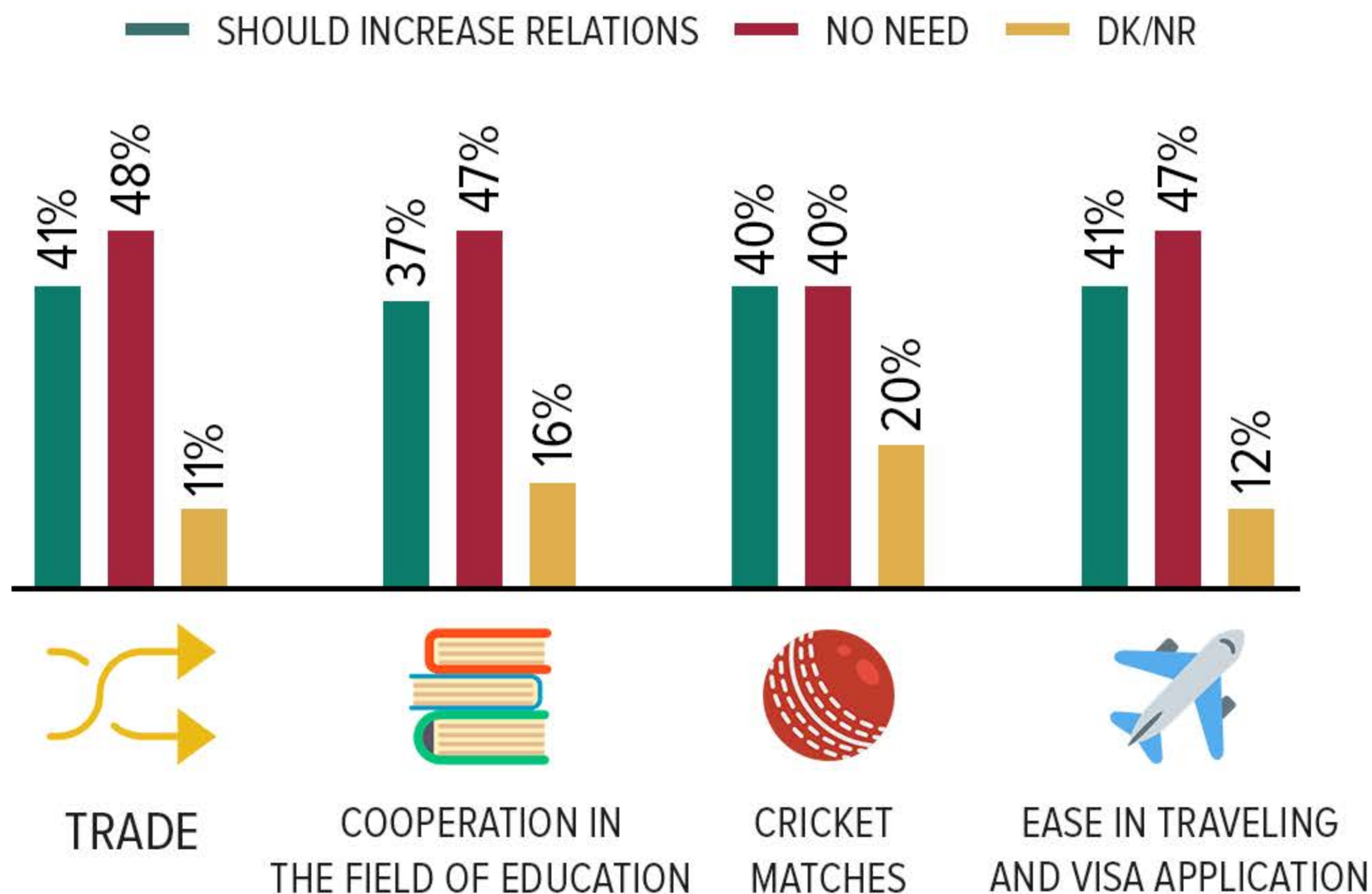

On cordial relations: Less than half Pakistanis feel the need to further improve relations with India in the fields of trade, education, sports and travel.

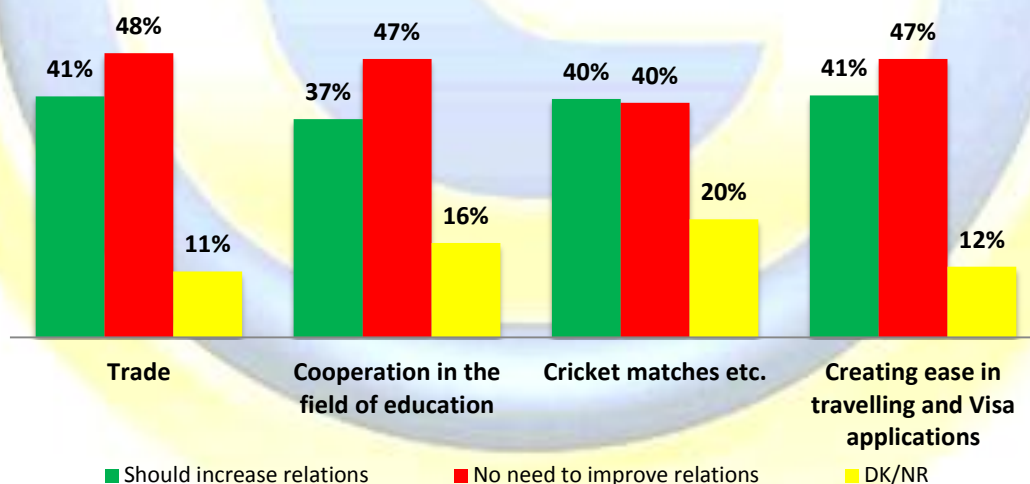

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan on the issue of India-Pakistan relations post Pulwama Attack (full report available at <http://gallup.com.pk/pakistani-opinion-remains-calm-and-unprovoked-during-threat-of-war-with-india/>), less than half Pakistanis feel the need to further improve relations with India in the fields of trade, education, sports and travel.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion after the condition has normalized, should Pakistan improve its trade relations, educational relations, and cultural relations etc. with India?” In response to this question, 41% Pakistanis believe trade relations should be improved while 48% say those should not be improved. In the field of education 37% say relations should be improved while 47% oppose further cooperation in the field. In cricket matches equal proportion (40% each) say that relation should be improved and relations should not be improved. Lastly, 41% Pakistanis say that ease should be created in travelling and visa applications while 47% oppose it.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1044 men and women in urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during 02 March – 05 March, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
