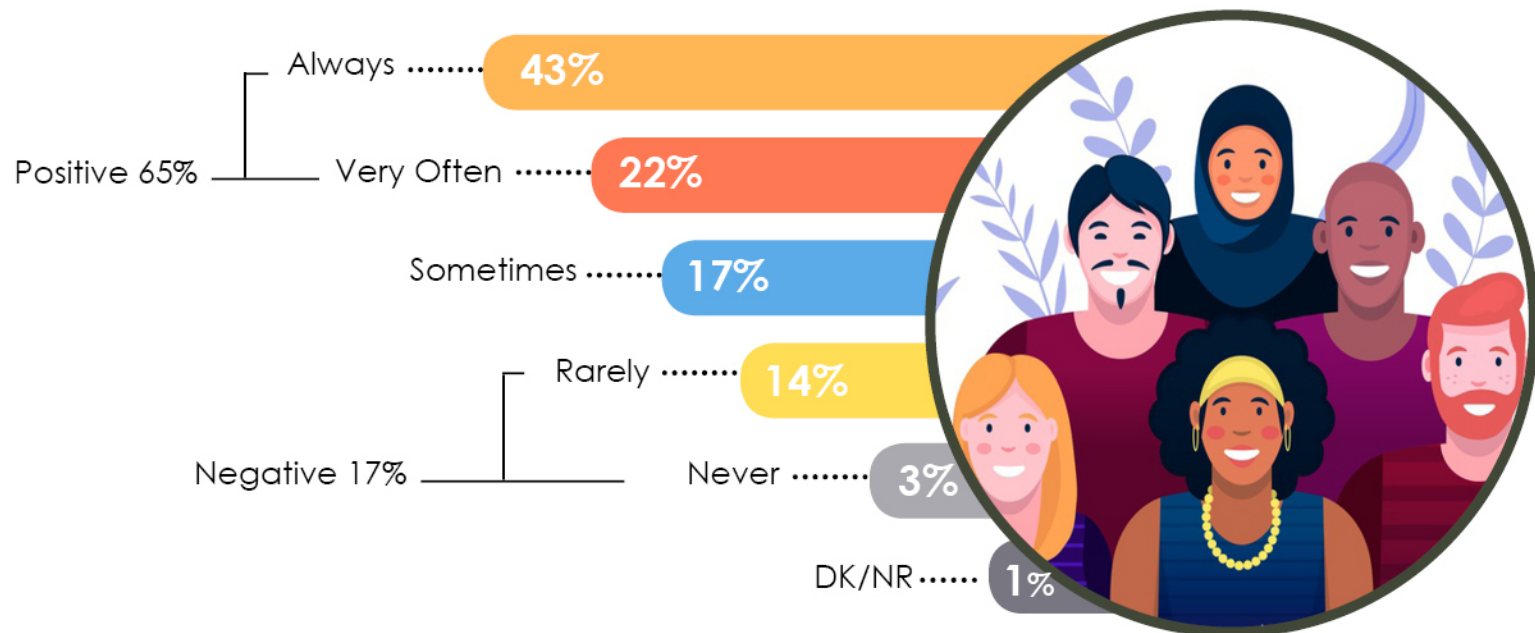

OVER 3 IN 5 (65%) PAKISTANIS SAY THEY FELT OPTIMISTIC ABOUT THE FUTURE IN THE LAST TWO WEEKS

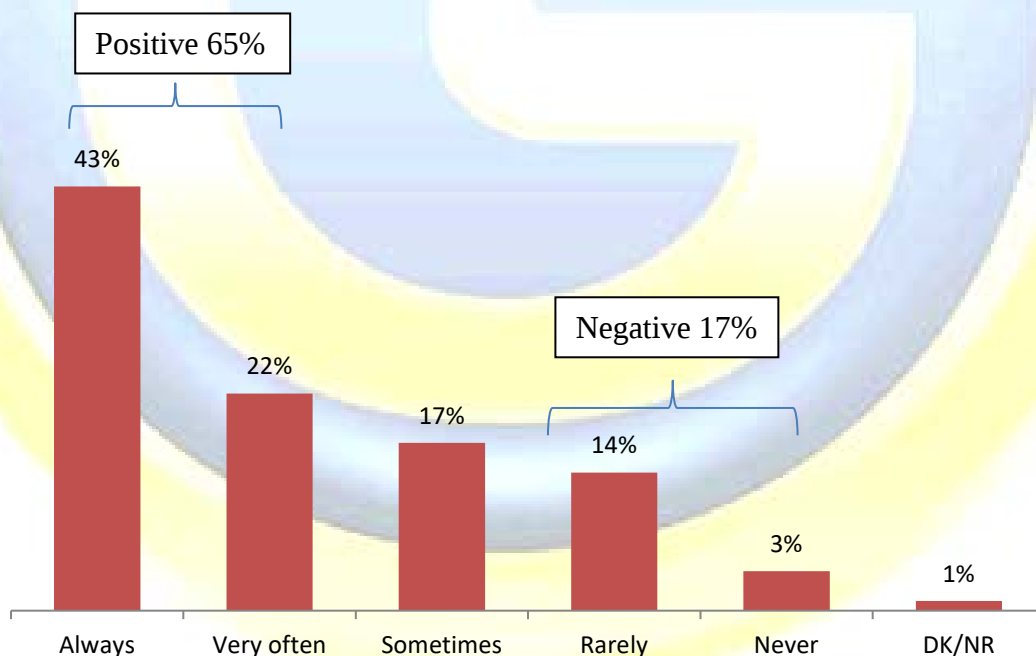
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 65% Pakistanis say they felt optimistic about the future in the last two weeks.

A representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “How often in the last two weeks have you felt optimistic about the future?” In response, 43% said always, 22% said very often, 17% said sometimes, 14% said rarely, 3% said never and 1% did not know/did not respond.

Urban/Rural Breakdown: More urban residents claim they always feel optimistic about the future as compare to rural residents

Among urban respondents, 37% said they always felt optimistic while a higher 46% rural residents said the same. 23% in urban setting said they feel optimistic very often as opposed to 22% in rural, 21% in urban said sometimes compared to 15% in rural areas, 17% urban and 13% rural respondents said they rarely feel optimistic while 2% urban and 4% rural residents said they never feel optimistic.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,219 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 24 – December 31, 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
