KARACHI: After garnering worldwide praise as a ‘mediator’ and being regarded as a true representative of Muslim world, Prime Minister Imran Khan heaped praise on Turkish president saying “I can safely say that he [Erdogan] can win next elections in Pakistan”.

Unshakable Pak-Turkey Ties | Editorial



TURKISH President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's visit to Pakistan has once again highlighted the warmth that has always been there between the two brotherly countries and remains unaffected by some transitory developments. During comprehensive discussions the leadership of the two countries has agreed to continue supporting each other on crucial issues and transform their relationship into a strong and vibrant trade and economic partnership.

Turkey has always been close to heart of every Pakistani because of unparalleled commitment and sincerity of its leadership to well-being and prosperity of people of Pakistan and unconditional support to the core causes of the country. The spontaneous warm welcome that the Turkish leader receives during his visit to Pakistan is reflection of the deep love and affection of the people of Pakistan. Prime Minister Imran Khan, departing from the latest protocol, went to the Noor Khan airbase to greet the distinguished guest and drove him to the PM House for welcoming ceremony. The talks of President Erdogan with Pakistani leaders and his epoch-making address to the joint session of Parliament have strengthen the belief that the mutual relationship between the two countries was unshakable and that Turkey is ready to go to any extent to express solidarity with Pakistan and provide meaningful assistance for its progress and development. The agreement of the two countries to extend mutual support on issues of each other's core interest assumes significance in the backdrop of latest developments in Occupied Kashmir. President Erdogan won hearts of people of Pakistan by condemning the Indian move of illegal annexation of the occupied territory and draconian measures imposed there that have taken away fundamental rights of Kashmiris. Pakistan is also making frantic efforts to increase

exports and attract foreign investment and the large business delegation, which accompanied the Turkish President, has intensive interaction with Pakistani counterparts on almost all aspects of economic ties including trade, investment and cooperation on tourism, military procurement, cooperation in other areas of defence industry to energy, construction, textile, food, livestock, import and export, airways, real state, tourism, consultancy trade, shipping, agriculture, jewellery, automotive, construction and production, tractor and engine, casting, paper production and on-vehicle equipment. There are genuine expectations that this interaction and understanding developed between the private sectors of the two countries would help boost bilateral trade to the mutual advantage. It is also expected that issues like imposition of protective duty imposed by Turkey on textiles would be resolved because, analysts point out, the existing trade volume between the two countries has dropped drastically from \$1.08 billion to \$792 million after levy of a protective duty on textiles by Turkey. Previously, the textile exports to Turkey were based on normal tariffs, but later Turkey imposed a very high 18% protective duty, leading to a decline in the textile exports. Turkish President has been lending an ear to grievances of Pakistan as demonstrated by his approach to the Karkey dispute. The intervention of the Turkish President helped Pakistan save a huge penalty of US\$ 1.2 billion imposed by ICSID [International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes] as Pakistan had lost litigation with Turkish power company Karkey Karadeniz Elektrik Uretim (KKEU). Apart from increased potential for trade, there are also bright prospects for enhanced Turkish investment in infrastructure development, energy, low cost housing and municipal services (A Turkish Company is already doing wonders in the area of waste management in Punjab). We have been emphasizing in these columns the need for initiating joint ventures especially in the realm of defence production as the two countries, through research and development, cannot only meet most of their own defence requirements but also capture the foreign market. The statement made and sentiments expressed by President Erdogan during his address to the joint session of Parliament have also gone well with people of Pakistan as was also evident from enthusiastic response from MPs. Erdogan spoke from core of his heart in expressing complete solidarity with Pakistan in every respect. It is because of his sincerity and deep commitment to the causes of humanity in general and Muslims in particular that in Gallup International's annual popularity index of world political leaders, President Erdogan has emerged as the topmost Muslim leader and the fifth most-favoured leader in the world. The visit of the Turkish leader has laid foundations for an intensified cooperation between the two countries and it now depends on the ability of our ministries and departments concerned as to how quickly they translate this understanding into practical projects and programmes.

From television bulletins to newspapers, Recep Tayyip Erdogan has been the main focus since his plane took off from Ankara on Thursday.

The media attention only magnified once his special plane touched down in Islamabad and he was greeted by the visibly-exultant Prime Minister of Pakistan, Imran Khan.

Readers woke up on Friday to images of Erdogan and his wife Emine Erdogan splattered across the front pages of all leading English- and Urdu-language dailies.

The accompanying news reports were centered on the Turkish leader's grand welcome and his visit's potential impact on Ankara and Islamabad's economic ties.

Another recurring feature of the reports was Khan's gesture of personally driving Erdogan to the Prime Minister House.

As the day progressed, the state-owned broadcaster and all news channels opened their bulletins with content on Erdogan's engagements in Islamabad.

They ensured live transmission of his record fourth address to Pakistan's parliament, following it up with strikingly positive coverage on his vow of support for Kashmiris and pledge to boost economic and defense cooperation.

Erdogan and Khan's appearance at a business conference later in the day was accorded the same importance.

Their speeches were broadcast live and the Turkish leader's expression of commitment to stronger trade ties was the opener for subsequent news bulletins.

Who said what?

The Daily Jang -- Pakistan's most popular Urdu-language newspaper -- highlighted the ongoing strategic, trade, and investment cooperation between the two countries, including their joint efforts to combat Islamophobia.

The paper ran a separate story on the warm welcome given to Erdogan by all political forces, irrespective of their stance towards the ruling party and its allies.

Dawn -- the country's oldest English-language daily -- focused on the visit's potential to transform Pakistan and Turkey's brotherly relations into a dynamic economic partnership.

Another reputed English-language daily, The News International, was on the same page with its emphasis on trade ties and Ankara's unwavering support for Islamabad's stance on Kashmir.

The country's other top publications -- among them The Express Tribune, Business Recorder, Daily Express, and Nawa-i-Waqt -- were similarly upbeat over the possible outcomes of what is Erdogan's second visit as president of Turkey.

They also shed light on Islamabad and Ankara's closeness and cooperative stance on issues pertaining to the Muslim world, particularly Palestine, Afghanistan, and Kashmir.

Unmatched popularity

The favorable media coverage of Erdogan's visit was in line with his resounding popularity among Pakistanis and Muslims in general.

His perception in Pakistan is such that several parties and politicians, while campaigning for the country's last general elections in 2018, wooed voters with promises of implementing Erdogan-like policies.

It will only be further bolstered after his address to parliamentarians on Friday, in which he paid tribute to the help extended by Pakistani people during the Turkish War of Independence and asserted that there is "no difference" between "Canakkale [Gallipoli] then and Kashmir today".

A recent survey also found the Turkish president to be the most popular Muslim leader in the world, ahead of Saudi Arabia's King Salman and Iranian President Hassan Rouhani.

Gallup International's annual index on Thursday also placed Erdogan as the fifth-most popular world leader, behind German Chancellor Angelina, France's Emmanuel Macron, Russia's Vladimir Putin, and U.S. President Donald Trump.

Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan has been recognized as the most popular leader in the Muslim world, surpassing Saudi King Salman. He is also ranked fifth in popularity among leaders around the world.

On Friday, the Anadolu Agency published the news based on the results of the Gallup International survey.

German Chancellor Angela Merkel is the most popular leader in the world, according to data released by the International Survey. She is in first position with 46 percent of the vote. France's Emmanuel Macron is second with 40 percent of the vote and Russian President Vladimir Putin is third with 36 percent of the vote. And fourth-placed US President Donald Trump got 31 percent of the vote.

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson is in the position alongside Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan. Saudi King Salman, who is relatively behind, received 25 percent of the vote and Iran's President Rouhani received 21 percent of the vote.

Note that in 1977, Dr. George Horace Gallup first began surveying this index of popularity. The Gallup International and Year of Survey is being published at the end of each year.

The survey was conducted in 50 countries of the world where fifty thousand 261 people took part. A Thousand of women and men from each country represent the survey. They voted face to face, telephone and online, in a survey conducted last November and December.

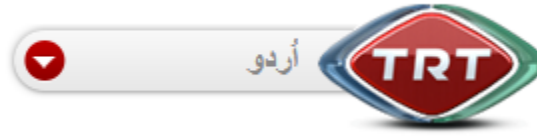

Our President's visit to Pakistan, its importance and journey to time

I have visited Pakistan, my second homeland. I made my first visit to Pakistan during the summer term in 1985, during a summer vacation, with a 4-5 day transportation by bus. The Iran-Iraq war was still going on. We were being downloaded and searched every time at the entrance and exit of Iran and the cities. Traces of war were visible everywhere.

In those years, I was not giving up the difficulties with the excitement of the youth. After the city of Zahedan in Iran, I can never forget my journey from the desert border of Taftan on the Iran-Pakistan border to the Quetta, from the 18-hour desert road. The bus is from the old magus model 1960s, the seats are hard and narrow, there was even chicken inside the vehicle. Oh those roads are nothing called asphalt, raw road, a long trip to jump. Stopovers on the roads are awful, no cleanliness, even drink water is salty. The toilet sucks. Food is one kind of fatty, meaty, spicy. Fortunately, it did not come to me, there were raids as well. Quetta was a city where Afghans were the majority. From there, I arrived to Karachi by train, to Ravalpindi by bus and to Islamabad, the last stop. I'm back the same way again. The journey took 20 days. I met many friends. Professor Dr. Muhammad Patience, Like judge Muhammed Said-Hamdard- and Turkish students. I wanted to share my memories briefly on this occasion. This was our first time traveling to Pakistan in the past. Then I used these routes round-trip a few more times.

In 2012, I was on the delegation of Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan for the Pakistan Joint Economic Commission (KEK) meeting. I was on an official mission. Pakistanis also loved our chief at that time. Islamabad Lok If there stands the ethnographic Museum in many countries, but Turkey did not. We conveyed this to the Pakistani authorities. Pakistani Culture Year in Turkey and the realization of a separate issue with the administration of the place stands for our country and its contents have agreed to form the Turkish side. We learned that this booth was opened in the following years. Agreements were also made to develop cooperation in many areas.

Turkey and Pakistan relations if you ask why is it so important for us to say, I'll give the answer; first of all, the most important people in the history of Pakistan and India were Turks (Ghaznavids, Gurlular, Delhi, Halaçlı, Tuğluklular and Babürlü). Because India was ruled in the form of small states under the rule of Raca. There was no place like all of India. Here, the Turks conquered these places and provided integrity. They left a sense of state to India. Later, when the British entered here, Muslims founded Pakistan as a separate state. Later, Bangladesh, Myanmar, Srilanka separated and became a

state. As a historical fact, these states had a state structure thanks to the Turks. In this respect, India owes its being a big country to Turks and therefore to Muslims. If the Turks had not entered India, they would have remained small states or would have been under the occupation of China. Now there is persecution of Muslims in India. Of course it is in Arakan-Myanmar and Bangladesh.

He visited Pakistan on February 14-16, 2020 for a meeting of the 6th High Level Strategic Cooperation Council with the delegation of President Erdoğan.

As it is known, the support given by the Muslims of India during the War of Independence later turned into a long-established brotherhood with the establishment of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan. Erdogan's visits to Pakistan create a different enthusiasm than other Turkish leaders. We can say that President Erdoğan was welcomed as the **"leader of the Islamic world" in the** Pakistan Parliament. Erdogan's speech, which started with Basmalah, is understood by the enthusiastic support of the members of the parliament who hit the lines after each sentence.

Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's visit to Pakistan, there was always located between the two brotherly countries and the temperature was once again emphasized affected by some temporary improvement. During extensive discussions, the leadership of the two countries agreed to continue supporting each other on important matters and turning their relations into a strong and vibrant trade and economic partnership.

Prime Minister Imran Khan greeted at the Khan Khan air base to greet the elite guest and take him to the Prime Minister's House for the welcoming ceremony. President Erdogan, who came to the parliament to address senators and lawmakers in the joint session, was welcomed by the president and members of the two wings of the parliament. Speaking at the session, which started with the recitation of the Quran and recitation, Kayser said, "It is a great honor to appeal to me. Here we host not only a friend of Pakistan but a leader and leader of the Islamic world." used the expression. Kayser pointed out that the Pakistani parliament member senator and lawmakers are eagerly waiting for Erdogan's speech, "As an iconic figure of the Islamic world, we look forward to listening to your enlightening views." said.

Erdogan, speaking in Parliament on common historical ties between Pakistan and Turkey to (Mughals and Gazneliler) began mentioning. The great rally held in Lahore during the Çanakkale War denied women giving their bracelets and the memory of

Muhammed İkbāl during the War of Independence. He gave a reference to the common fate between the two countries by saying " Canakkale **yesterday** Canakkale today" . " However, believers are brothers " principle of movement " eternal brotherhood will retain in perpetuity " he promised. " Cihanşümül brotherhood " **of** sectarian, scorpion, tribes and language differences He stressed that he could not get on it. " Between the Ummah's differences with troubleshooting and just cause in leaving" he underlined Turkey's determination.

Energy, construction, textile, food, animal husbandry, import and export, airlines, real state, tourism, consulting trade, transportation, agriculture, jewelry, automotive, construction and production, tractor and engine, casting, paper in Pakistan and other fields of the defense industry manufacture and on-vehicle equipment. Agreements were made between the private sectors of the two countries. It is a fact that this interaction and understanding will help make mutual trade advantageous. Experts of the current trade volume between the two countries after the abolition of protective duties on textiles that 1.08 billion dollars from 792 million dollars dropped significantly, the implementation of tax saver exerted on the textile Turkey is also expected to resolve such problems.

In the annual popularity index of Gallup International's world political leaders, President Erdogan was chosen the first of the top 5 Muslim leaders. Moreover, it was the event of the day that the Pakistani Imam prayer would not be suitable for him to perform during the Friday prayer and that the prayer offered for President Erdogan's prayer.

The visit of the Turkish leader laid the foundation of intense cooperation between the two countries and now depends on how quickly our ministries and departments turn this understanding into practical projects and programs.

Our relations with Pakistan have a special place. In this respect, we should increase our relations even more.

Balkan country Macedonia, with its changing name "Republic of Northern Macedonia", took the first step towards NATO membership in February 2019, after the name problem with Greece disappeared. The country, which gradually approached

membership in the organization with the approval of the Macedonian Assembly's NATO accession protocol, is expected to become the 30th country of the alliance in March.

Turkey also has close relations with the military and economic fields in **the history of Macedonia, the current economic situation, the number of troops and the name issue with Greece** where the information you need to know about've compiled for you.

1.) Macedonia, bordering Kosovo, Bulgaria, Greece and Albania, has a Balkan country and a population of 2 million, with a surface area of 25,713 km².



2.) Throughout history, Roman, Serbian and Ottoman Empires ruled in Macedonian territory. The first Macedonian Kingdom goes back to 700-600 BC. **The kingdom, which lived its golden age with Alexander the Great, which left its mark on world history,** had the widest lands ever reached. The Hellenistic period began with Alexander, who united the intertwined peoples and the Greek city-states.



3.) After the reign of the Roman, Bulgarian and Serbian Empires, the Ottoman army took the first step of the conquest of the Macedonian region in 1371 and with the victory of the Second Kosovo War , **Macedonia's current territory was completely under Ottoman rule** . After about 500 years, he left the Ottoman Empire with the Balkan Wars in 1912-1913.

4.) Macedonia, one of the 6 autonomous republics within the Democratic Federation of Yugoslavia, founded under the leadership of Josip Broz Tito after the Second World War, gained **independence** on September 8, **1991** .



5.) The ethnic structure, which changed after about half a million Albanians migrated to the country after the Kosovo War in 1999, is now distributed as **64.2% Macedonian, 25.2% Albanian, 3.9% Turkish .**



6.) 67% of the people are Orthodox Christians and 30% are Muslims.



7.) In the country with a parliamentary system, the president and members of the parliament are elected by the people every 5 years and are appointed by the Prime Minister. **Stevo Pendarovski** , the candidate for the pro-EU Macedonian Social Democrats Union, who won 51.66 percent of the vote in the second round of the Presidential elections on April 21, 2019 .

8.) GDP per capita in Macedonia, which is the 134th largest economy in the world among 194 countries, is around **6 thousand dollars** . Turkey's 2018 figures in 9405 dollars.

10.) It has one of the smallest armies in the world, with **8,000 troops** .



11.) The most important problem that directs country politics in general is **the name problem with Greece and Albania is a 'minority' problem**. The name problem has disappeared, but Albanians, who make up a large part of the country's population, are influenced by politics, society and culture in all areas. For example, the **country's second largest political party, the Democratic Union for Integration, is the Albanian party**. Albanian nationalists, who claim that they make up 40% of the country's population, not 25%, want them to be accepted as 'people' rather than 'minorities'.



The Name Issue Between Greece and Macedonia and Macedonia's Name Change Process

Greece opposes the use of the name of the Republic of Macedonia, which has a territory called "Macedonia" in its territory and which has a certain region of the region, which was defined as the Macedonian region in history. The thesis presented by the Greeks to Macedonians is as follows:

ALTHOUGH YOU HAVE LANDS IN A SMALL PART OF MACEDONIA, IT IS NOT CORRECT TO USE THIS NAME AS THE COUNTRY NAME.

So much so that due to the vetoes of the Athens government, Macedonia cannot become a member of either the EU or NATO. This situation, which has been going on for years and has put Macedonian foreign policy in a deadlock, ended with an agreement signed between Macedonian Prime Minister Zoran Zaev and Greek President Aleksis Cipras on 17 June 2018.

According to the agreement between Macedonia and Greece, a **referendum** was **held on September 30, 2018** to change the country name to "North Macedonia" . The question asked in the referendum was:

"Are you a member of the European Union (EU) and NATO by accepting the agreement between Macedonia and Greece?"

91% of the referendum came out with 'yes', and with the approval of the Macedonian Assembly **on January 11, 2019** , the country's name was officially the Republic of Northern Macedonia.
