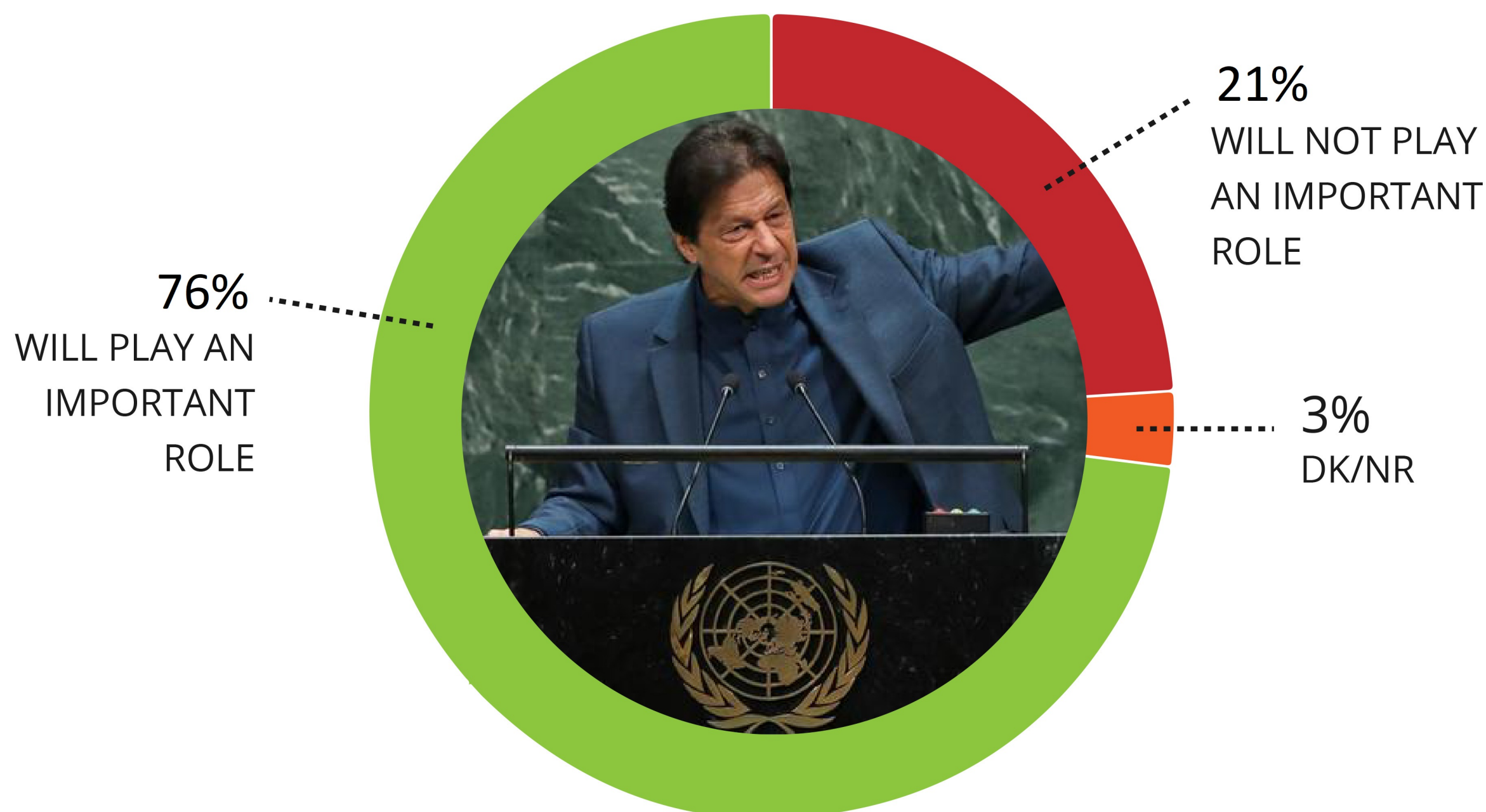

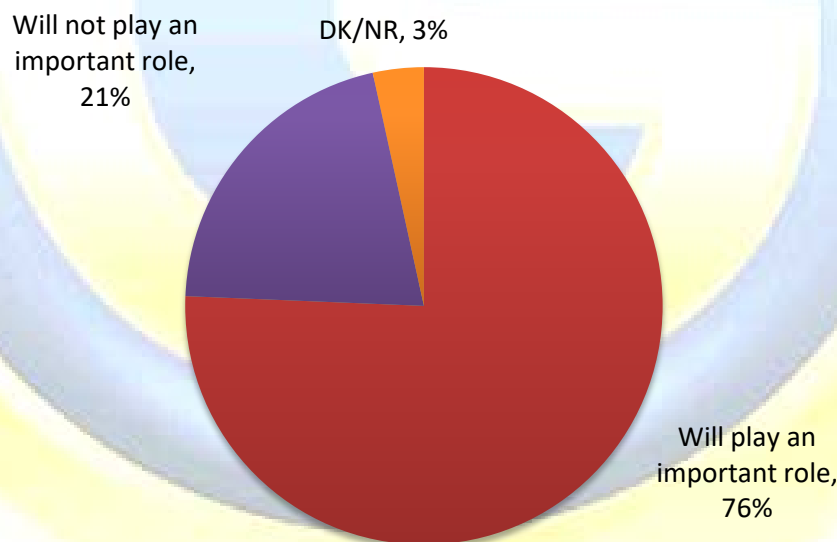

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 3 in 4 Pakistanis (76%) are optimistic that Prime Minister Imran Khan's speech at the United Nations General Assembly will play a pivotal role in resolving the Kashmir issue.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, *"Some people are of the opinion that Prime Minister Imran Khan's speech at the United Nations General Assembly will play a pivotal role in solving the crisis surrounding the Kashmir issue, whereas some people believe otherwise. What is your opinion?"* In response, 76% said it will play an important role, 21% said it will not play an important role and 3% did not know/did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,200 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 07- October 20, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
