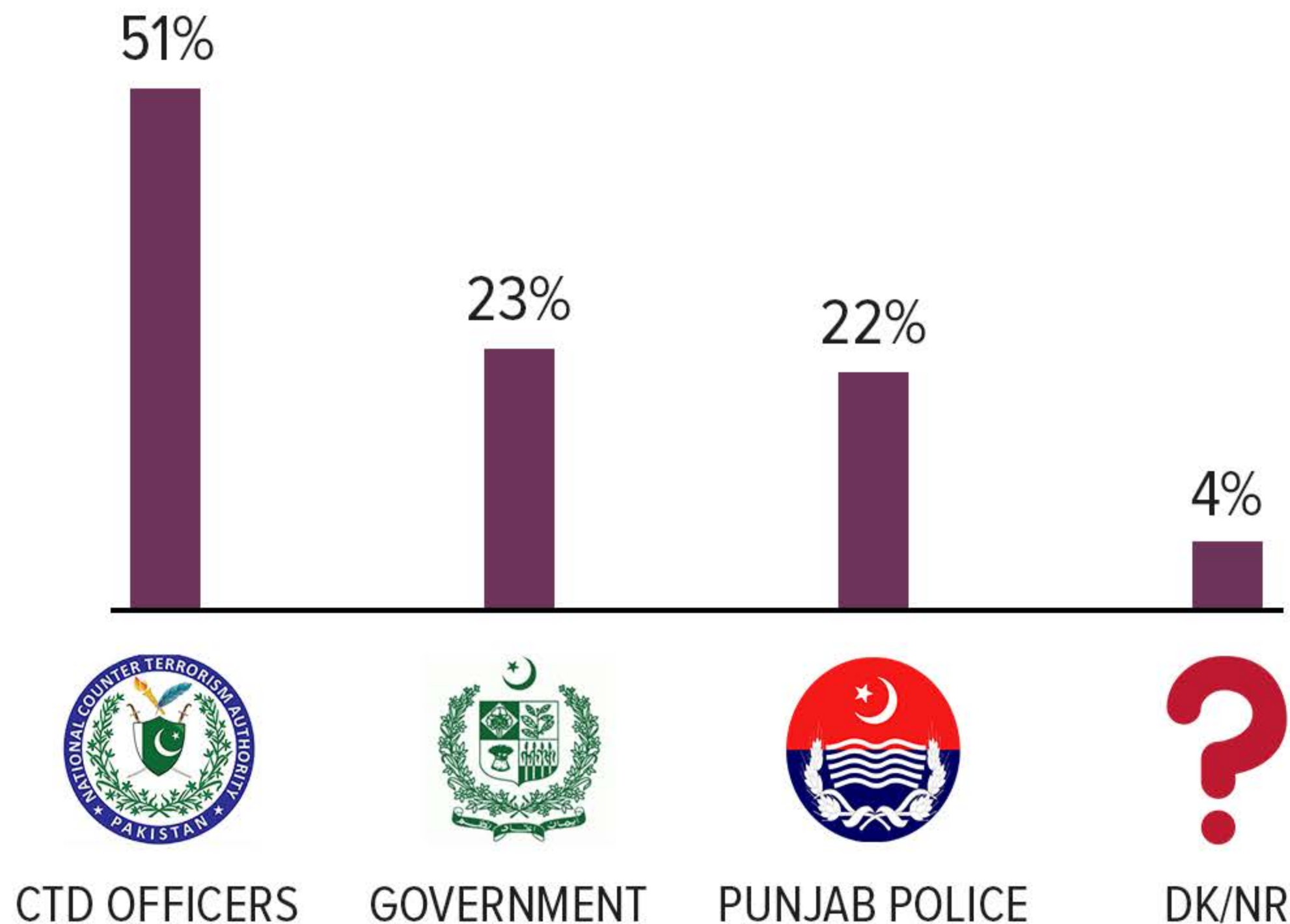

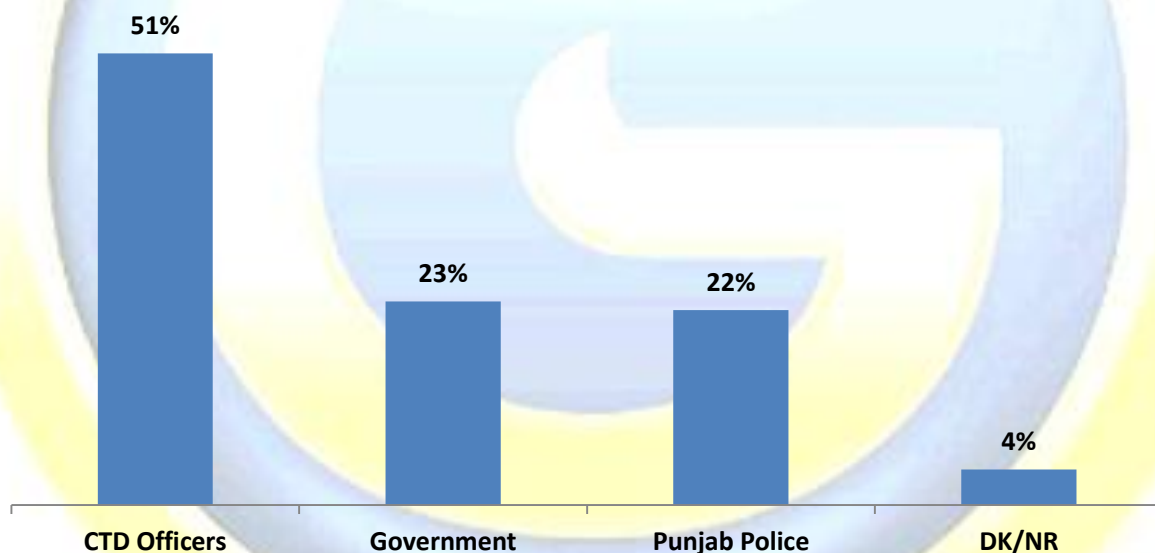

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 51% Pakistanis aware of the Sahiwal incident hold CTD officers to be responsible.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who were aware of the Sahiwal Incident was asked, "Who do you think is responsible for this incident?" In response to this question, 51% said CTD officers are to be blamed, 23% said it was the government's fault while 22% said that the Punjab Government was to be held responsible. 4% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1142 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during 24 January – 28 January, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
