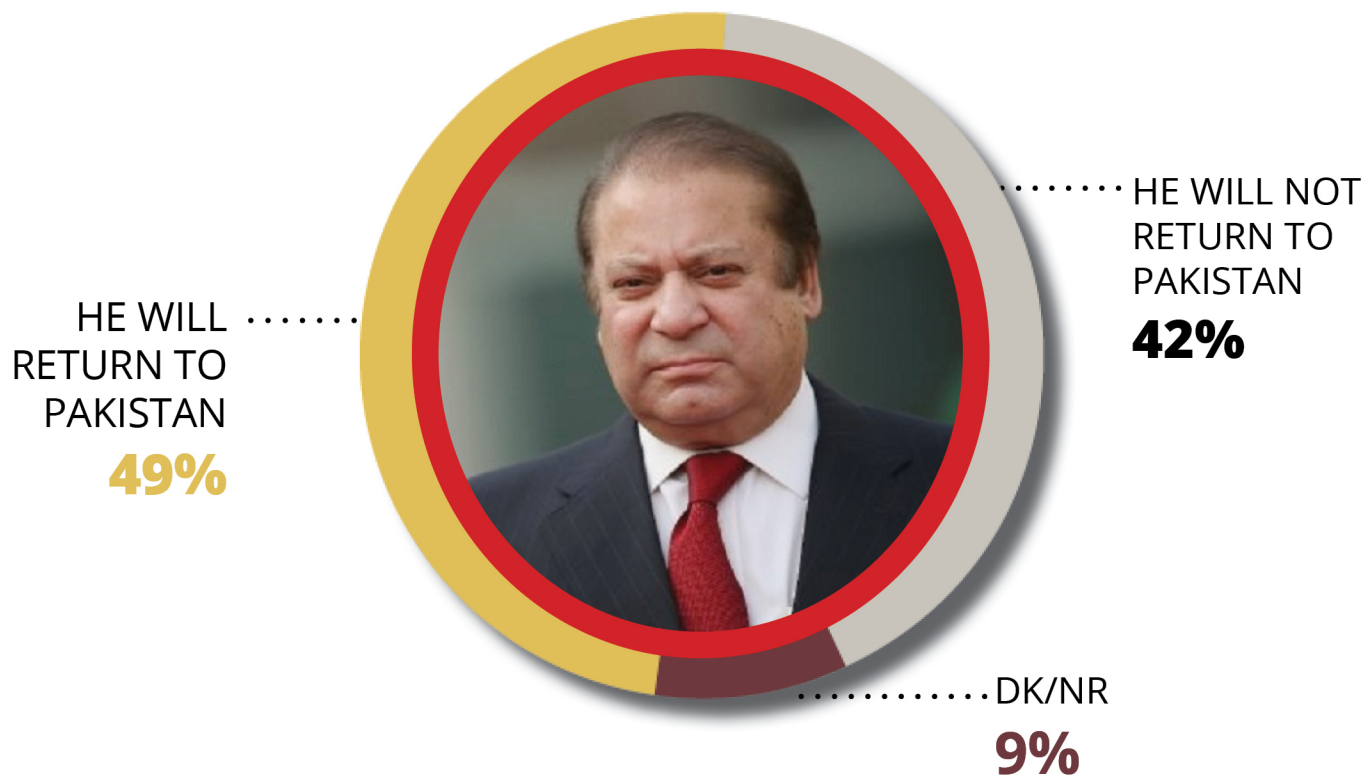

NEARLY 1 IN 2 PAKISTANIS (49%) ARE OPTIMISTIC THAT NAWAZ SHARIF WILL RETURN TO PAKISTAN ONCE HIS HEALTH IMPROVES

Some people believe that Nawaz Sharif will return to Pakistan once his health improves, while other people believe that he will not return to Pakistan. What is your opinion on the matter?

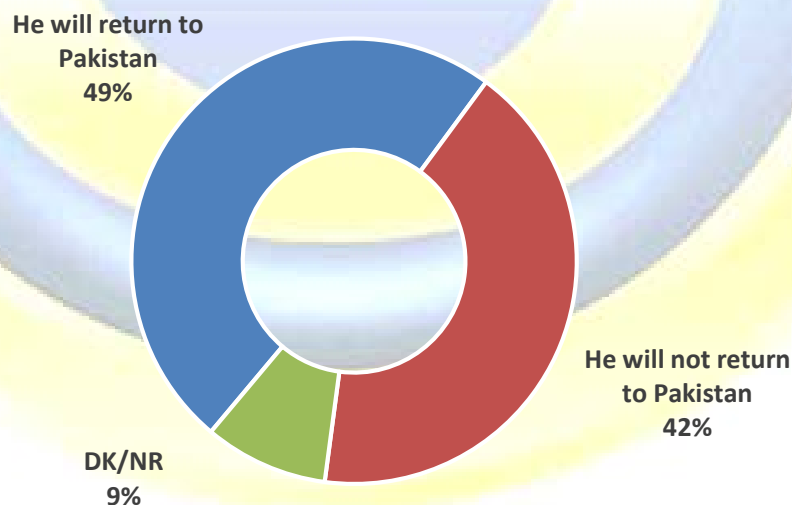
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 1 in 2 Pakistanis (49%) are optimistic that Nawaz Sharif will return to Pakistan once his health improves.

A representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people believe that Nawaz Sharif will return to Pakistan once his health improves, while other people believe that he will not return to Pakistan. What is your opinion on the matter?” In response, 49% believe that he will return to Pakistan, 42% say he will not return to Pakistan and 9% said they do not know if Nawaz Sharif will return to Pakistan.

Split by Voting Intention:

80% PML-N supporters claim Nawaz Sharif will return to Pakistan, 12% say he will not return and 8% do not know/did not respond. 42% PPP supporters claim Nawaz Sharif will return to Pakistan once his health improves, 46% believe he will not return and 12% do not know/did not respond. Out of the total PTI supporters, only 26% say Nawaz Sharif will return to Pakistan, a high 66% believe he will not return to Pakistan and 8% said they do not know/did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,225 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 15 – December 21, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
