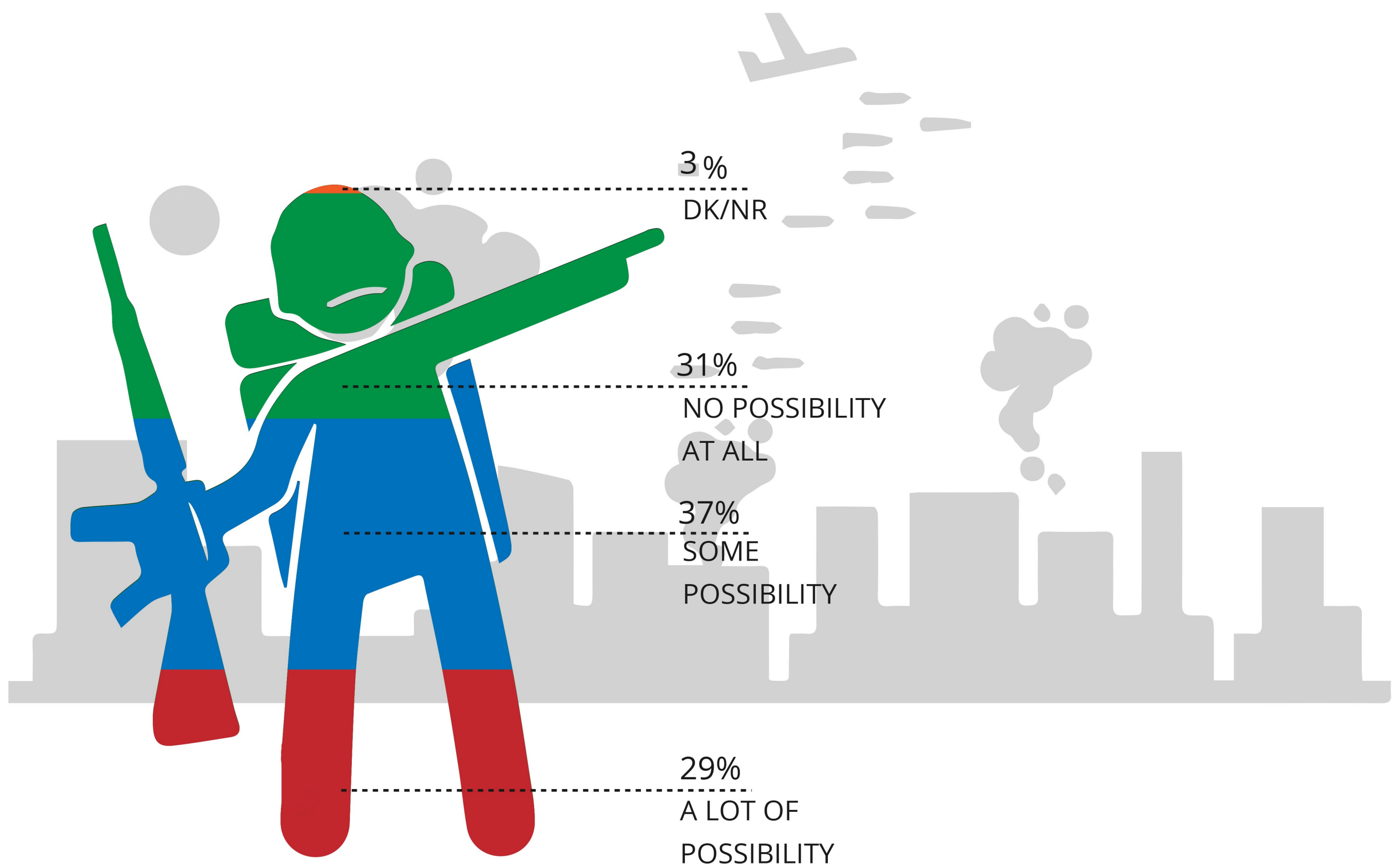

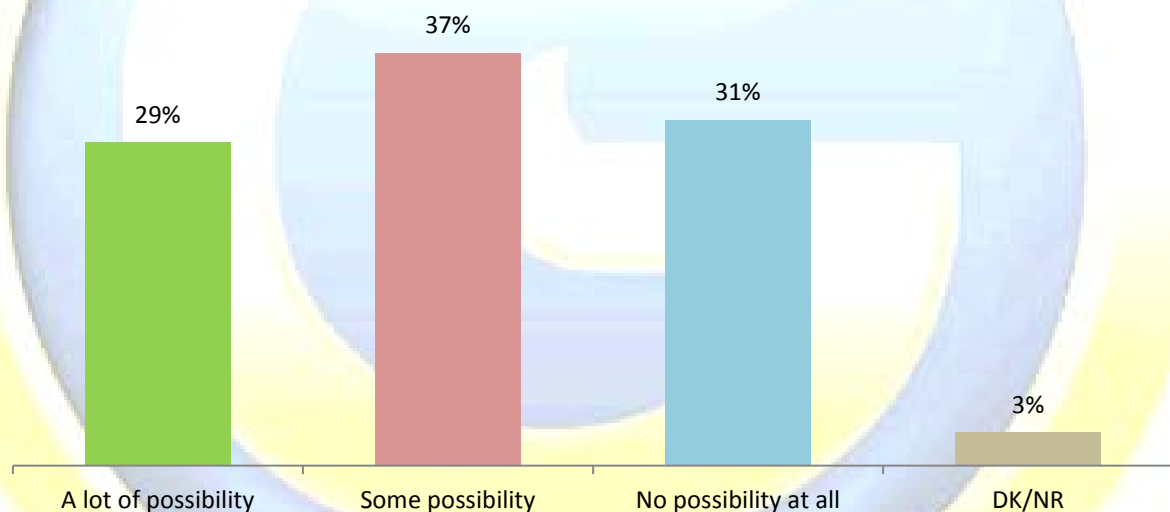
66 % of Pakistanis fear a possibility of war between India and Pakistan (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL).

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 66% of Pakistanis believe under the current condition there is a possibility of a war between India and Pakistan

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Under the current situation, what is the possibility of a war between India and Pakistan?” In response, 29% said there is a lot of possibility, 37% said there is some possibility, 31% said there is no possibility at all, and 3% did not know/did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,287 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 22 - September 30, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
