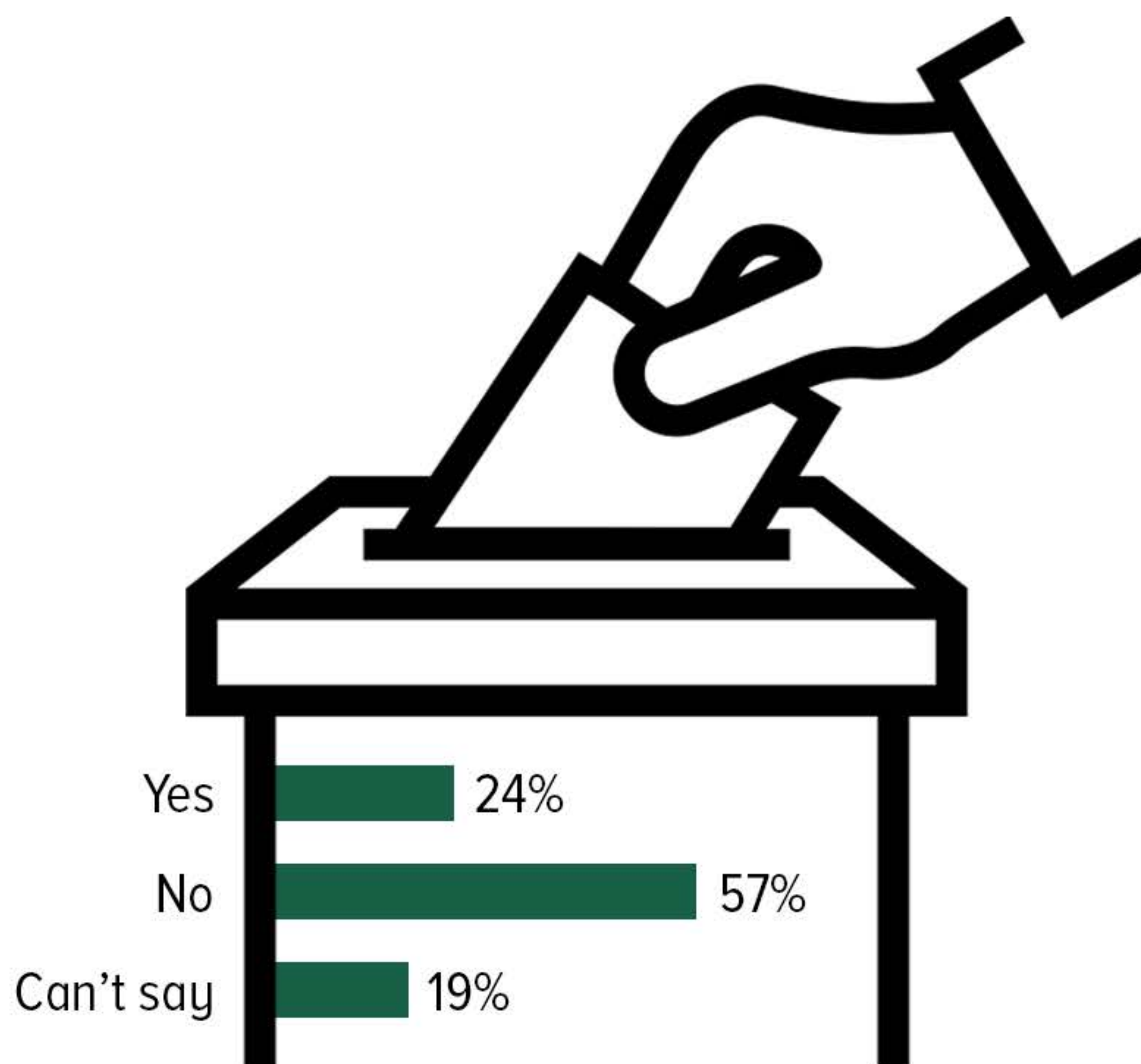

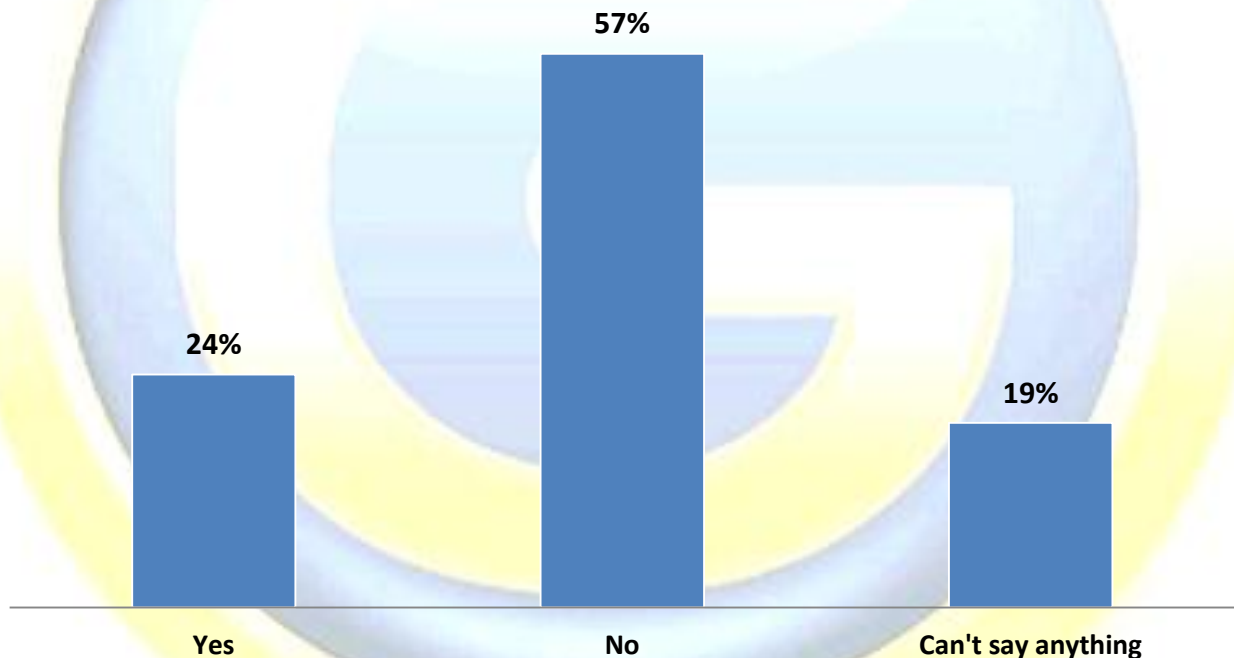
General Elections 2018 in Pakistan: A quarter Pakistanis (24%) claim to have tried to convince others regarding who to vote for. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, September 10, 2018

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, a quarter Pakistanis (24%) claim to have tried to convince others regarding whom to vote for.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Have you convinced someone to vote for a specific person or party?” To this 24% responded that yes they have convinced someone to vote for a specific person or party while a majority of 57% said that they did not convince anyone. 19% responded by saying they could not say anything.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1546 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, July 02– July 09, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
