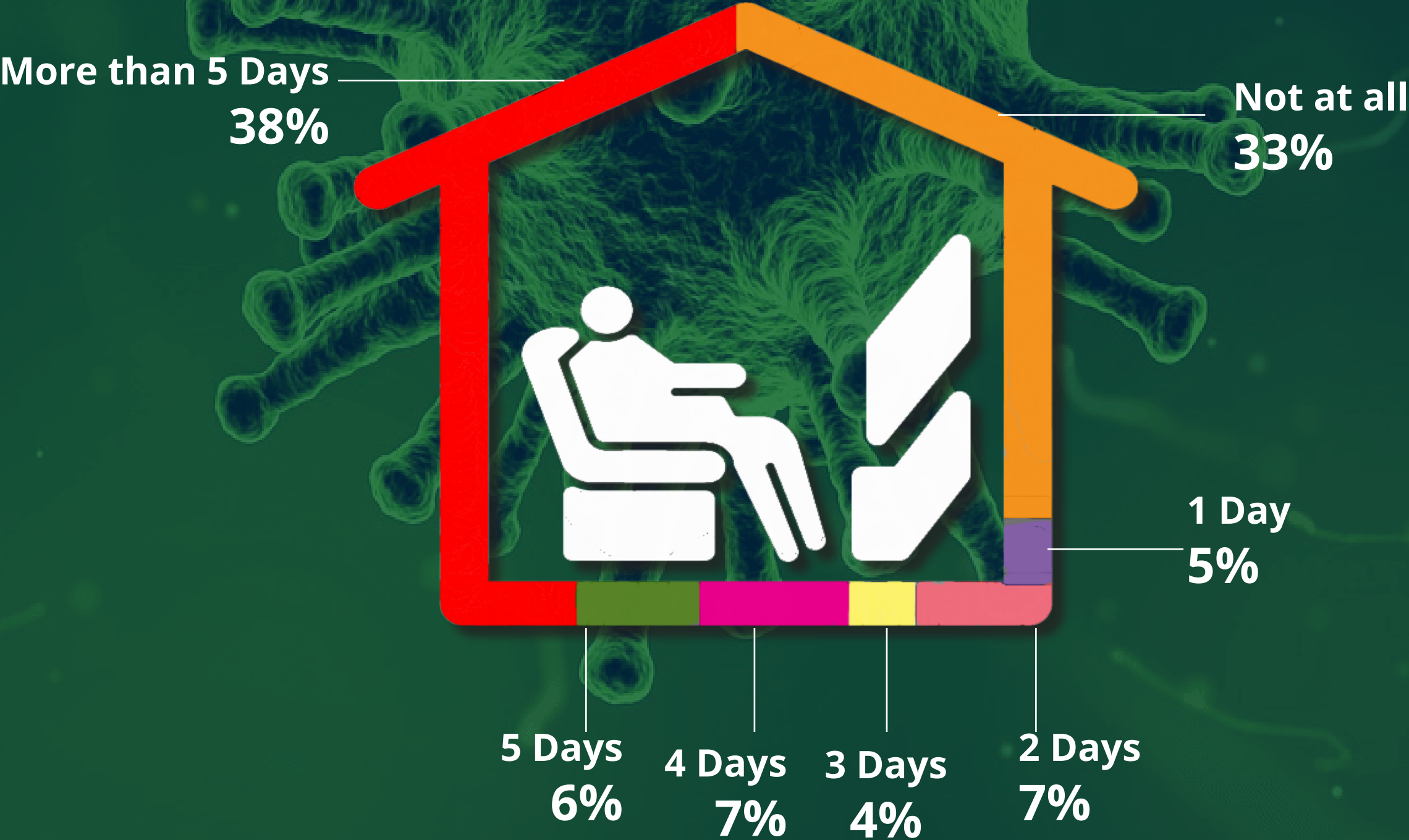


38% PAKISTANIS REPORT THEY HAVE STAYED AT HOME AND LIMITED THEIR SOCIAL INTERACTIONS FOR OVER 5 DAYS IN THE PAST WEEK (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN WEEKLY CORONAVIRUS PERCEPTION TRACKER)

CORONAVIRUS**38% Pakistanis report they have stayed at home and limited their social interactions for over 5 days in the past week (Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Weekly Coronavirus Perception Tracker)**

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 38% Pakistanis report they have stayed at home and limited their social interactions for over 5 days in the past week.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“In the past 7 days, for how many days, have you stayed at home all day, without going out at all and without receiving any visitors/guests?”* In response to this question, 33% said they have not been socially distant at all, 5% said one day, 7% say two days, 4% say three days, 7% said four days, 6% said five days and the highest 38% claimed they had been socially distant for more than 5 days.

Urban Rural Breakdown: Higher proportion of Pakistanis from urban areas claim to be practicing social distancing

42% of the total respondents from the urban areas said they had been socially distant for more than five days while a lower 35% rural respondents claimed the same.

Provincial Breakdown: Highest proportion of respondents from Punjab claim to have remained socially distant for more than five days, closely followed by Balochistan

45% from Punjab, 43% from Balochistan. 31% from Sindh and only 16% from KP claim they have remained at home and limited their social interactions for more than five days in the past week

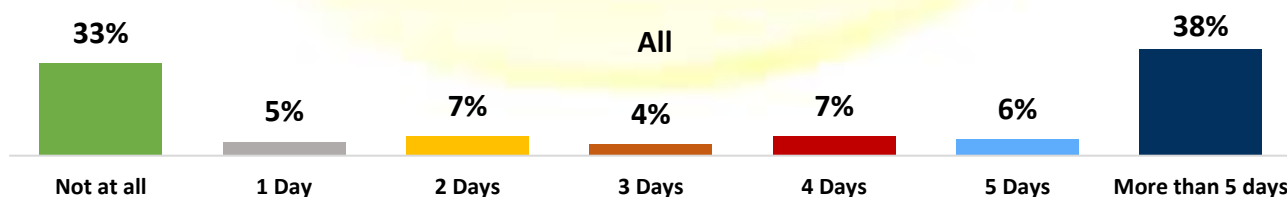
Age Breakdown: Respondents over the age of 50 most likely to be obeying social distancing rules

Out of the total respondents claiming to have stayed home for more than 5 days, 33% were under 30 years, 35% were between ages 30 and 39, 42% were between 40 to 49 and the highest 53% were over the age of 50.

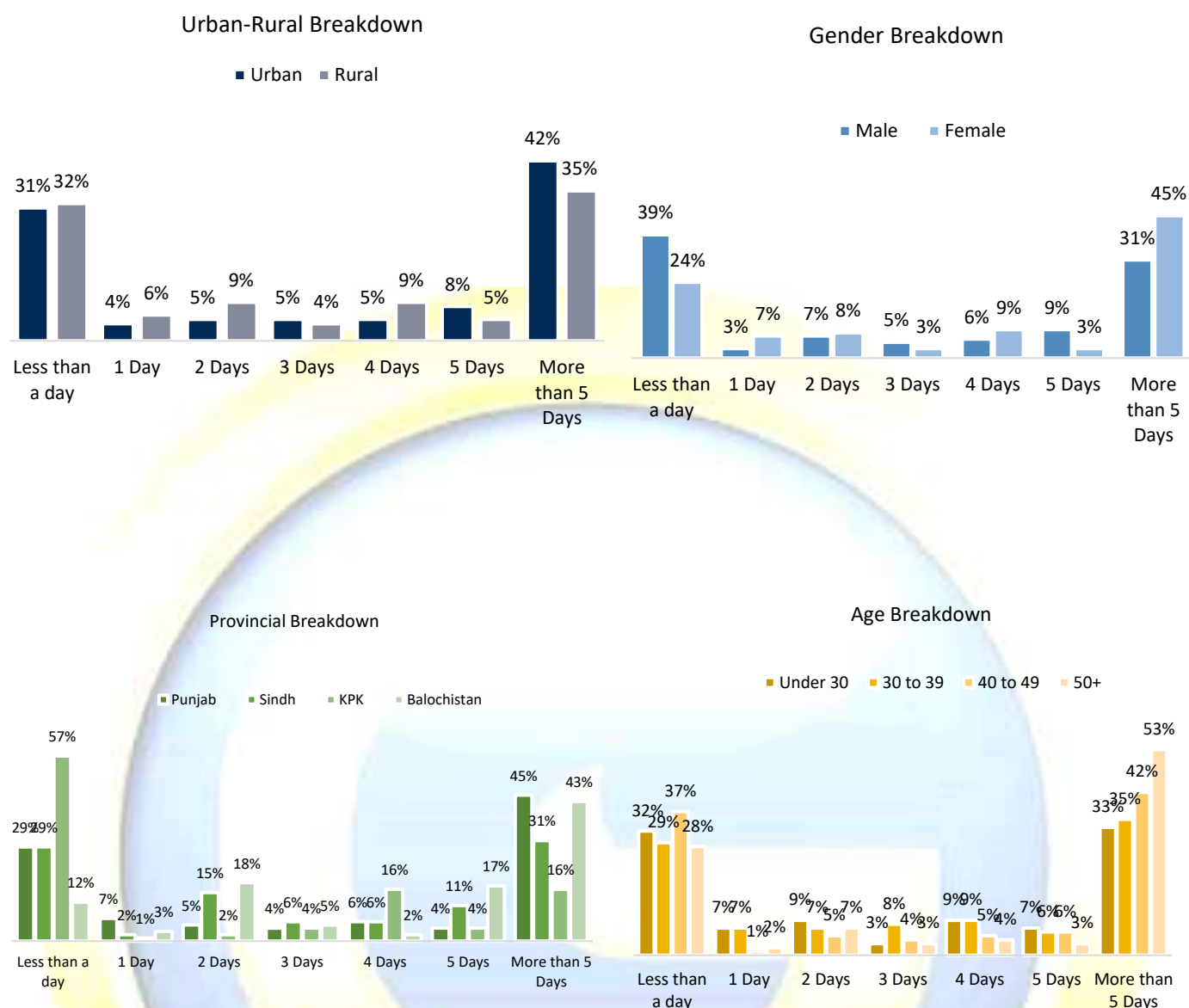
Gender Breakdown: Females much more likely than males to be limiting social interactions

45% of female respondents and 31% of male respondents claim they have remained at home and limited social interaction for more than five days in the past week.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,500 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 14 – April 24, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 4. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
