

NEAR EQUAL SPLIT IN PAKISTANI PUBLIC OPINION OVER THE WORLD RETURNING TO ITS PRE-CRISIS STATE AFTER THE PANDEMIC ENDS, SIMILAR TO GLOBAL AVERAGE

Near equal split in Pakistani public opinion over the world returning to its pre-crisis state after the pandemic ends, similar to global average (Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Weekly Coronavirus Perception Tracker)

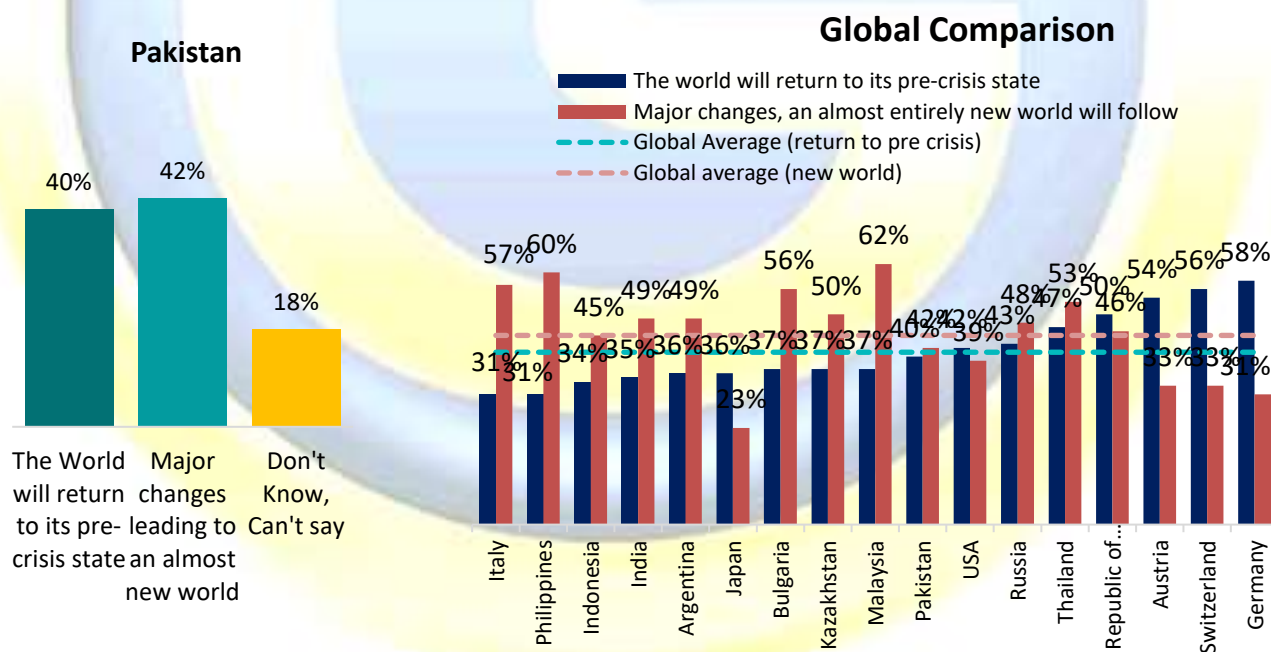
Islamabad, May 04, 2020

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, there is a near equal split in Pakistani public opinion over the world returning to its pre-crisis state after the pandemic ends, similar to global average.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question: *“Do you believe that when the pandemic is over the world will return more or less to its pre-crisis state or do you expect major changes to follow, an almost entirely new world?”* In response to this question, 40% Pakistanis believe that the world will return to its pre-crisis state, similar 42% believe that major changes will lead to an almost new world while 18% don't know/cannot say.

Global result: Respondents from Italy and Philippines (31%) are least hopeful about the world returning to its pre-crisis state after the pandemic is over. Pakistan ranks 10th out of 17 countries in terms of hope.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,014 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 04 – April 10, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 3. Gallup International conducted international fieldwork in a study comprised internationally of 24,652 respondents covering different ethnicities, regions, religions, age and gender. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
