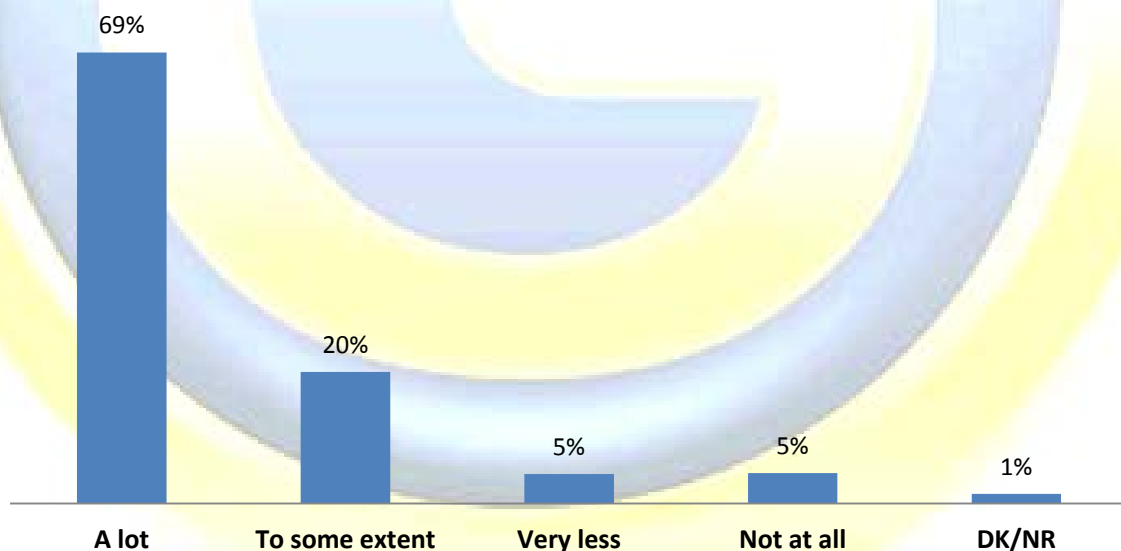
An overwhelming 69 % Pakistanis believe that religion can be a source of happiness in a person's life to a great extent. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, September 16, 2019

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 69% Pakistanis believe that religion to a great extent can be a source of happiness in a person's life.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "In your opinion, to what extent can religion be a source of happiness in a person's life?" In response, 69% Pakistanis said that religion to a great extent can be a source of happiness in a one's life, while 20% said it can be a source of happiness to some extent, 5% said religion contributes very less to happiness, 5% said religion does not contribute to one's happiness at all, and remaining 1% said they did not know/did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,372 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 02 – August 09, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
