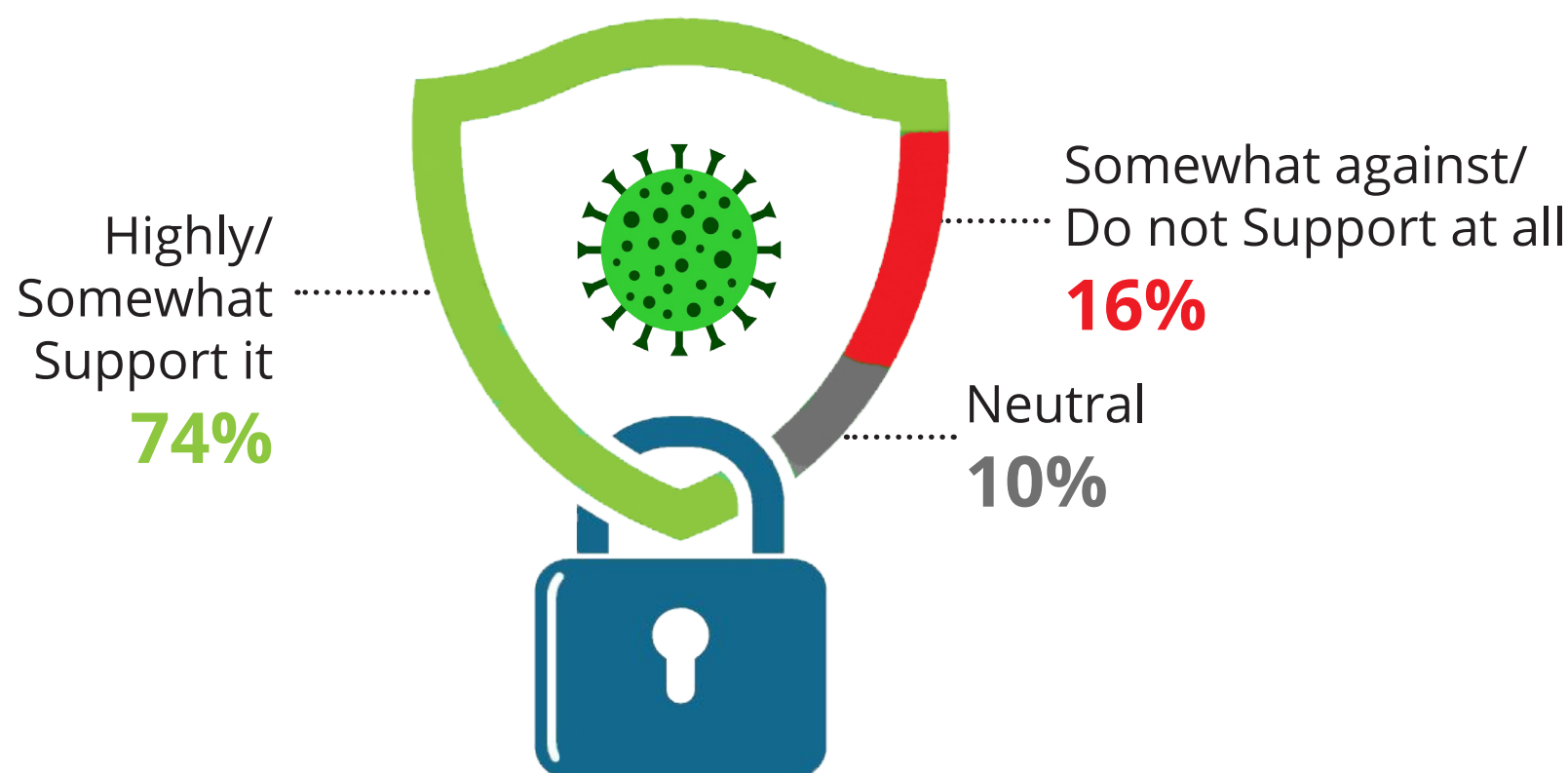

RISING BY 6%, NEARLY 3 IN 4 PAKISTANIS (74%) NOW SUPPORT THE LOCKDOWN AND FEEL THAT IT IS A NECESSARY MEASURE FOR HEALTH AND SAFETY

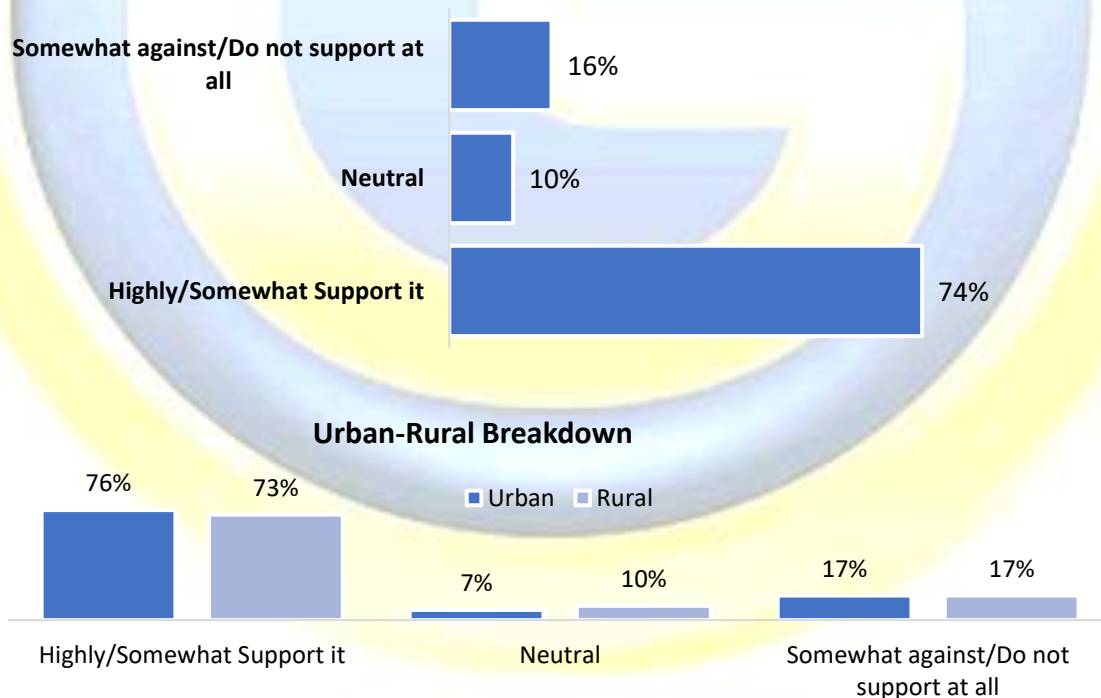

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 3 in 4 Pakistanis (74%) now support the lockdown and feel that it is a necessary measure for health and safety.

A representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked *“Some people support lockdowns and say it is important for health and others think lockdown is bad and should be reduced or removed. To what extent do you support this lockdown?”* In response, 74% said they highly/somewhat support the lockdown, 10% said they are neutral about it while 16% expressed that they are somewhat/highly unsupportive of the lockdown.

Rural-Urban Breakdown: A greater proportion of urban (76%) than rural Pakistanis support lockdowns (73%).

Question: “Some people support lock downs and say it is important for health and others think lockdown is bad and should be reduced or removed. To what extent do you support this lockdown?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,014 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 04 – April 10, 2020. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
