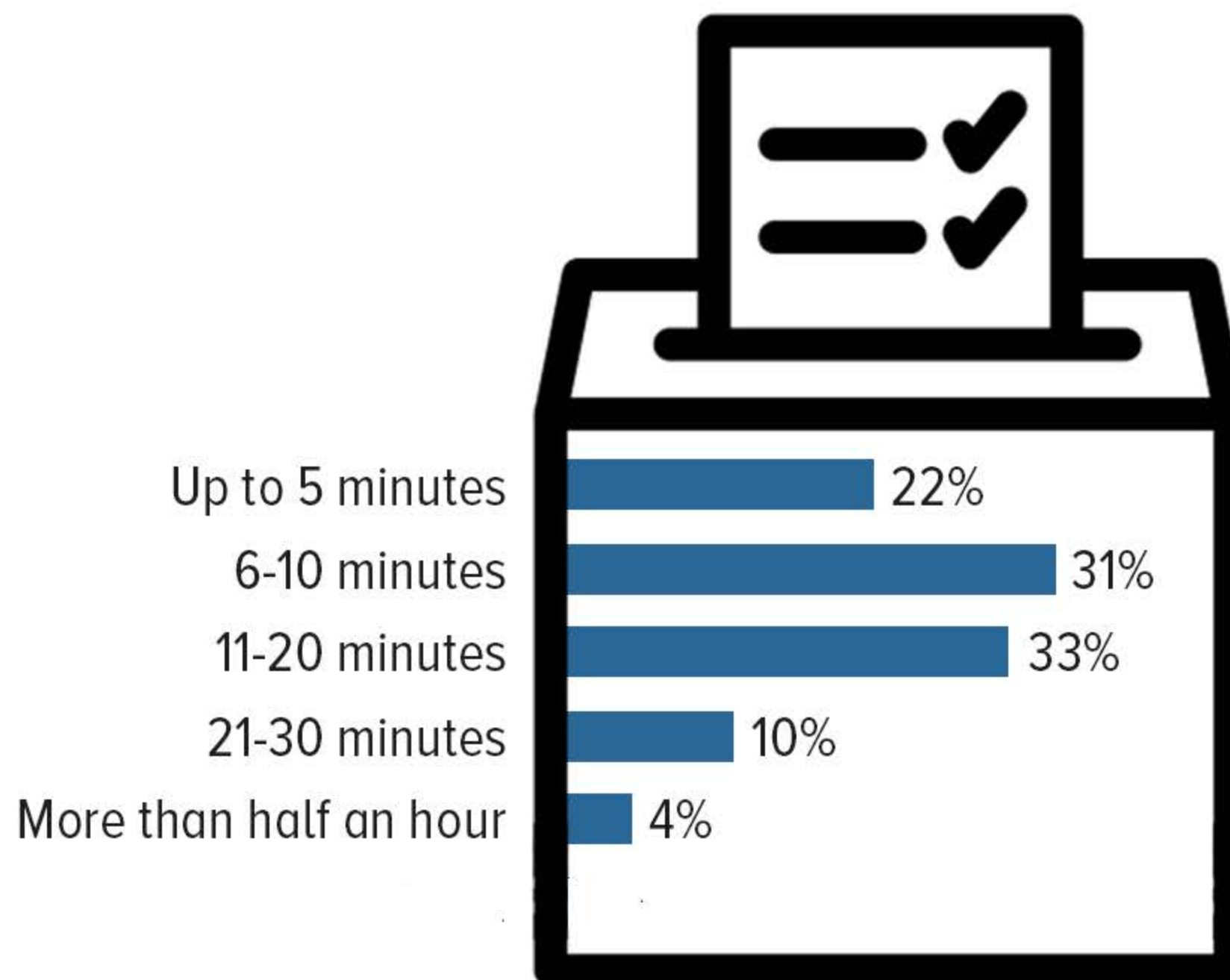

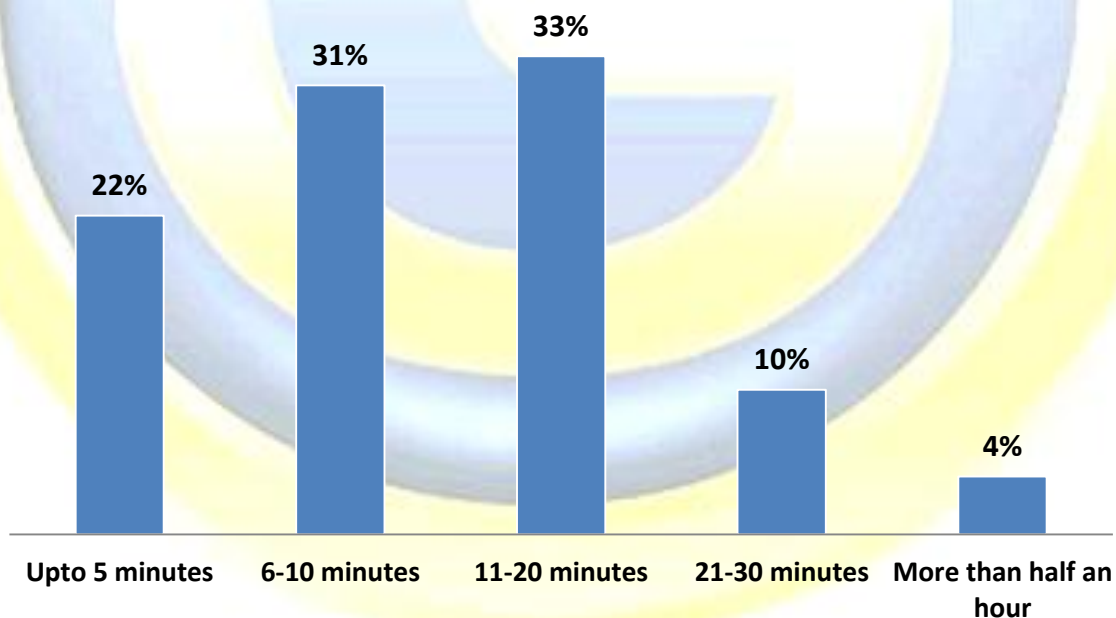

According to a Gilani Research Foundation study on “Experience of Voters during General Elections 2018” carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 33% of the Pakistanis who affirmed that they have voted in the 2018 general elections said that it took them approximately 11-20 minutes from their homes to reach their respective polling stations.

This press release is 1st of a six part series of press releases from Gallup’s post-election study.

A nationally representative sample of men and women who claimed they had voted in the 2018 general elections, from across the four provinces was asked “please tell approximately how long it took you to reach the polling station from your house?” In response to this question, 33% said it took them 11-20 minutes to reach there, 31% said that it took them 6-10 minutes, 22% said it took them up to 5 minutes, 10% claimed it took them 21-30 minutes while 4% of Pakistanis said it took them more than half an hour to reach their polling station.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1192 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, August 06 – August 13, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
