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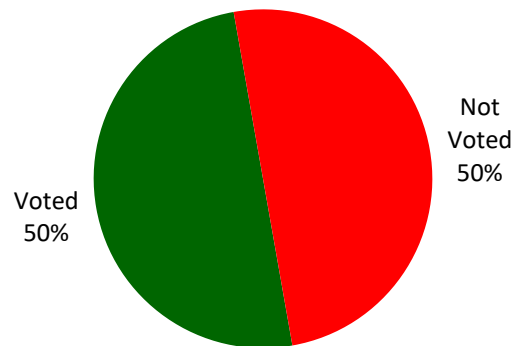

50% + ~2% (52%)

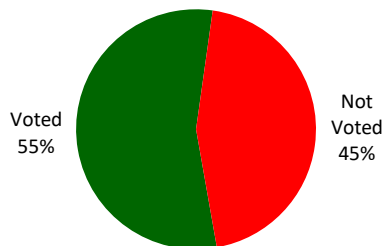

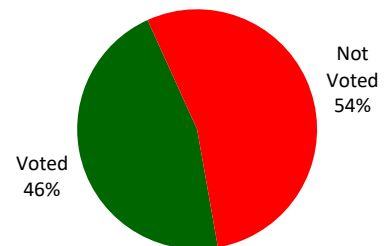

Voter Turnout

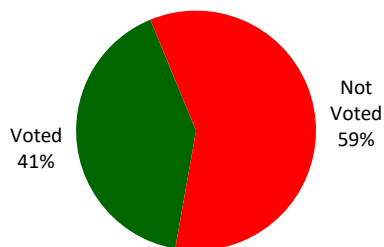
Punjab: 55%



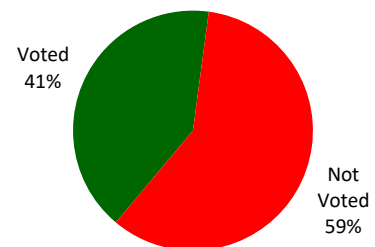
Sindh: 46%

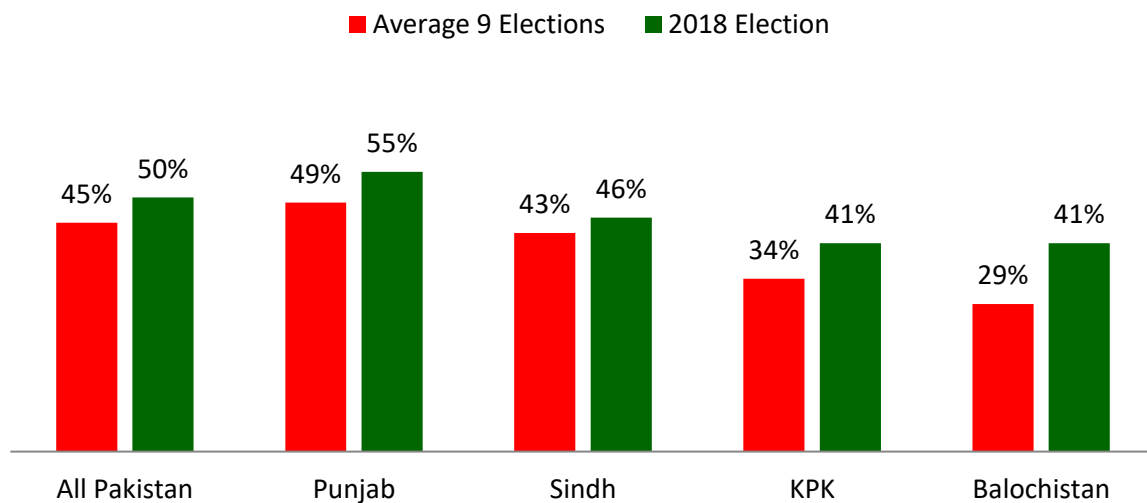

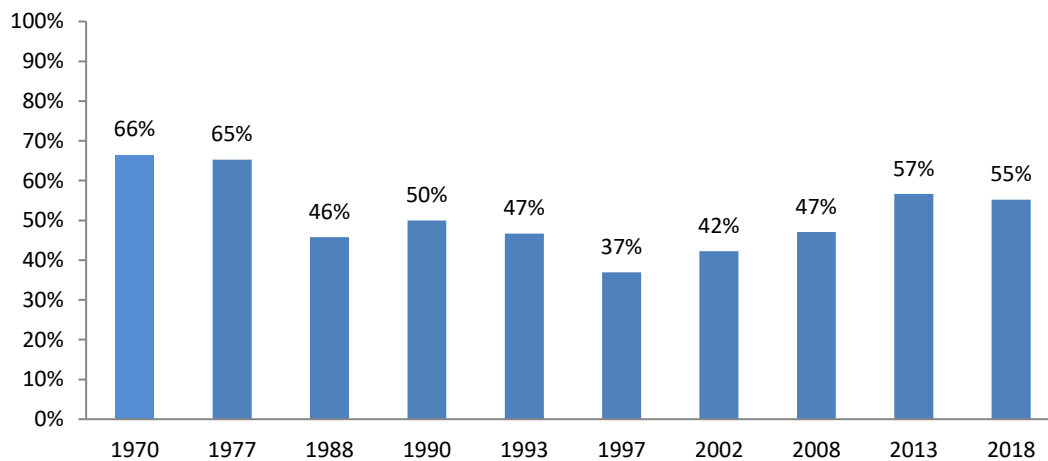

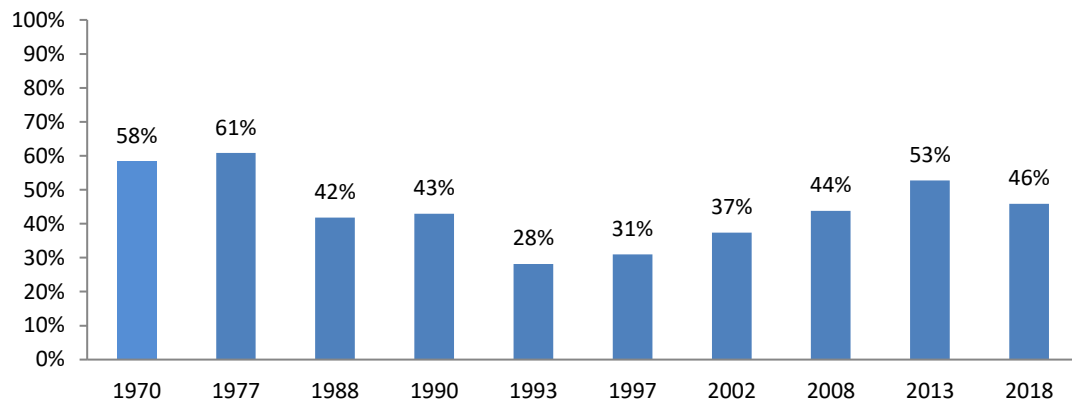

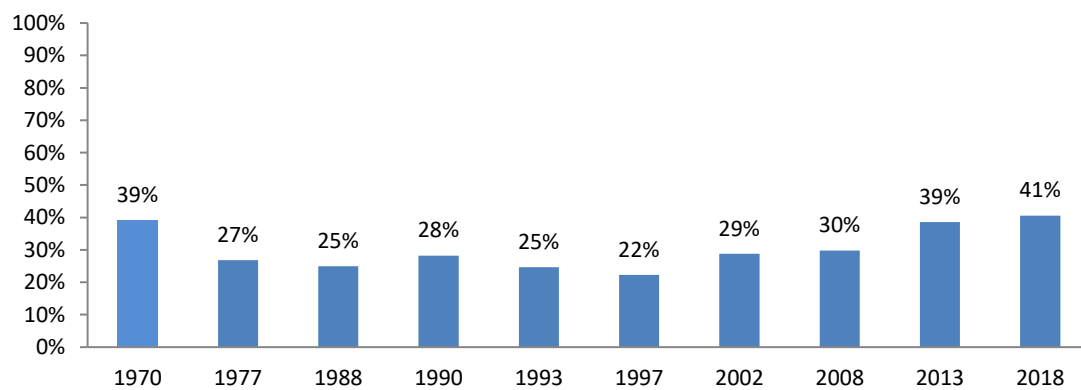

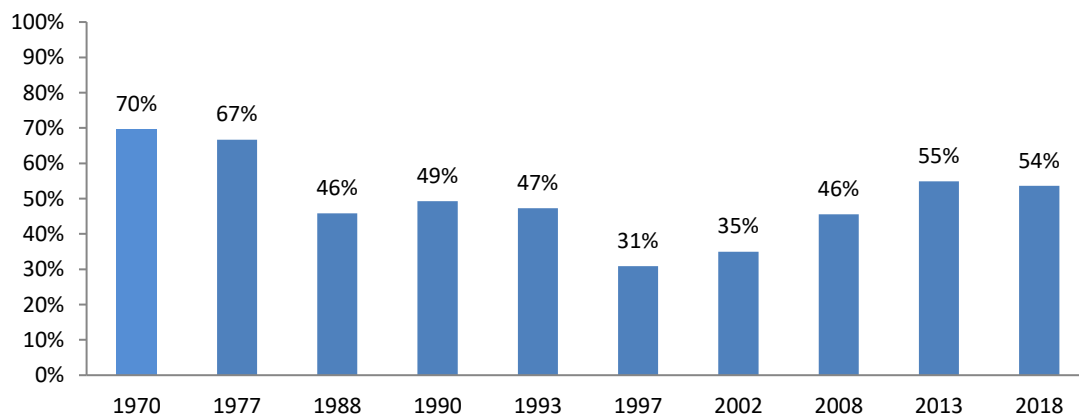

Southern Punjab



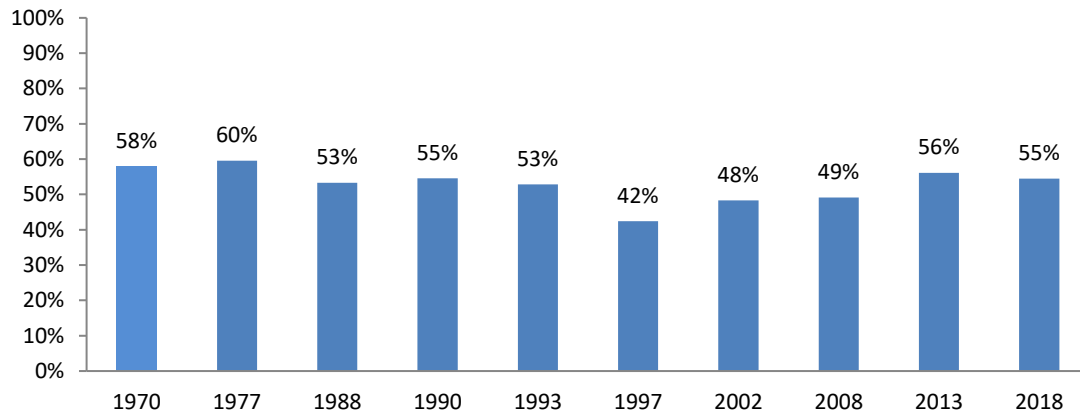

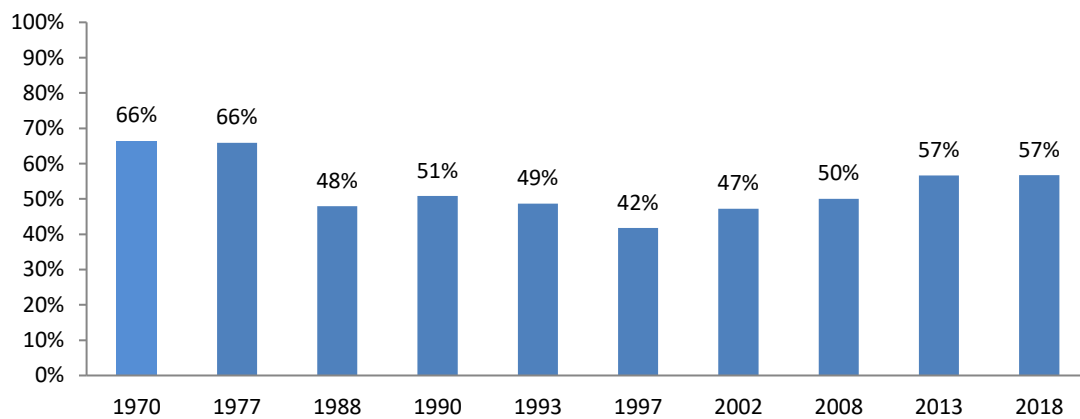

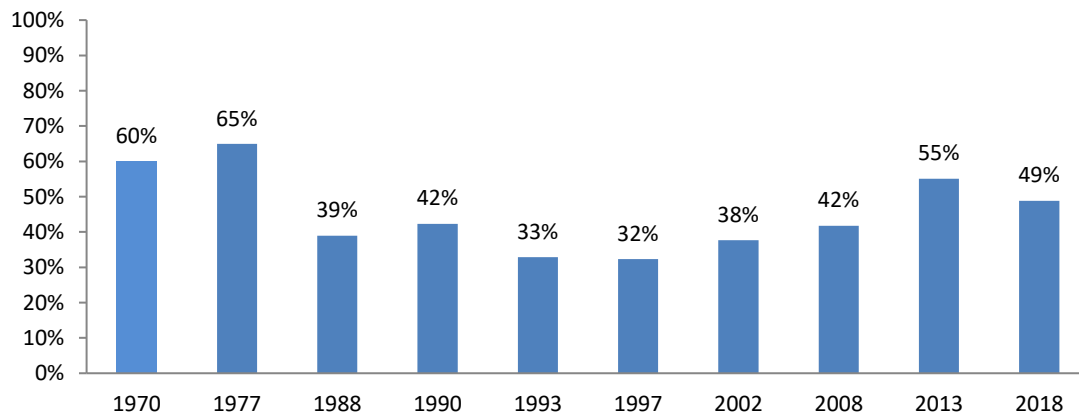

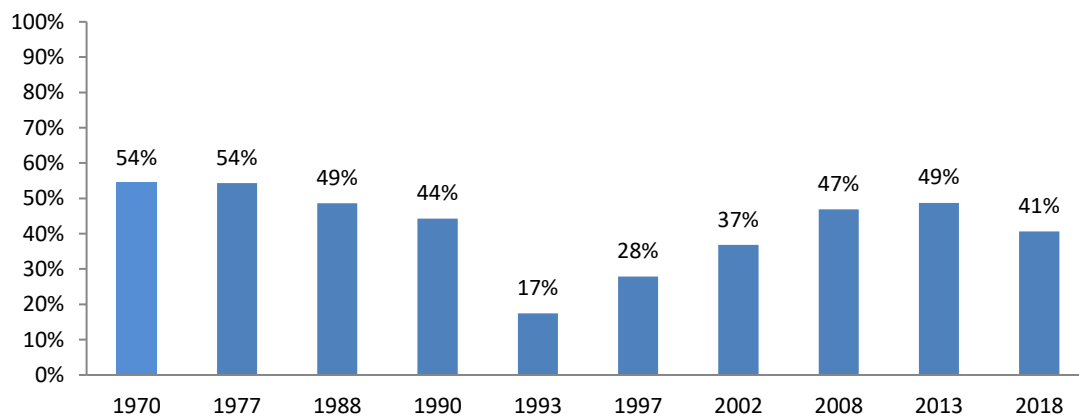

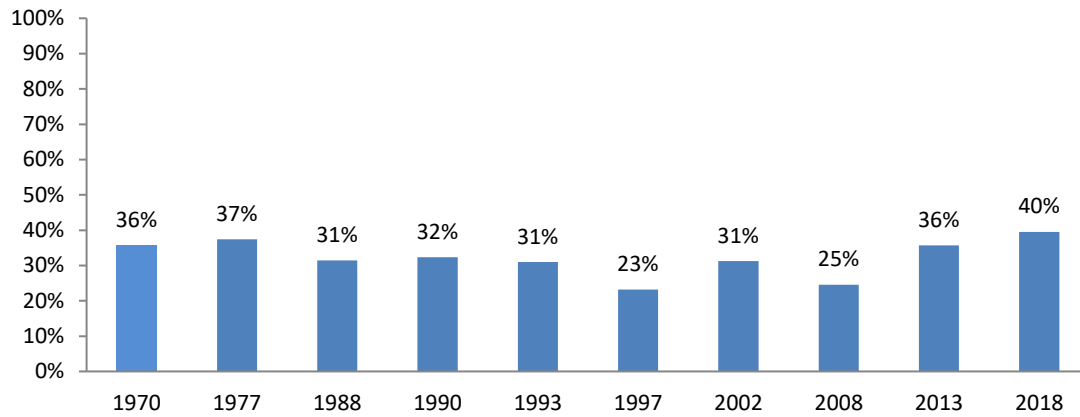

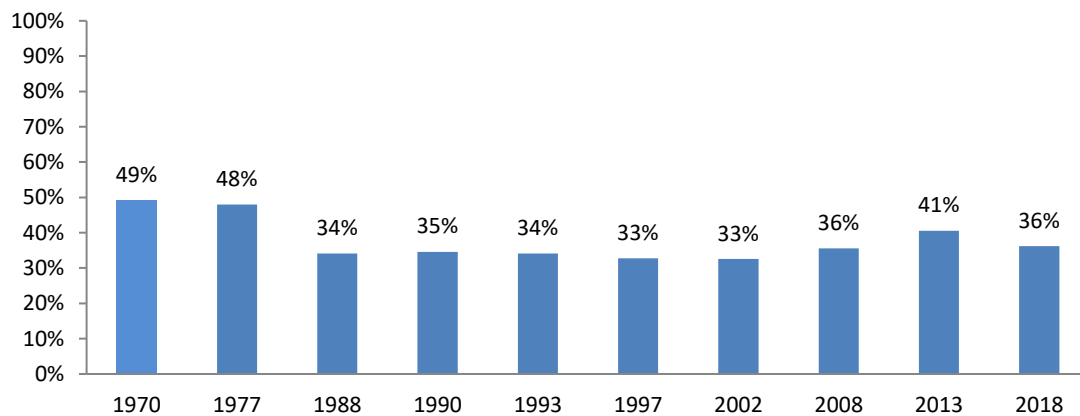

Malakand Region



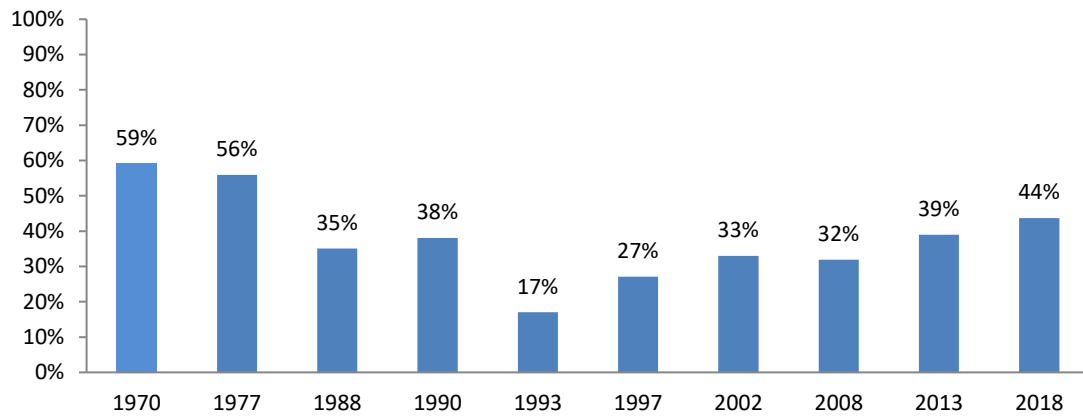

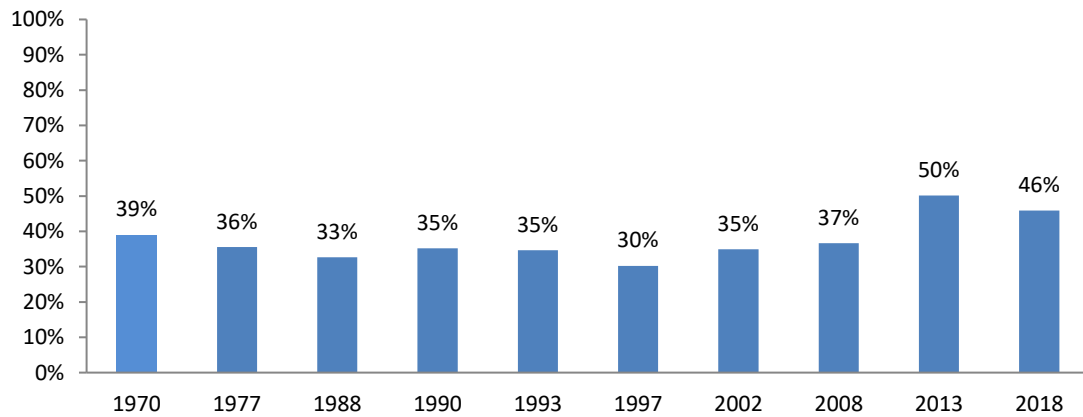

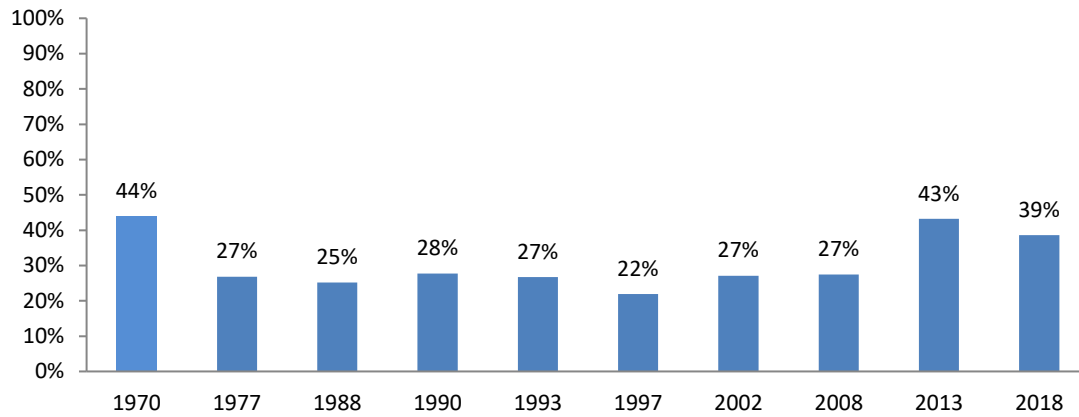

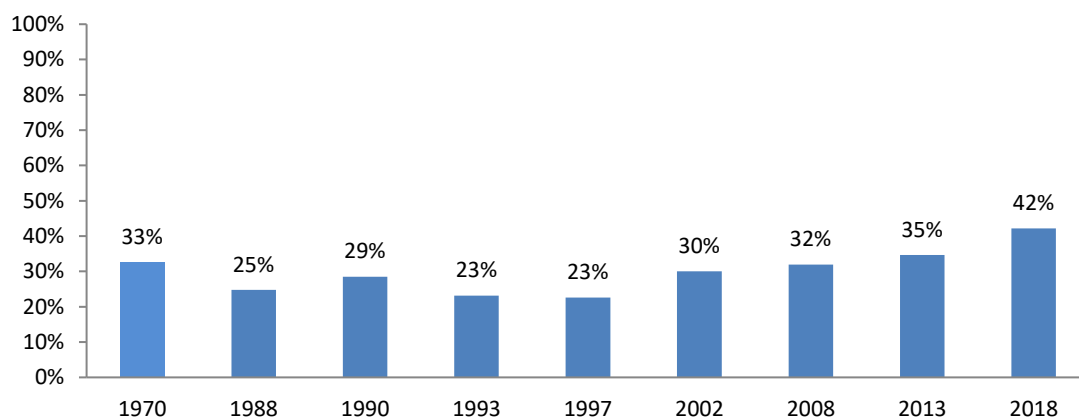
