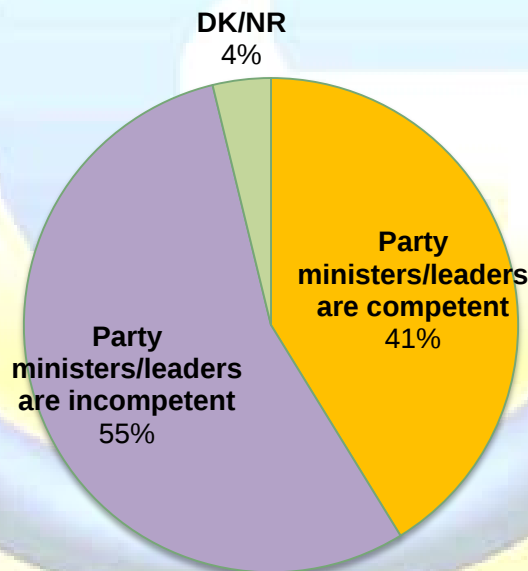

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 55% believe that Prime Minister Imran Khan's party ministers/leaders are incompetent.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, *"Some people are of the view that Prime Minister Imran Khan's party ministers/leaders are incompetent whereas others believe that Prime Minister Imran Khan's party ministers/leaders are competent. What is your opinion about this?"* In response, 55% claimed that they thought of Imran Khan's party ministers/leaders as incompetent and 41% thought of the party ministers/leaders as competent. Only 4% said they did not know/did not wish to answer.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,214 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during November 06 - November 09, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
