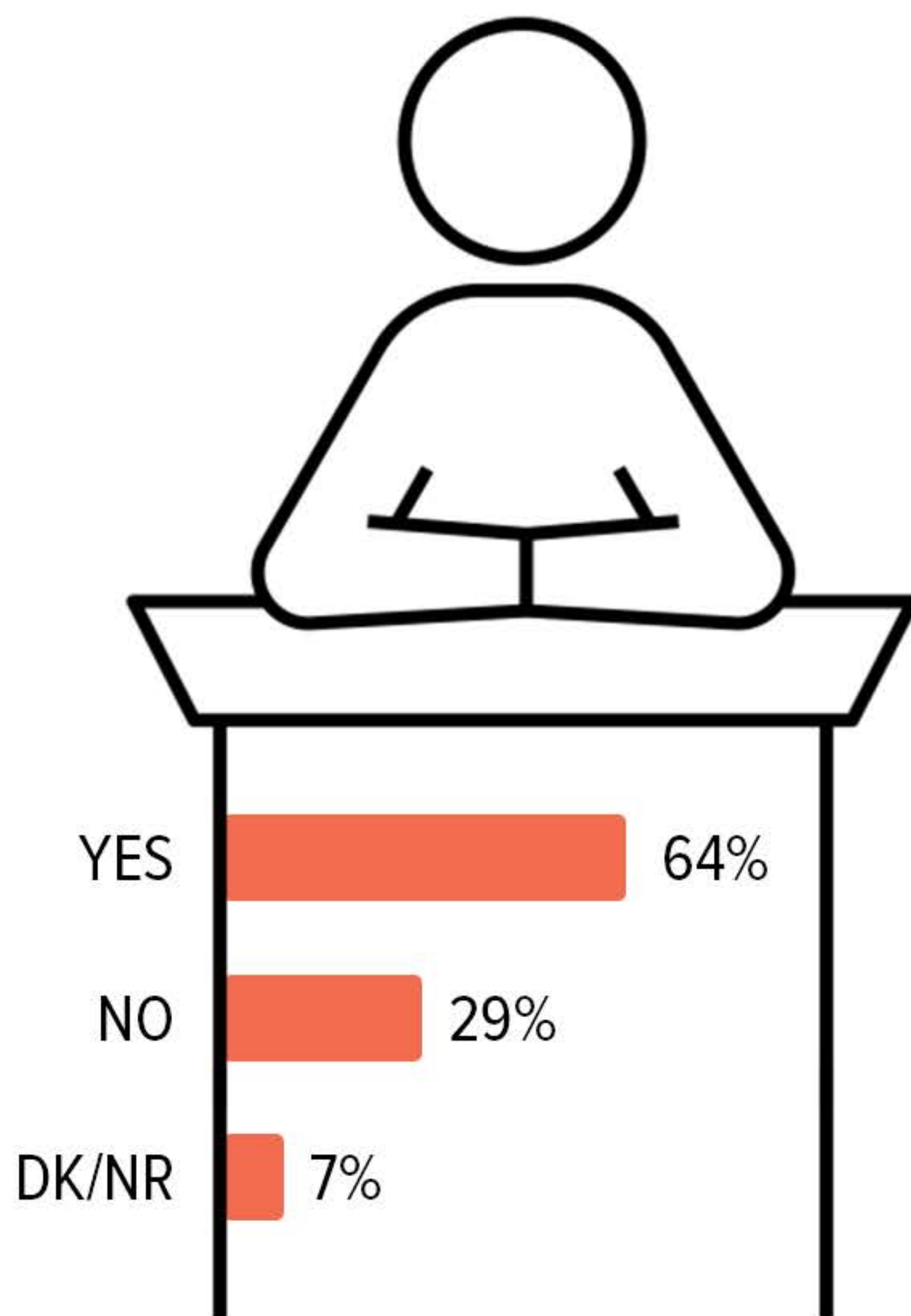

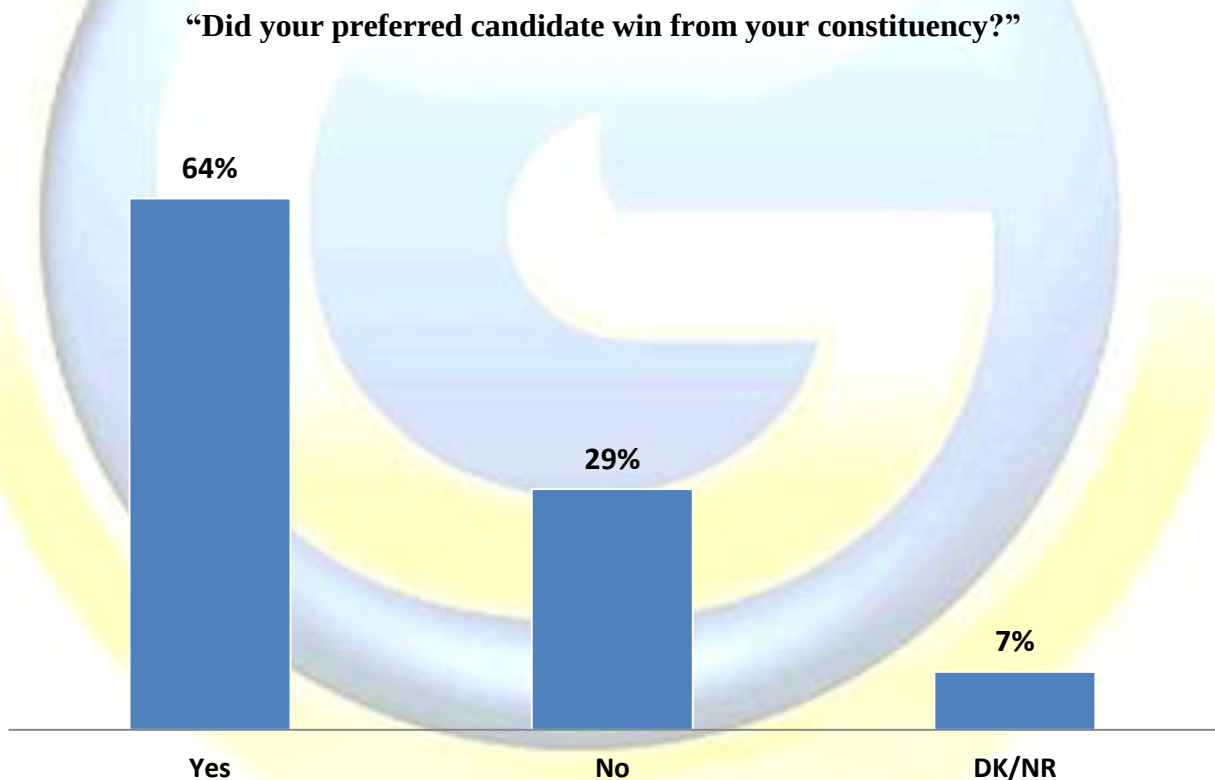

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, more than 6 in 10 (64%) Pakistanis claim that their preferred candidate won from their constituency.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Did your preferred candidate win from your constituency?” In response to this question, 64% said yes, 29% said no while 7% did not know or did not respond to the question.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1507 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, July 30 – August 06, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
