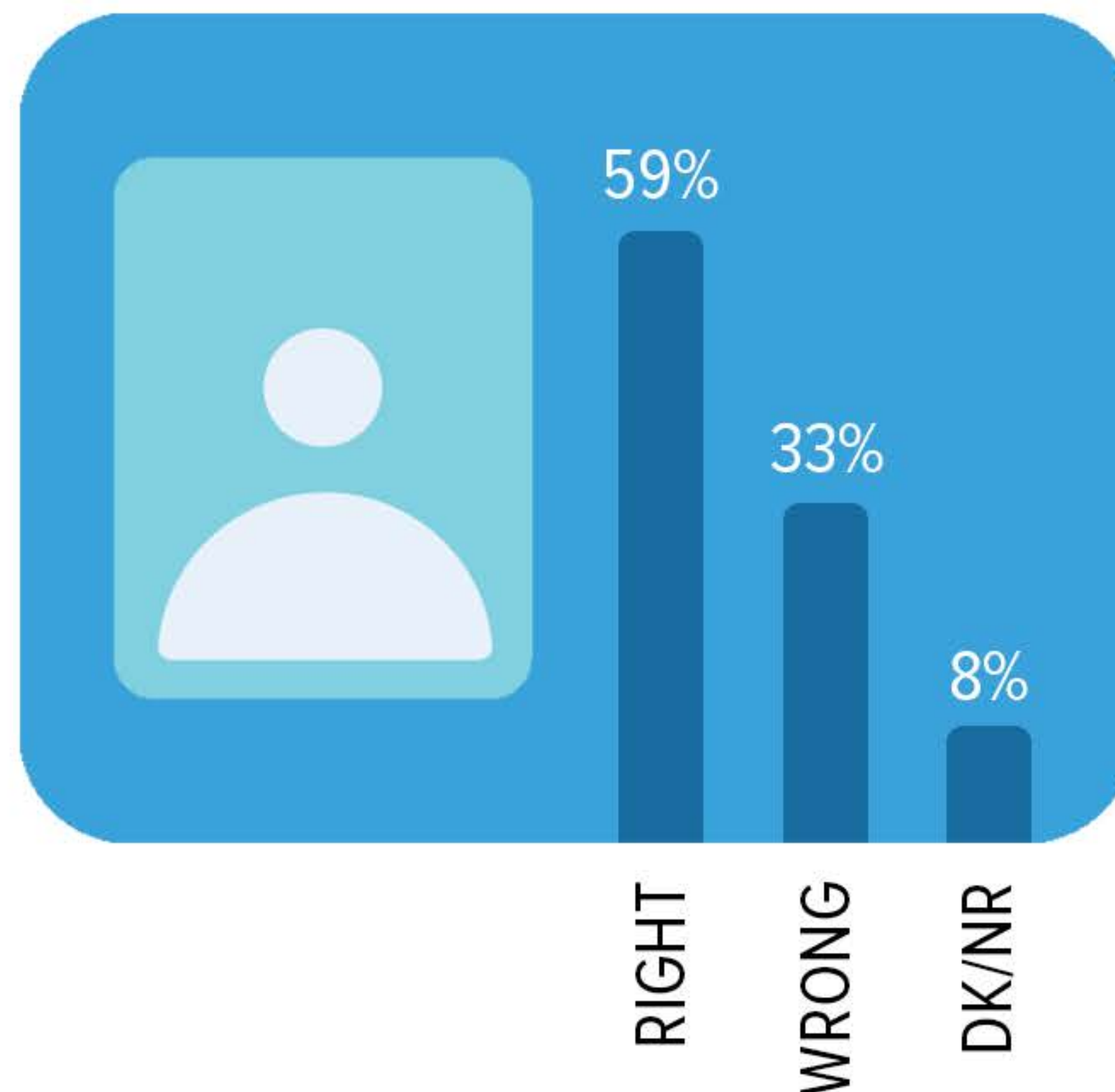

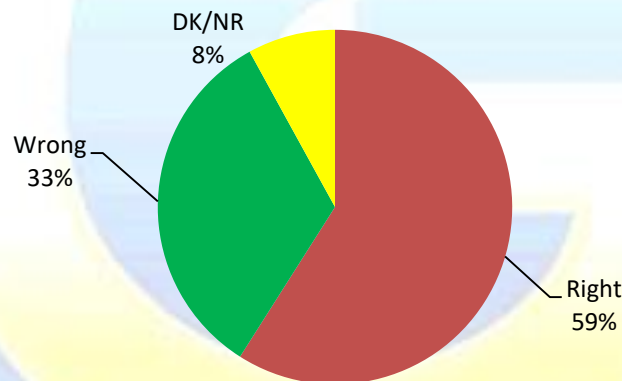

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, at 59%, the vast majority of Pakistanis believe that acquiring a permit or a license is only possible by means of bribery and connections.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Please tell us whether you consider the following statement to be right or wrong: permits and licenses can only be obtained through bribes or personal contacts?" In response to this question, 59% said it was right, 33% said it was wrong, while 8% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1142 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during 24 January – 28 January, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
