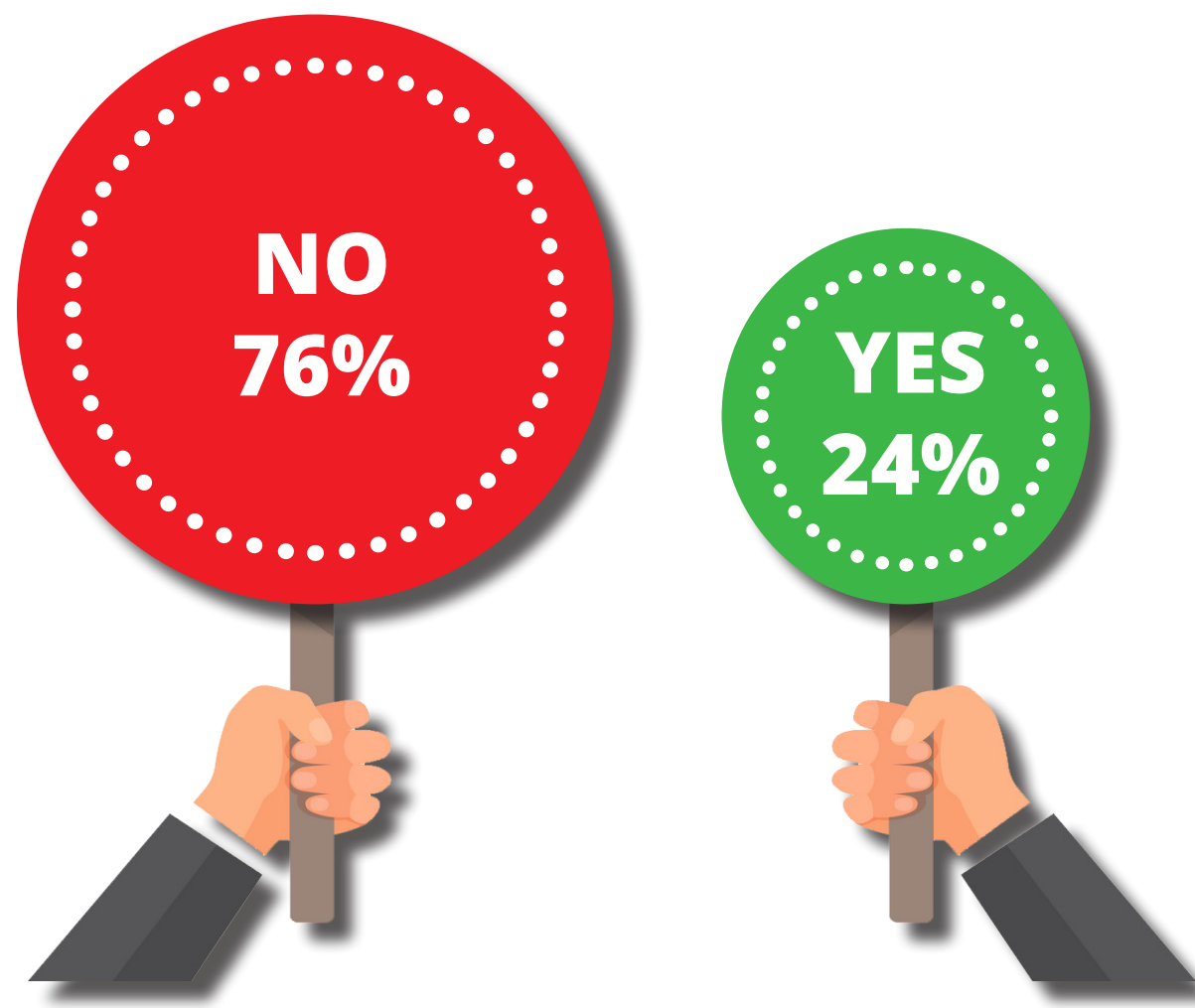

SCALE OF GLOBAL VOLUNTEERISM: ONLY 1 IN 4 RESPONDENTS (24%) OF A GLOBAL SURVEY CLAIM TO HAVE DONE SOME VOLUNTEER ACTIVITY IN THE PAST 12 MONTHS

Social Services**Scale of Global Volunteerism: Only 1 in 4 respondents (24%) of a global survey claim to have done some volunteer activity in the past 12 months (Gallup & WIN World Survey 2019)**

According to a WIN World Survey, 24% respondents over the world claim to have done voluntary work in the last few months.

A sample of 29,368 men and women from 40 countries across the globe was asked, “During the last 12 months, did you do any voluntary work, devoting time for a Not-for-Profit organization / NGO (Non-Governmental Organization) without receiving any wage or salary in exchange?” Only 24% of respondents in participating countries have done any volunteer work in the last 12 months, while 76% said they had not done any voluntary work.

Countrywise Analysis: Australian citizens do the most volunteer work

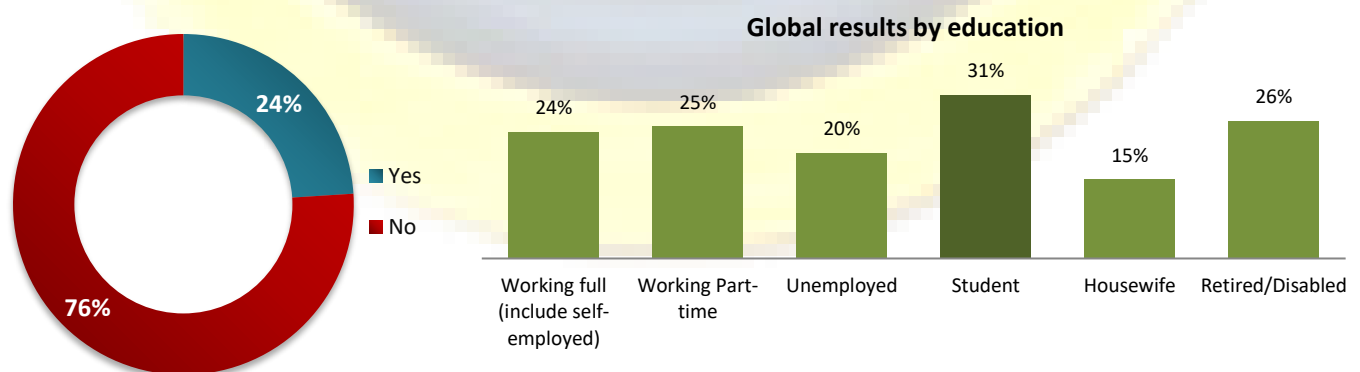
Of the 40 countries surveyed, two countries have over half of their population doing voluntary work, devoting time for a Not-for-Profit organization / NGO (Non-Governmental Organization) without receiving any wage or salary in exchange. Australia (63.3%) and Paraguay (51.6%) results contrast with South Korea (5.1%) and Pakistan (4.6%) that are the countries with the lowest rates of voluntary work.

Age & Education wise analysis: Young people and citizens with higher education are the ones more willing to do voluntary work

Compared to the previous year, there is a drop in the figures that show that less people are doing voluntary work (from 29% to 24%).

Young people and citizens with higher education are the ones more willing to do voluntary work. 31% of the students have done volunteer work, being the most willing group to do this type of work.

Field work in Pakistan conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International Association

The study was released as part of The WWS (WIN Worldwide Survey), a study conducted every year with the purpose to measure people's thoughts, expectations, worries and perceptions related to relevant topics for society and business. A total of 29,368

people were interviewed globally from 40 countries. The fieldwork was conducted during October 2019 – December 2019. The margin of error for the survey is between 2.4 and 4.4 at 95% confidence level. The global average has been computed according to the share of the covered adult population of the surveyed countries.
