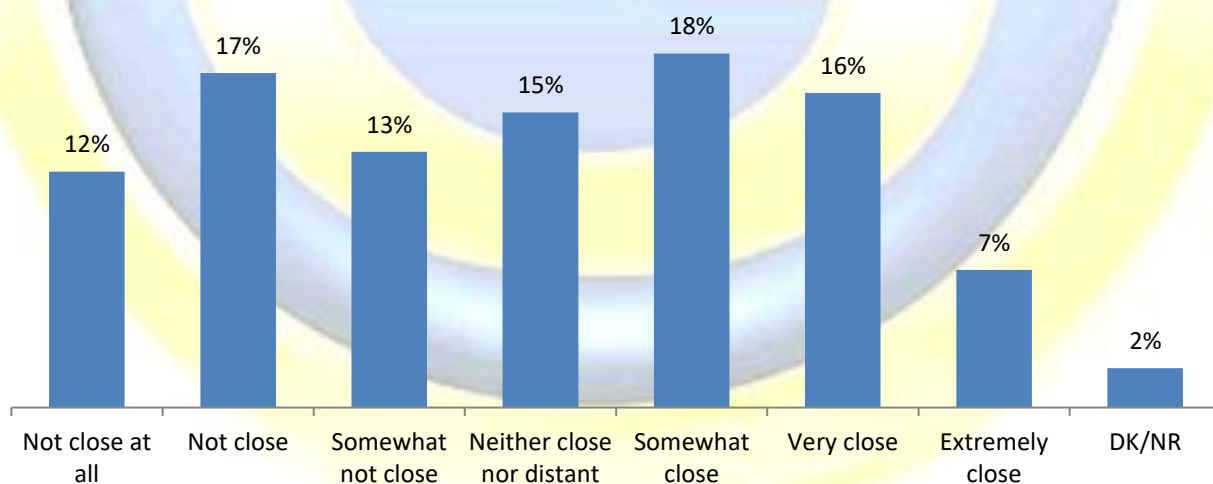

Social Behaviour Others**Closeness to neighbours: Around 41% of Pakistanis feel close to the people living in their neighbouring local community (somewhat/very/extremely close). (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)**

Islamabad, December 26, 2018

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, around 41% of Pakistanis feel close to the people living in their neighbouring local community (somewhat/very/extremely close).

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was shown a picture card displaying the overlap of two circles in varying degrees and asked, "Look at the picture card, and while thinking about people living in your neighbouring local community, i.e., people living 10 to 20 minutes away on foot from your home, such as the shopkeeper, local college teacher, doctor or government representative, please select the image that is most reflective of how close you feel to them?" In response to this question, 12% chose not close at all, 17% chose not close, 13% chose somewhat not close, 15% chose neither close nor distant, 18% said somewhat close, 16% said very close, 7% said extremely close, while 2% did not know or did not wish to respond.

Question: "Look at the picture card, and while thinking about people living in your neighbouring local community, i.e., people living 10 to 20 minutes away on foot from your home, such as the shopkeeper, local college teacher, doctor or government representative, please select the image that is most reflective of how close you feel to them?"

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1193 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during November 19 – November 26, 2018. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
