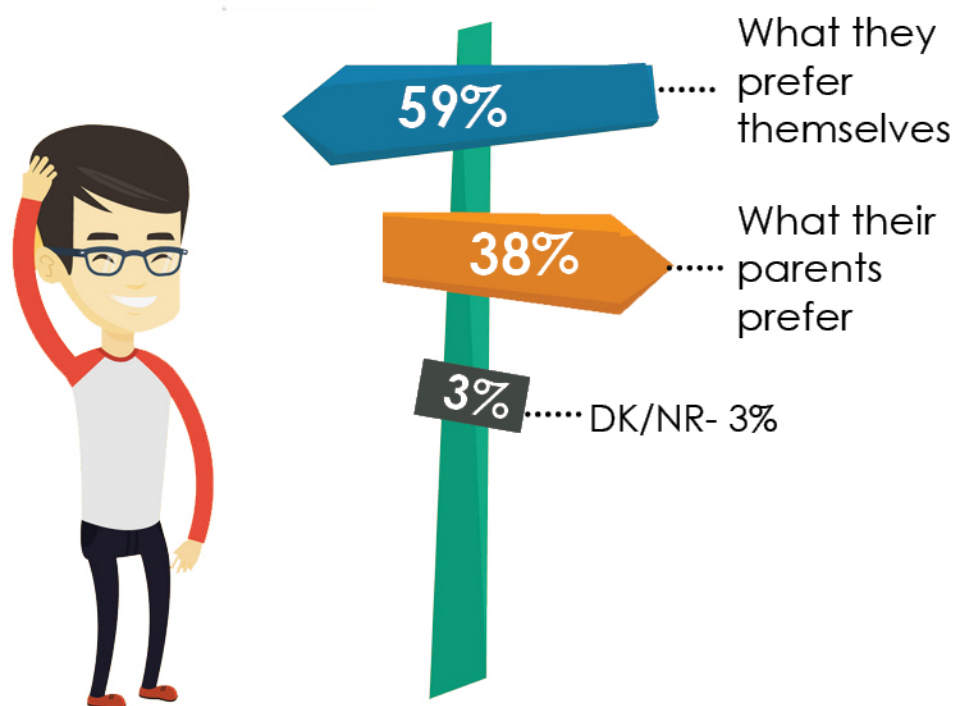

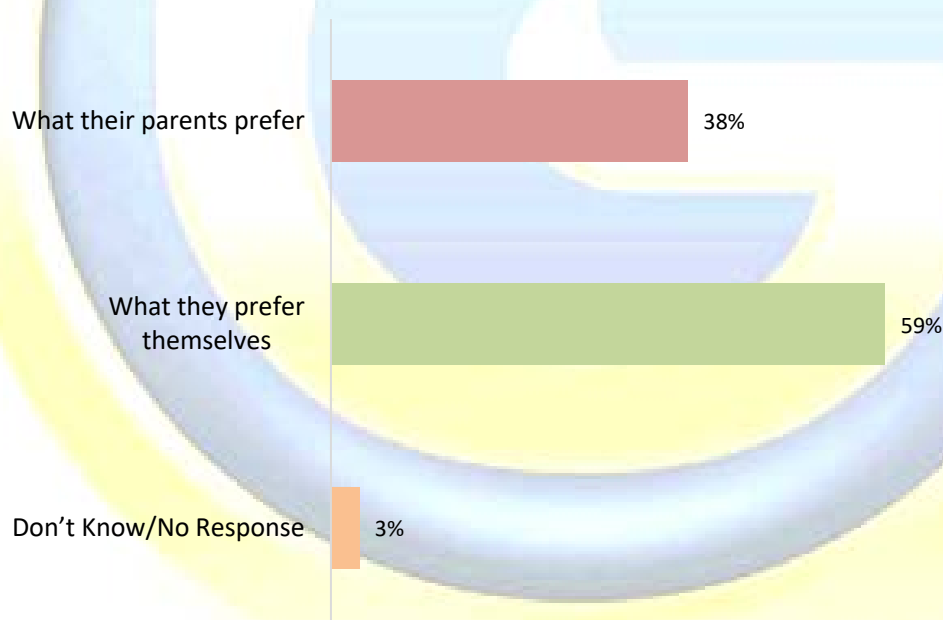

Employment****3 in 5 (59 %) Pakistanis feel that children should choose an occupation of their own choice instead of their parents' choice (Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Poll)**

Islamabad, 19 February 2020

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 59% Pakistanis feel that children should choose an occupation of their own choice instead of their parents' choice.

A representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, *"In your opinion, what occupation should children choose, one that their parents prefer or one that they themselves prefer?"* In response, 38% claimed the children should choose what their parents prefer while 59% say their occupation should be one that they themselves prefer. Only 3% say they do not know/did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,208 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 08 - February 15, 2020. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
