Practice****A vast majority of Pakistanis (62%) claim that they have had the chance to participate in a Quran lesson (*dars*).
(GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)**

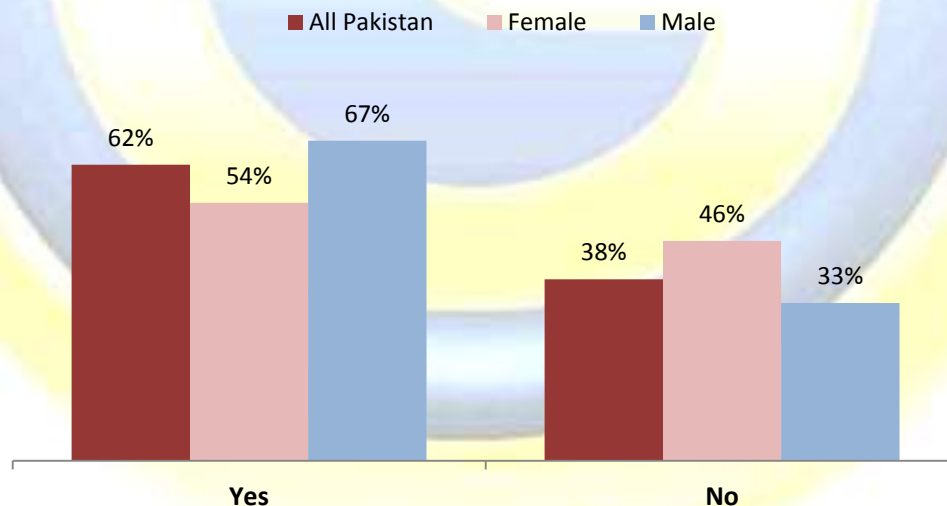
Islamabad, August 19, 2019

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, a vast majority of Pakistanis (62%) claim that they have had the chance to participate in a Quran lesson (*dars*).

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Have you ever had the chance to participate in a Quran lesson (*dars*)?” In response in 2019, 62% said that they had had the chance to participate in a Quran lesson, whereas 38% said that they had not had the chance to participate in a Quran lesson (*dars*).

More males claimed to have had the chance to participate in a Quran lesson as compared to females: Amongst males, 67% claimed to have had a chance of participation in a Quran lesson (*dars*) whereas 33% had not gotten a chance to participate in a Quran lesson. Amongst females, comparatively fewer had had the chance to participate in a *dars* as 54% responded with ‘Yes’ and 46% responded with ‘No’.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 02 - August 09, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
