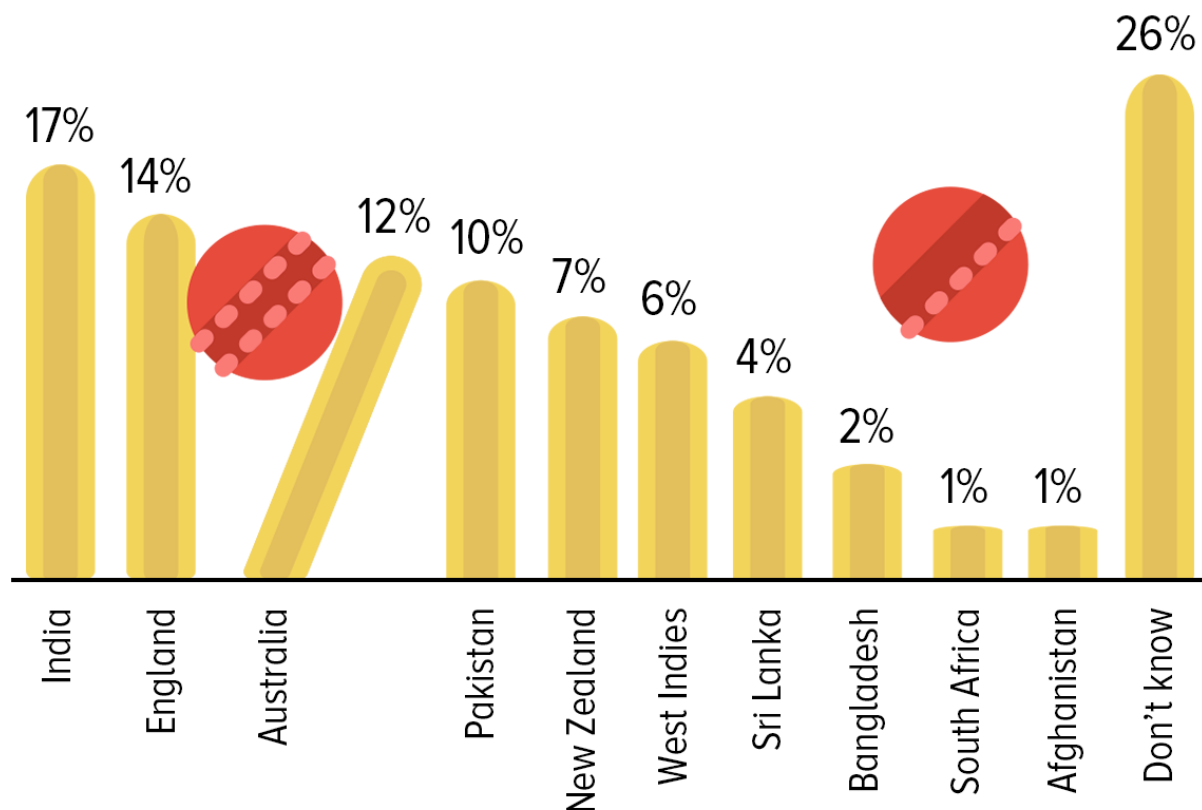

Nationally Representative Sample covering both rural and urban respondents across Pakistan's four provinces.

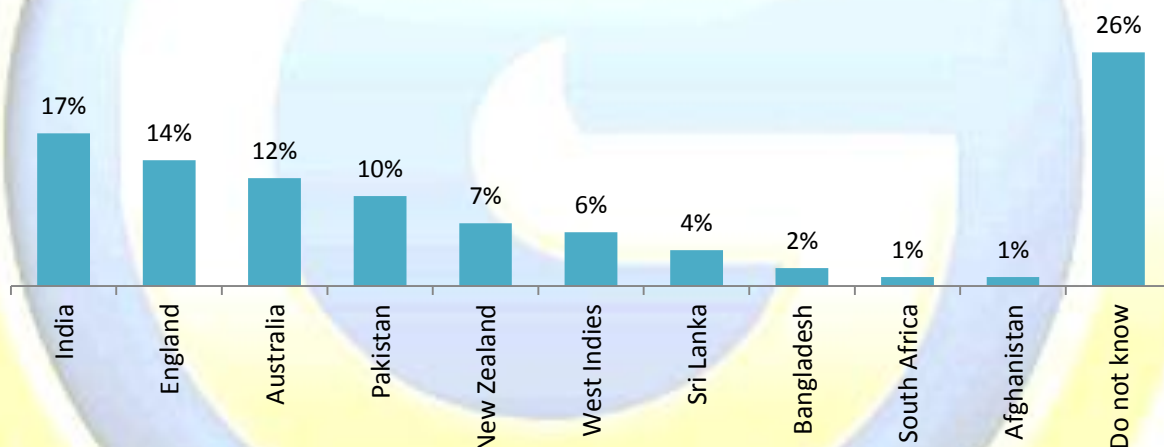

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, more Pakistanis believe that India, England or Australia will win the Cricket World Cup 2019 than Pakistan.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from urban areas across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion, which team will win the Cricket World Cup 2019?” In response, 17% said India will win, 14% said England, 12% said Australia, 10% said Pakistan, 7% said New Zealand, 6% said West Indies, 4% said Sri Lanka, 2% said Bangladesh, 1% said South Africa, and another 1% said Afghanistan. 26% did not know.

“Recency effect”: This poll was conducted immediately after Pakistan’s defeat by India, which must be kept in mind while trying to understand why a large percentage of Pakistanis think India will most likely win the World Cup and fewer claim that Pakistan will win. In Behavioral Economics, “recency effect” is explained as a phenomenon that occurs when “more recent information is better remembered and receives greater weight in forming a judgment than does earlier-presented information”. Therefore, we suspect that the results will be different once the outcomes of the other matches are known.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,386 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 15 - June 24, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
