According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 51% internet users claim they visit websites for news.

A representative sample of men and women that were internet users from across the four provinces was asked, “Do you visit internet websites for news?” In response, 51% of the internet users said they visit internet websites for news while 49% said they do not visit internet websites for news.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,200 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 07 – October 20, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
