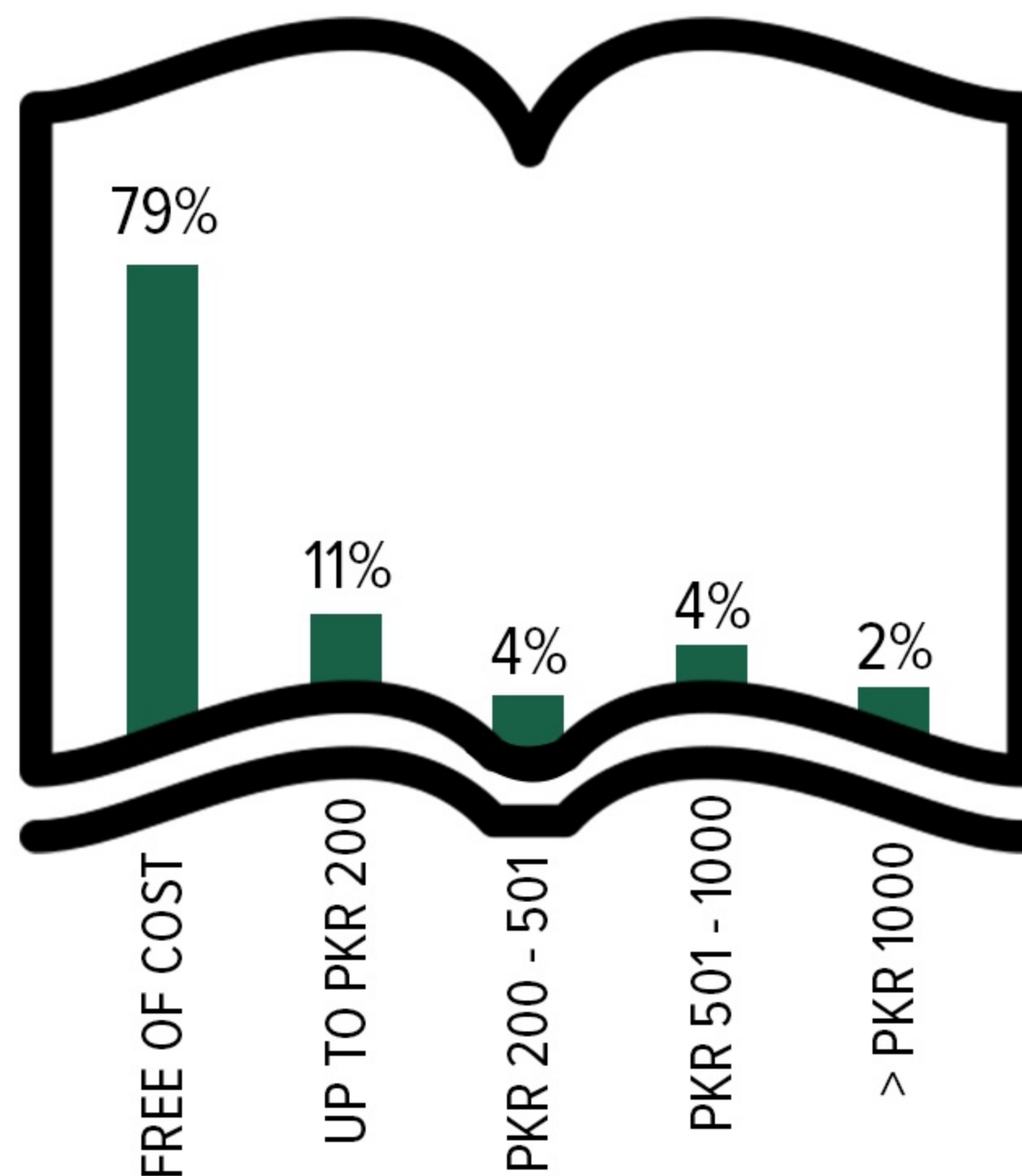

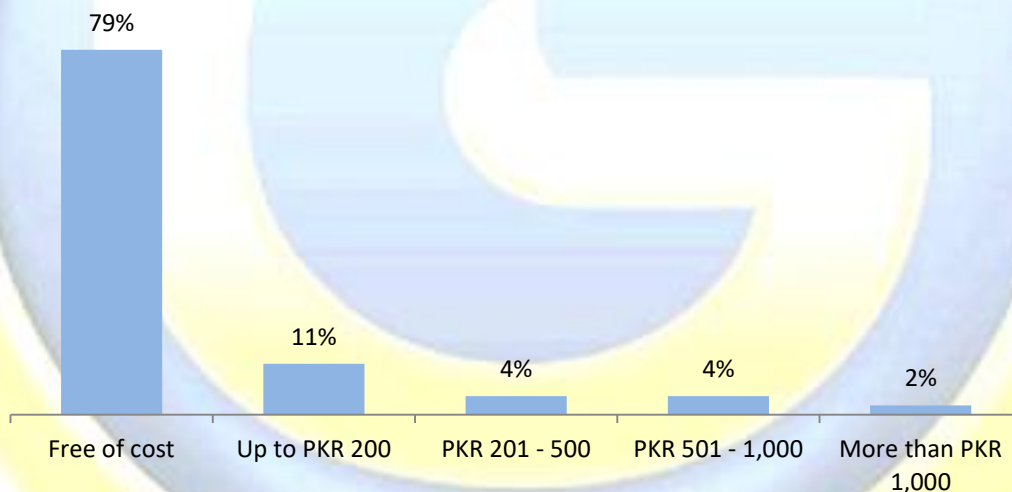

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, a significant majority (79%) of Pakistanis with children in their households learning the Quran report that they are learning it free of cost.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces with children in their households learning to read the Quran was asked, "Please tell us how much you pay in fees to teach your child to read the Holy Quran?" In response to this question, 79% said that their children learn it free of cost, 11% said up to PKR 200, 4% said between PKR 200 and 500, another 4% said between PKR 500 and 1000, while only 2% reported paying more than PKR 1,000.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 496 men and women in urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during 22 December – 29 December, 2018. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
