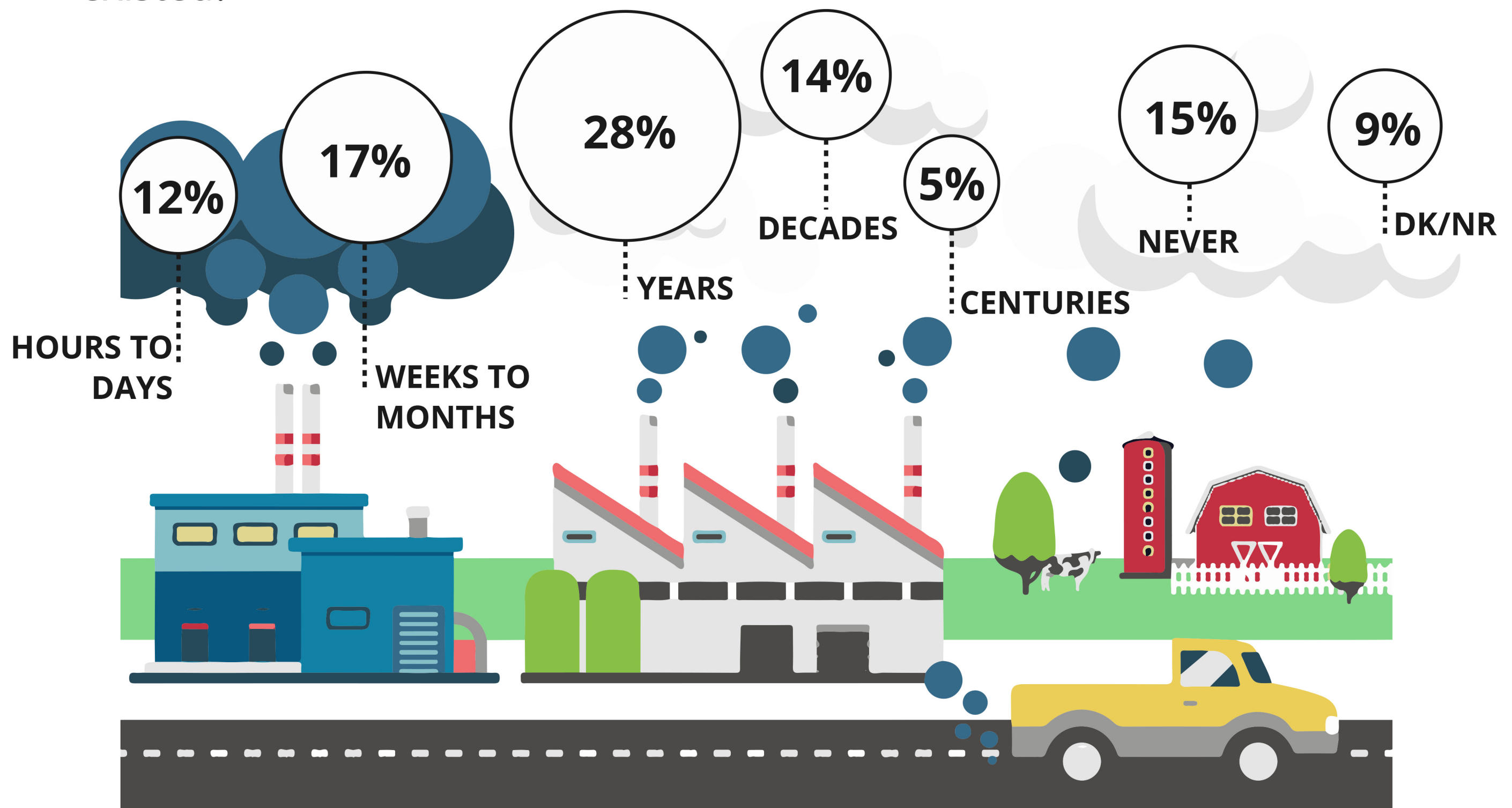

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 29% of Pakistanis believe it would only take a few months or even less time for greenhouse gases in the air to fall back to the level they were before modern factories, transportation and power plants existed.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “How long would it take for the greenhouse gases in the air to fall back to what they were before modern factories, transportation and power plants existed?” In response, 12% said hours to days, 17% said weeks to months, 28% said years, 14% said decades, 5% said centuries, and 9% said they very strongly disagree.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,448 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 30-July 09, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
