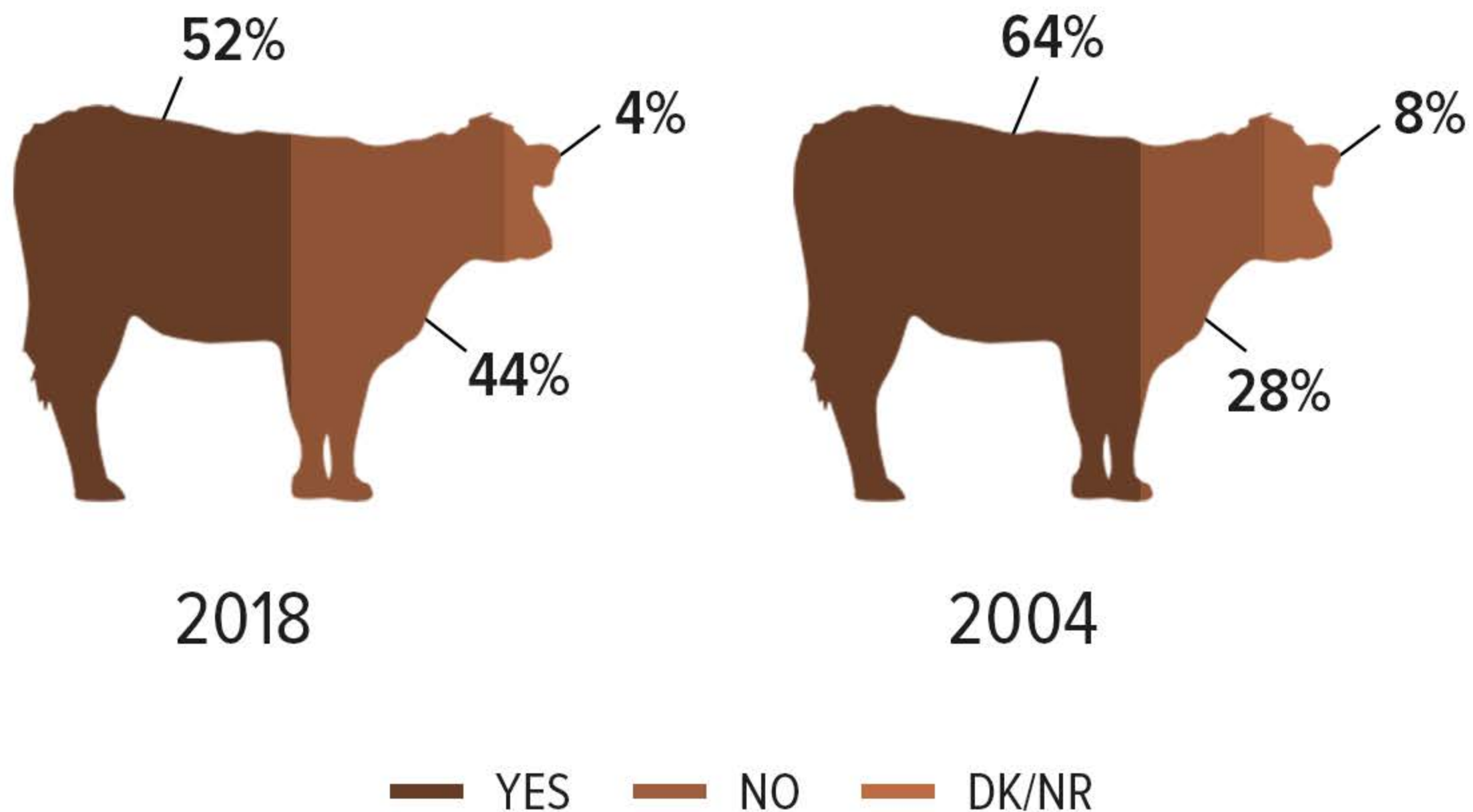

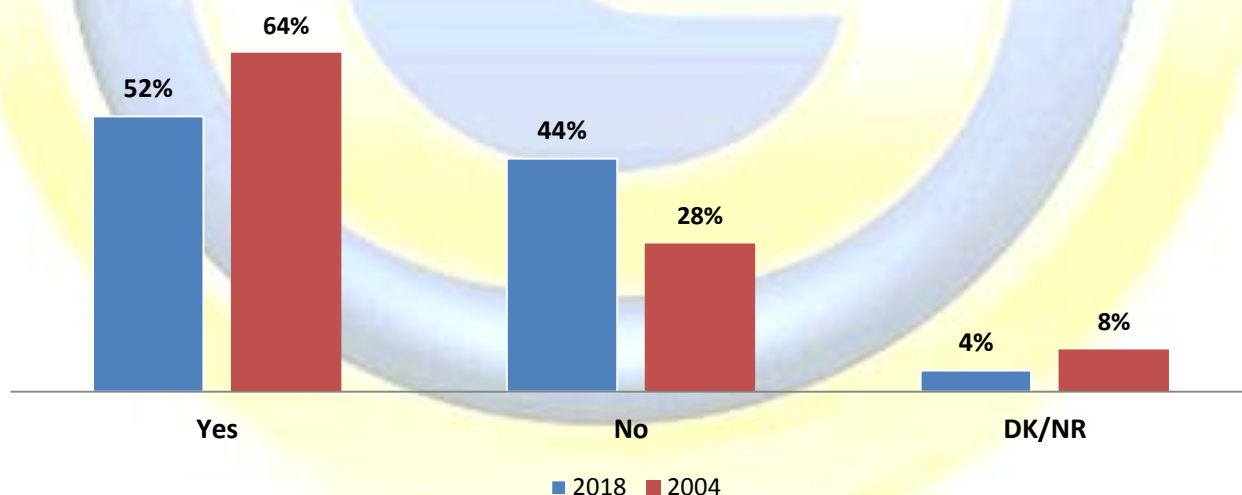
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, fulfilling the sacrificial obligation abating over the last 14 years, 12% decline in the proportion of Pakistanis who claim they sacrificed an animal on Eid-ul-Adha, 16% rise in proportion of Pakistanis who claim that they did not sacrifice anything.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Please tell did you or any of your family members sacrifice an animal on this Eid al-Adha?” In response to this question, 52% said yes, 44% no while 4% did not know or respond to the question.

The question was asked previously in 2004, back then 64% Pakistanis said yes, and 28% no while 8% did not know or respond to the question.

Trend analysis: Over the last 14 years, there has been 12% decline in the proportion of Pakistanis who claim they sacrificed an animal on Eid-ul-Adha while 16% rise in proportion of Pakistanis who claim that they did not sacrifice anything.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1547 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, September 03–September 10, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
