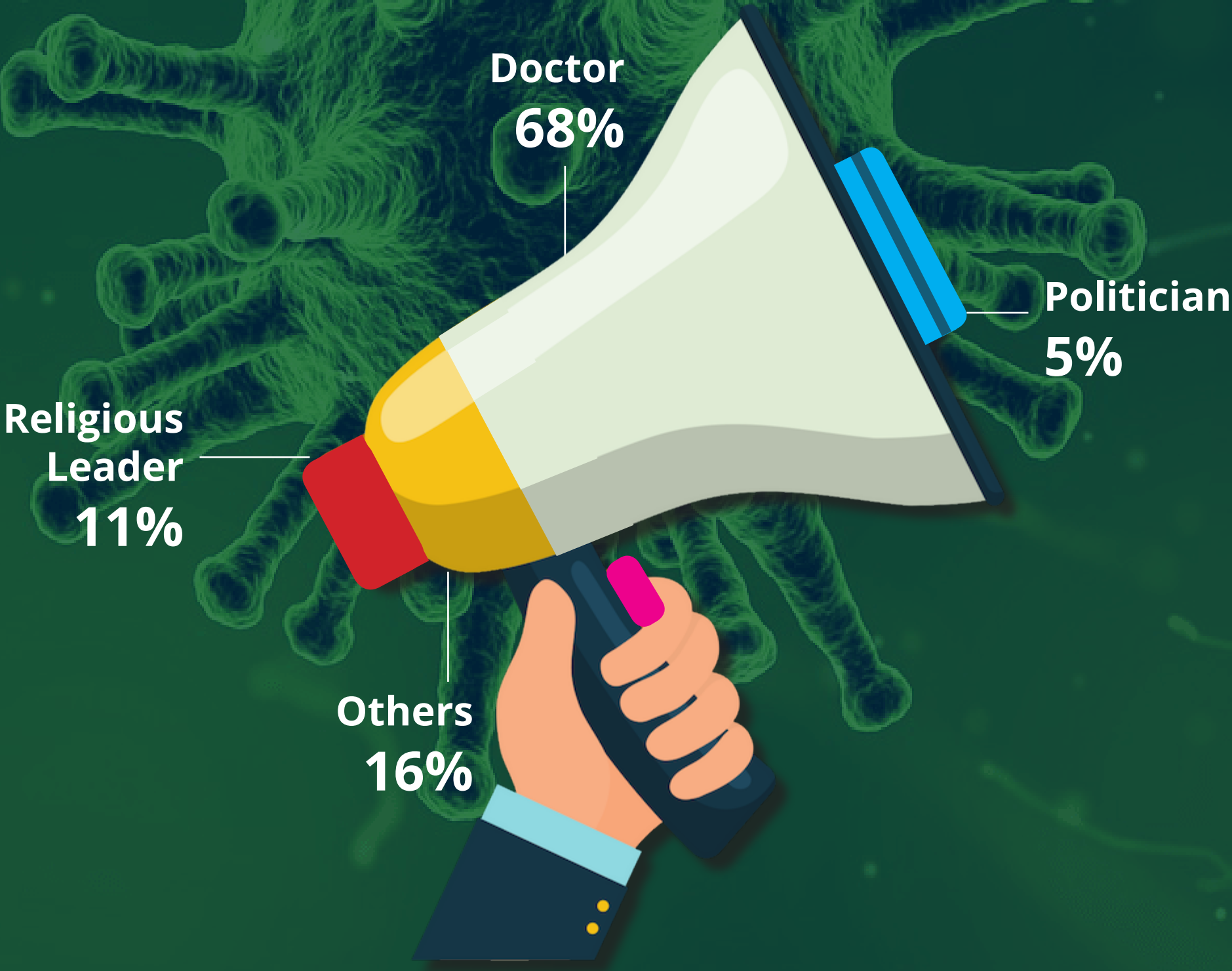


68% PAKISTANIS CONSIDER A DOCTOR’S ADVICE MOST TRUSTWORTHY WITH REGARDS TO INFORMATION ON CORONAVIRUS. ONLY 5% SAY POLITICIANS (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN WEEKLY CORONAVIRUS PERCEPTION TRACKER)

**CORONAVIRUS****68% Pakistanis consider a doctor's advice most trustworthy with regards to information on Coronavirus. Only 5% say politicians (Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Weekly Coronavirus Perception Tracker)**

Islamabad, May 18, 2020

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 68% Pakistanis report doctor's advice is most trustworthy with regards to Coronavirus. Only 5% say politicians.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, "*Whose advice would you trust the most relating to Coronavirus?*" In response to this question, 68% respondents said they trust a doctor's advice the most related to Coronavirus, 11% said they trust religious leaders, 5% said they trust politicians and 16% said they trust others related to Coronavirus.

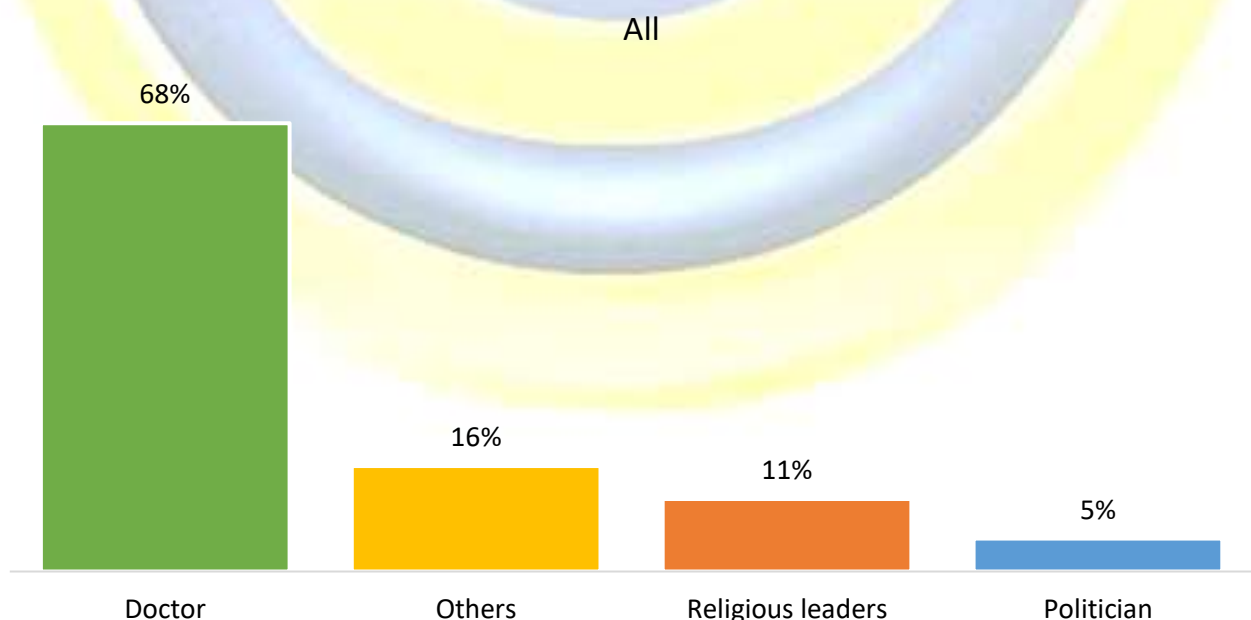
**Gender Breakdown: Significantly more females say they trust a doctor as compared to males**

Out of the total respondents, 62% males they said they would trust a doctor's advice the most while 73% females said the same. An equal 5% from both genders said they would trust a politician's advice the most. 9% males and 13% females said they would trust the advice of a religious leader.

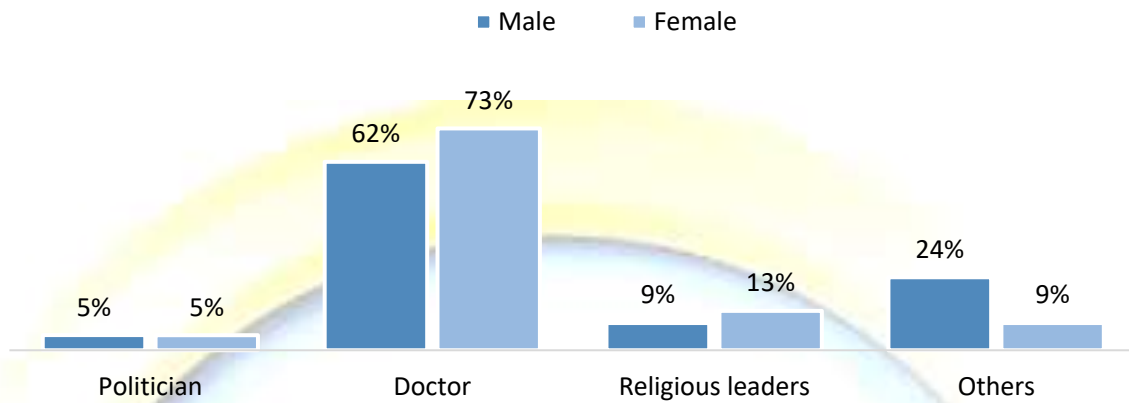
**Age Breakdown: Respondents in the 30 to 39 age cohort most likely to trust a doctor's advice**

Out of the total respondents under the age of 30, 65% said they would trust a doctor's advice, 16% said they would trust a religious leaders advice, 4% would trust politicians and 15% chose others. Between ages 30 to 39, highest 73% said they would trust a doctor, 9% chose religious leaders, 12% chose others and 6% said they would trust politicians.

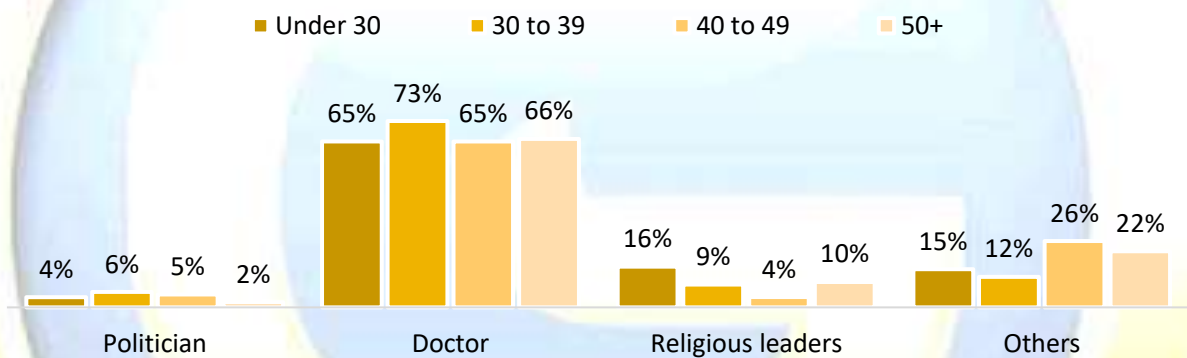
**Question: "Whose advice would you trust the most relating to Coronavirus?"**

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,500 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 14 – April 24, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 4. The error margin is estimated to be approximately  $\pm 3$  percent at the 95% confidence level.
