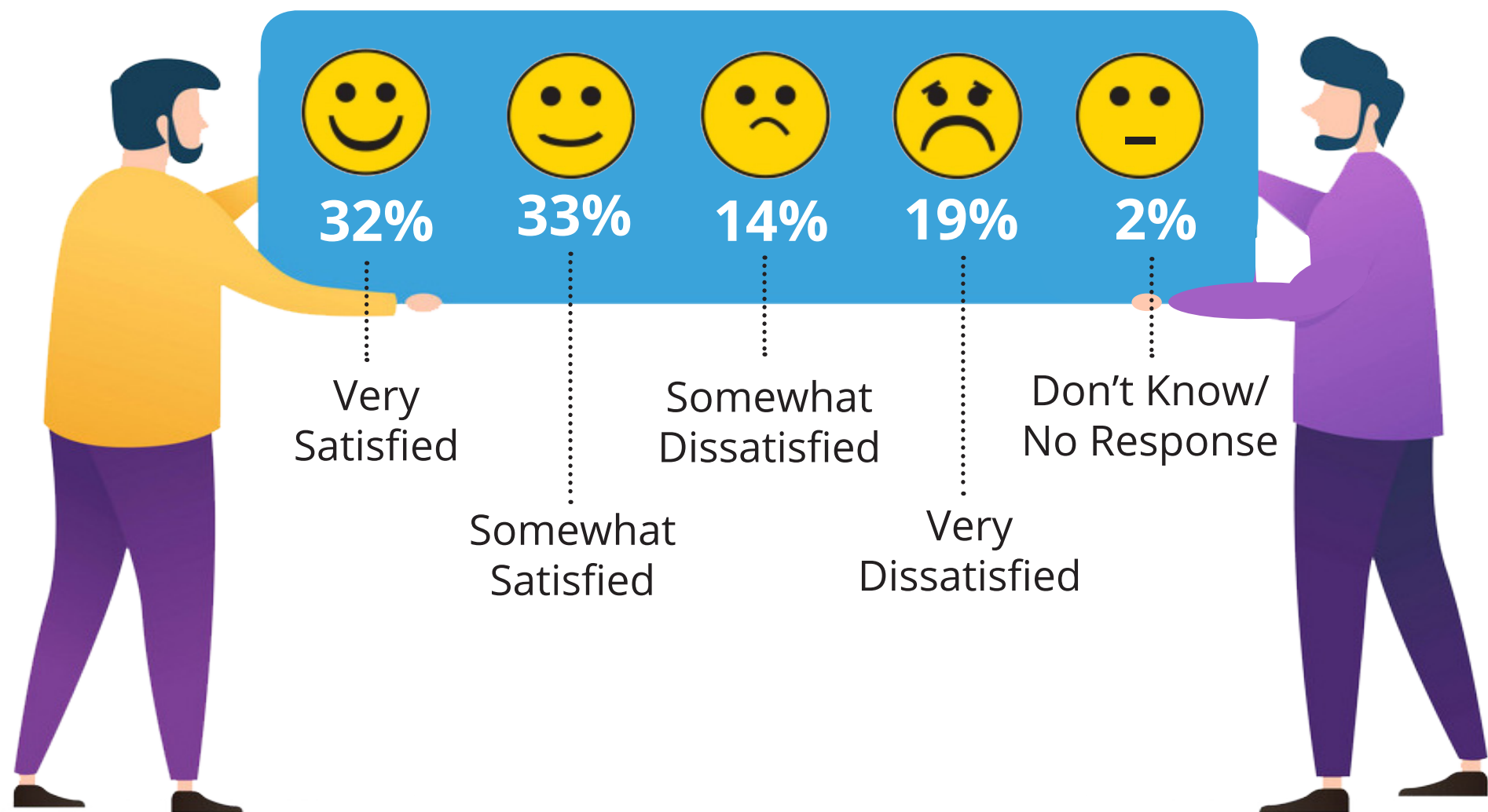

NEARLY 2 IN 3 (65%) PAKISTANIS ARE SATISFIED (VERY/SOMEWHAT) WITH THE INITIATIVES TAKEN BY PRIME MINISTER IMRAN KHAN'S GOVERNMENT TO TACKLE CORONAVIRUS

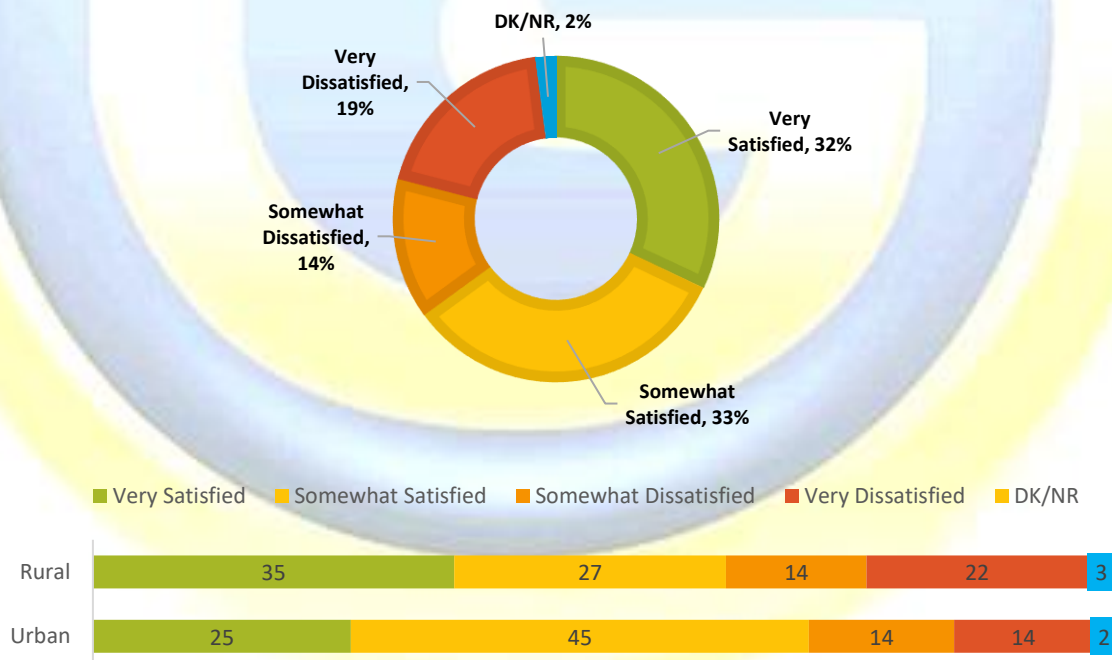

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, Nearly 2 in 3 (65%) Pakistanis are satisfied (very/somewhat) with the initiatives taken by Prime Minister Imran Khan's government to tackle Coronavirus.

A representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, *"How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the initiatives taken by PM Imran Khan's government for protection against the deadly effects of Coronavirus?"* In response, 32% were very satisfied, 33% were somewhat satisfied, 14% were somewhat dissatisfied, 19% were very dissatisfied and 3% did not know or did not respond.

Urban-Rural Breakdown: 25% urban respondents reported being very satisfied while 14% reported being very dissatisfied. A higher proportion of rural respondents were both very satisfied (35%) and very dissatisfied (22%) with the government's initiatives to prevent Coronavirus.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,256 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 11 – March 18, 2020. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
