

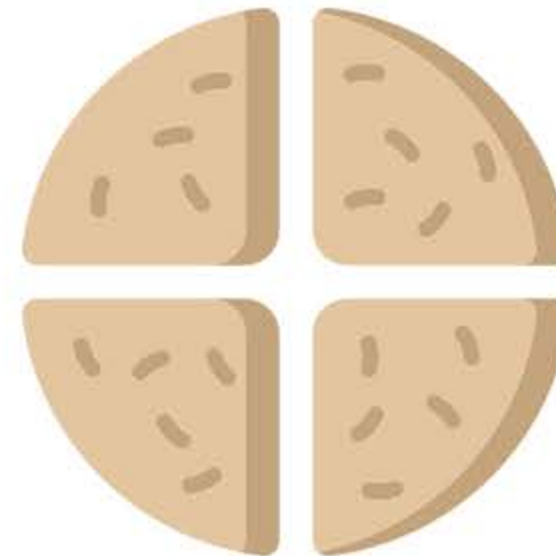

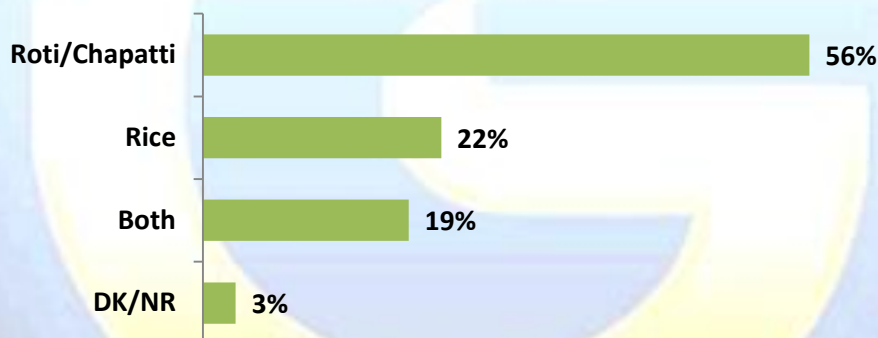
Average Pakistani Dinner Menu: Nearly 6 in 10 Pakistanis report that they normally eat roti at dinner time exclusively.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 6 in 10 Pakistanis report that they normally eat roti at dinner time exclusively.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “What is eaten in your household for lunch as a matter of routine?” In response to this question, 56% said roti, 22% said rice, 19% said both roti and rice, while 3% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1142 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during 24 January – 28 January, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
