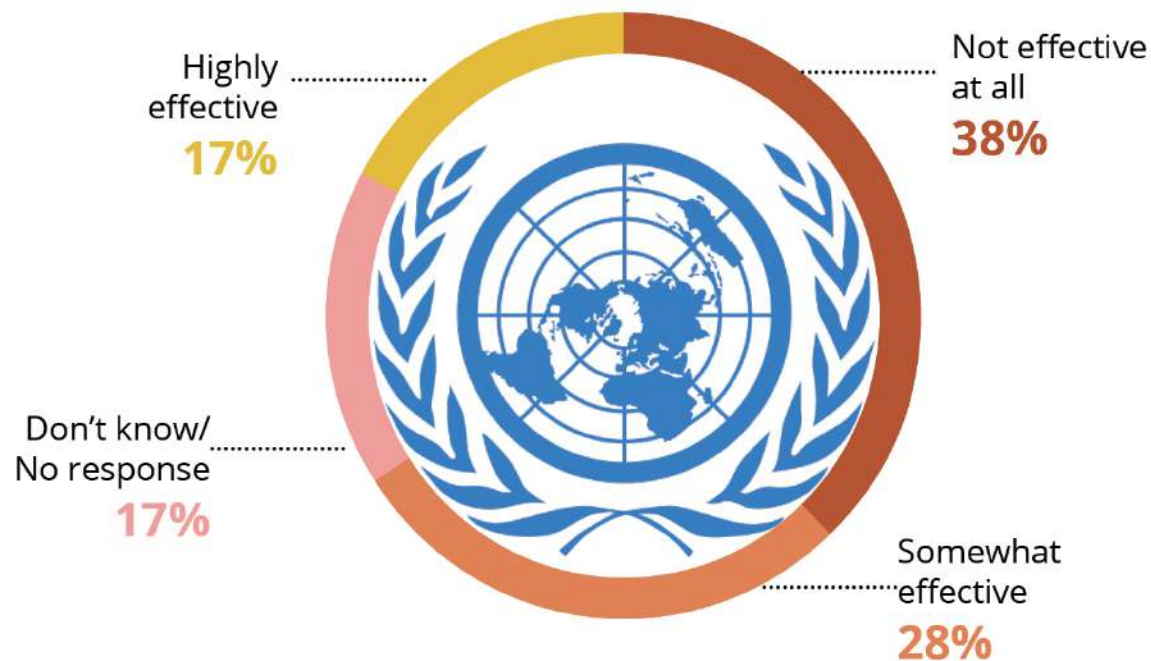

Nearly 2 in 5 (38%) Pakistanis believe that the United Nations has been ineffective in maintaining peace (Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Poll)

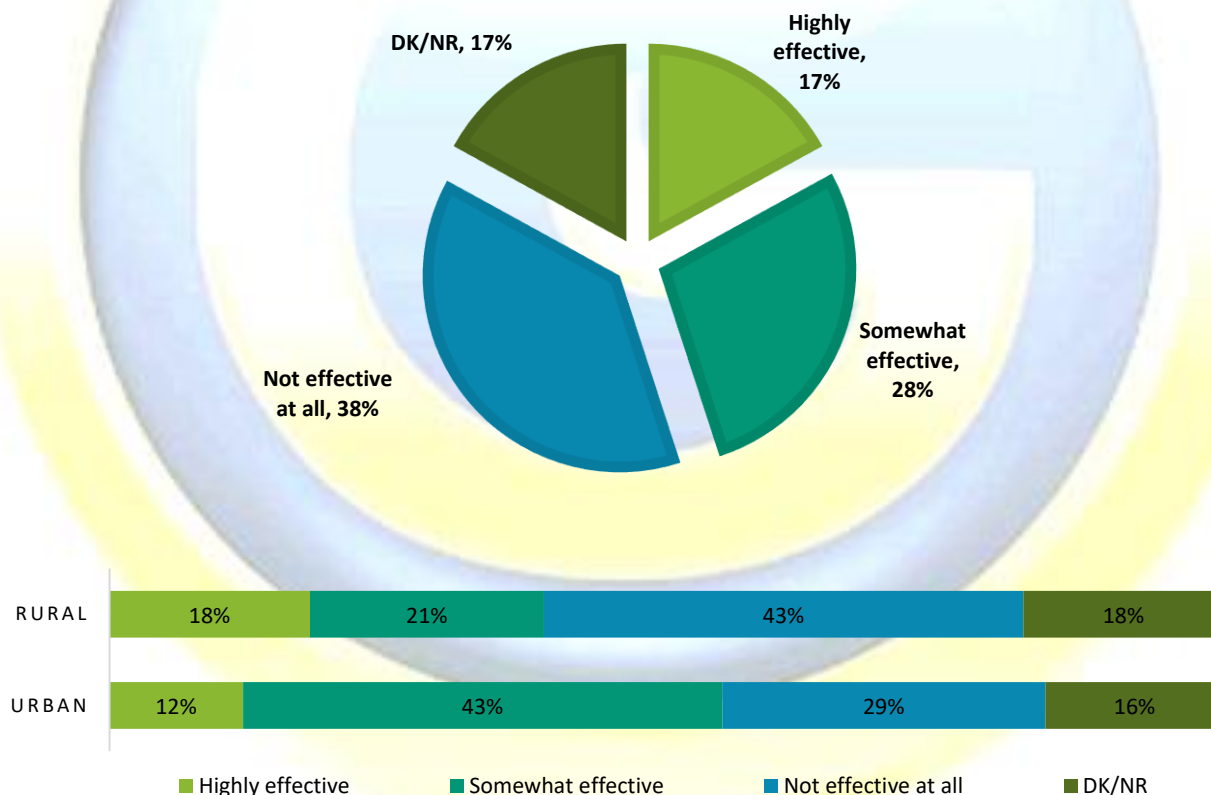

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 2 in 5 (38%) Pakistanis believe that the United Nations has been ineffective in maintaining peace.

A representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “*In your opinion, how effective has the United Nations been in keeping peace?*” In response, 17% said highly effective, 28% said somewhat effective, 38% said not at all effective and 17% did not know or did not respond.

Urban-Rural Breakdown: 14% more rural than urban respondents believe that the United Nations has been ineffective in maintaining peace.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,256 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 11 – March 18, 2020. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
