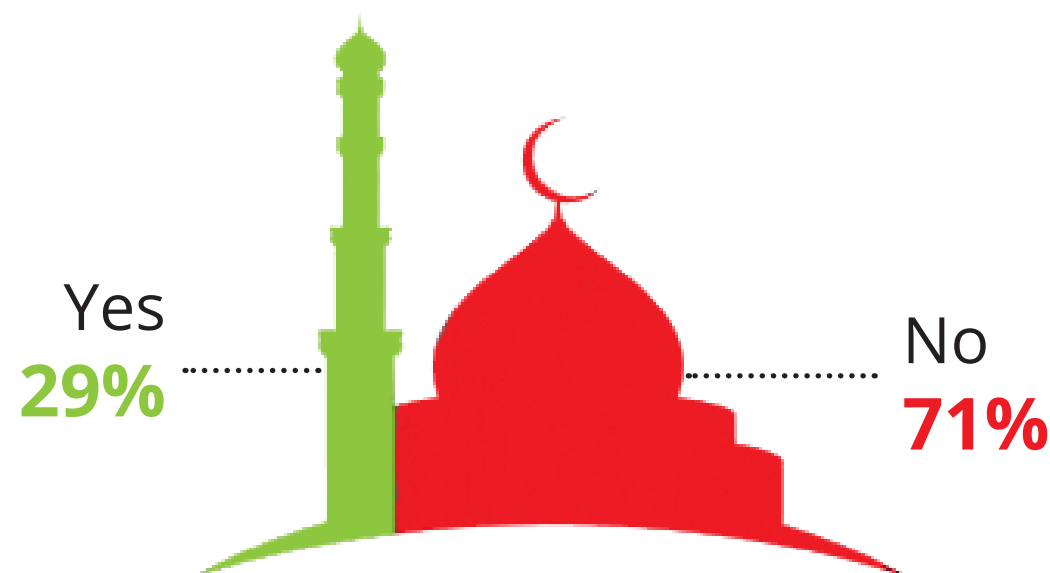

**DECLINING BY 23% SINCE MARCH, NEARLY 1 IN 3 (29%) PAKISTANIS
CONTINUE TO REPORT THAT A MALE FAMILY MEMBER HAS VISITED
THE MOSQUE FOR FRIDAY PRAYERS**

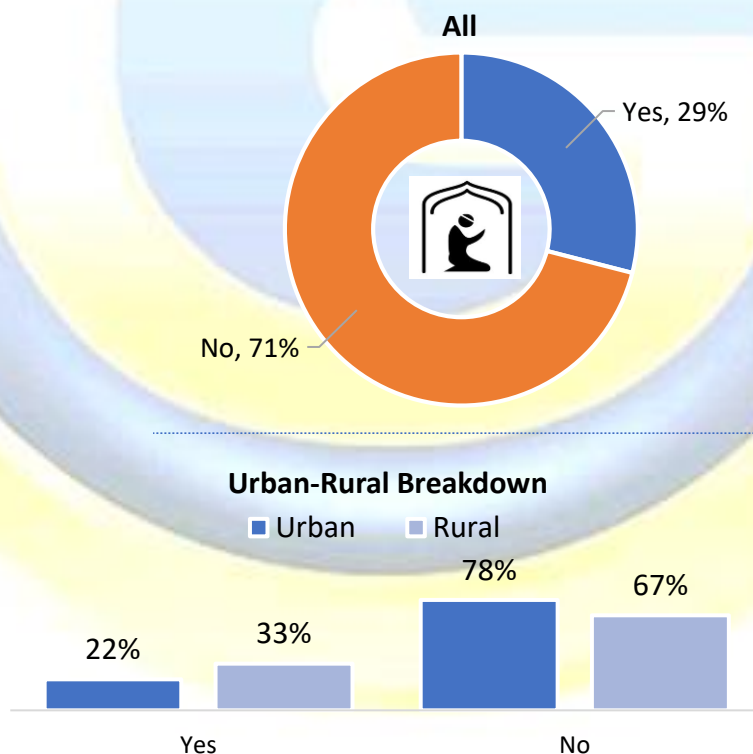
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, declining by 23% since March, nearly 1 in 3 (29%) Pakistanis continue to report that a male family member has visited the mosque for Friday prayers.

A representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, ***“Did any male member of your household go for Friday prayers last Friday?”*** In response, 71% disagreed and said that no male member from their household went to attend Friday prayers in the mosque during Covid-19 while 29% reported that a male member from their family did continue to go to the mosque for Jummah prayers.

Urban-Rural Breakdown: Rural residents are more likely to say that their family member offered their Friday prayers in a mosque during COVID-19

22% urban residents in Pakistan claimed that a male family member went to attend Friday prayers in a mosque during coronavirus as compared to a higher 33% in the rural areas that claimed the same

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,014 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 04 – April 10, 2020. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
