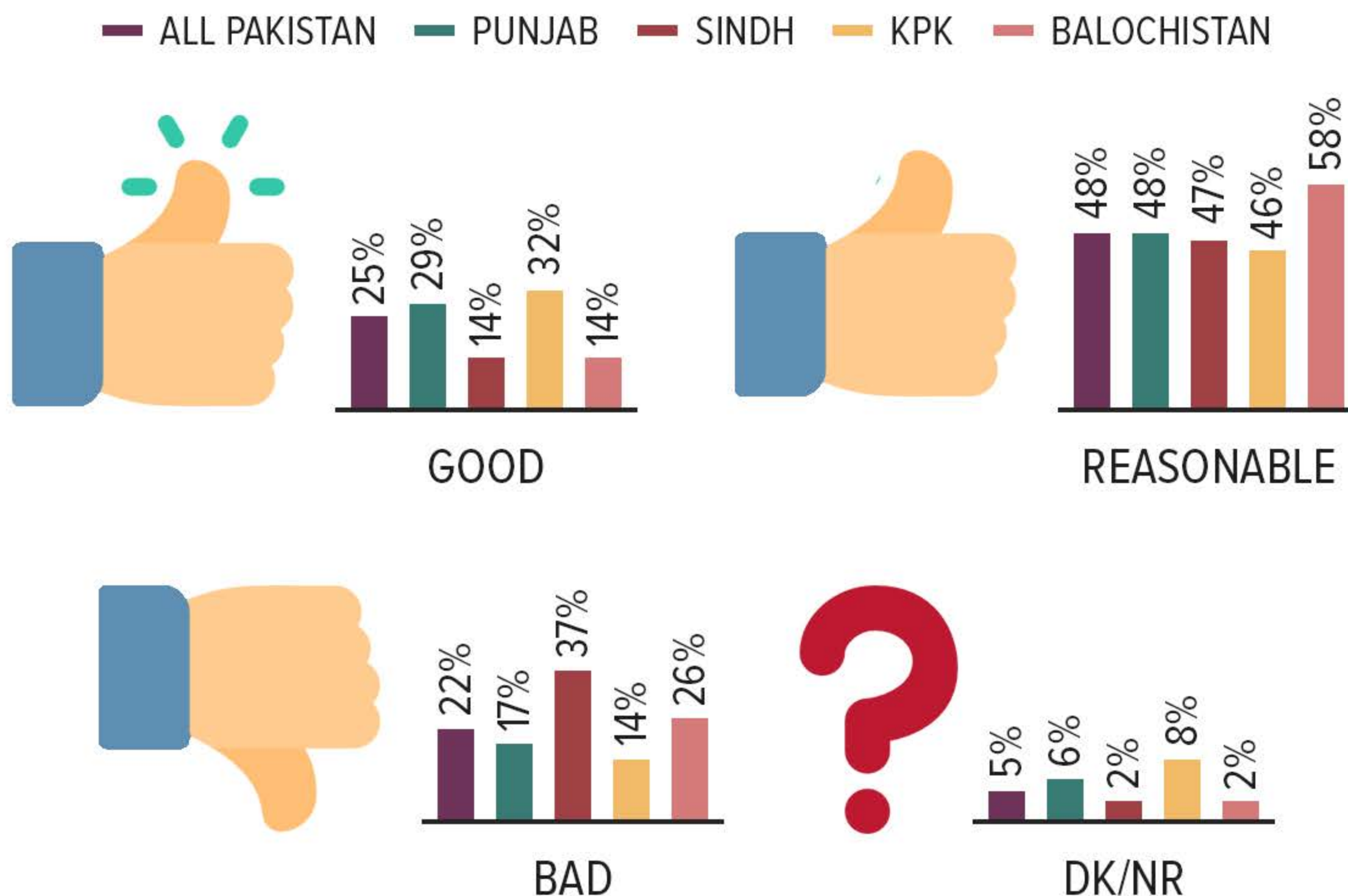

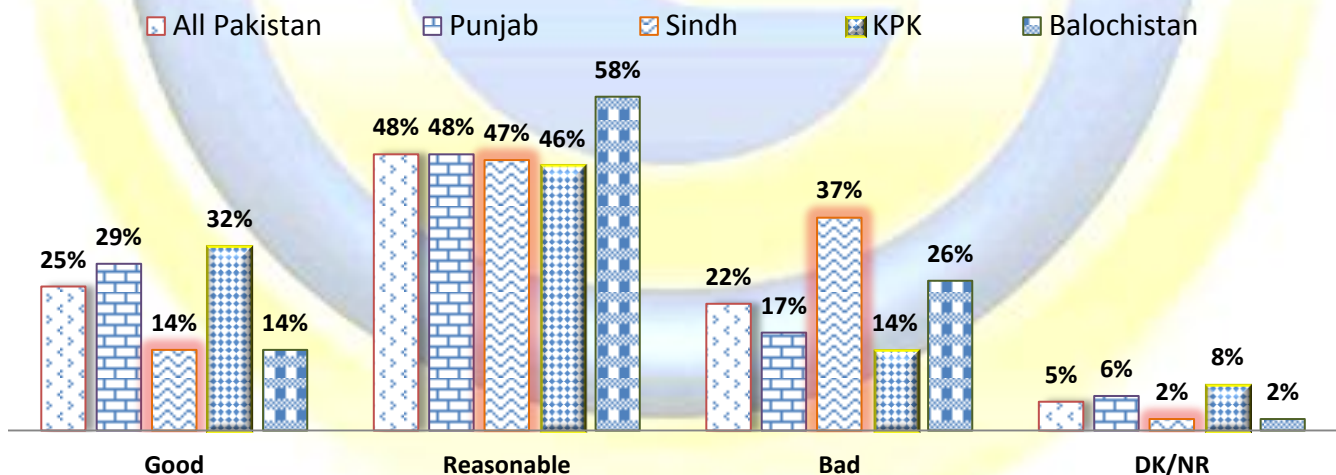

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 25% Pakistanis deem standard of health services admirable in government hospitals, 22% state that it is not up to the mark. In Punjab 29%, in Sindh 14%, in KPK 32% while in Balochistan 14% Pakistanis are satisfied with the service in public hospitals.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “What is the standard of health services in government hospitals of your area?” In response to this question, 25% said it is good, 48% said it is reasonable, 22% said it is bad while 5% did not know or respond to the question.

In provincial comparison, 29% in Punjab, 14% in Sindh, 32% in KPK and 14% Pakistanis in Balochistan rated the services in public hospitals as good. Similarly, 48% in Punjab, 47% in Sindh, 46% in KPK and 58% in Balochistan find the services reasonable while 17% in Punjab, 37% in Sindh, 14% in KPK and 26% in Balochistan consider the services as bad.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1547 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, September 03 – September 10, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
