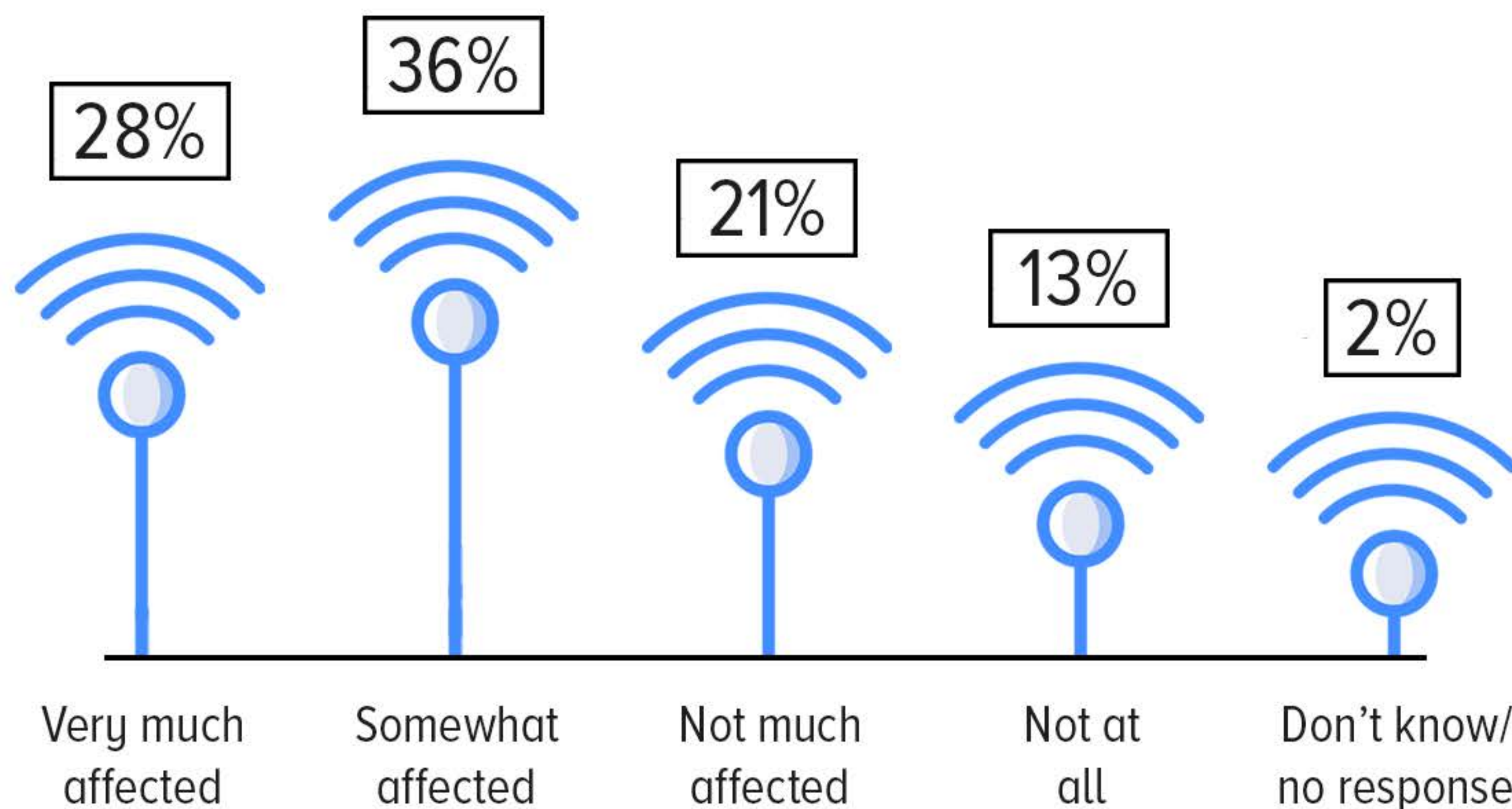

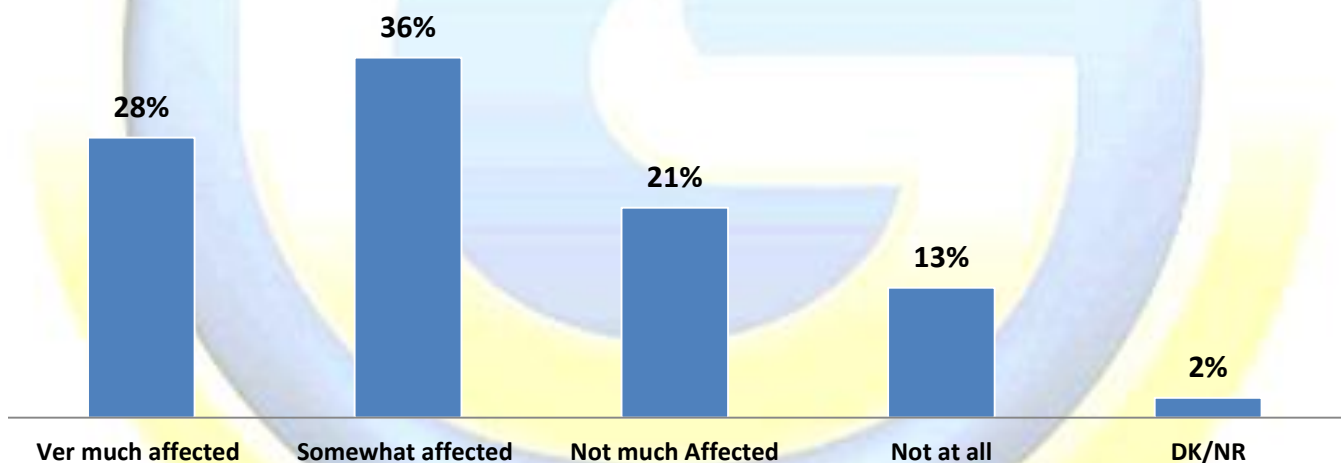

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, Dominant majority of Pakistanis (64%) claim that they were affected (very, somewhat) by mobile signals jamming during Muharram.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Recently, the government had shut down mobile signals during Muharram. How much were you personally affected by this?” In response to this question, 28% said they are very much affected, 36% said somewhat affected, 21% not much affected, 13% said not affected at all while 2% did not know or respond to the question.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1560 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, September 24 – October 01, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level
