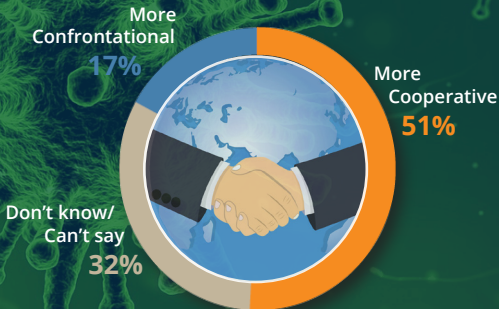


OVER 1 IN 2 PAKISTANIS (51%) ARE OPTIMISTIC ABOUT THE RELATIONS BETWEEN MAJOR WORLD POWERS BECOMING MORE COOPERATIVE AFTER THE COVID-19 CRISIS, RANKING 6TH OUT OF 17 COUNTRIES REGARDING HOPEFULNESS

Over 1 in 2 Pakistanis (51%) are optimistic about the relations between major world powers becoming more cooperative after the COVID-19 crisis, ranking 6th out of 17 countries regarding hopefulness (Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Weekly Coronavirus Perception Tracker)

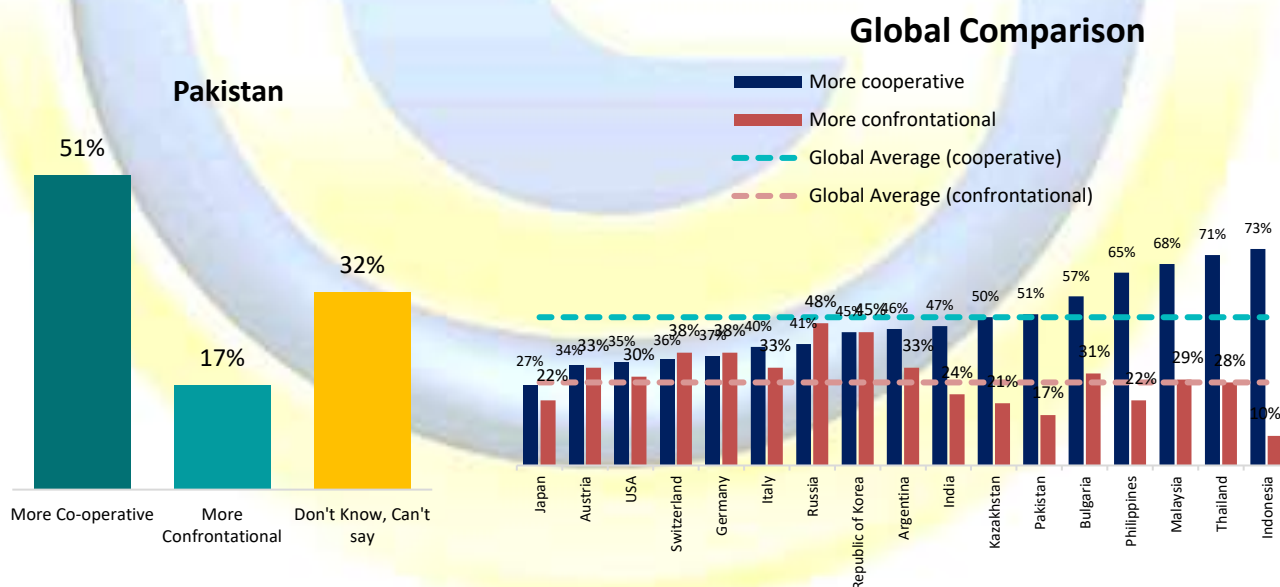

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, Over 1 in 2 Pakistanis (51%) are optimistic about the relations between major world powers becoming more cooperative after the COVID-19 crisis, ranking 6th out of 17 countries regarding hopefulness.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question: *“Do you expect the relations between the major world powers after the crisis to become more cooperative or more confrontational?”* In response to this question, 51% Pakistanis said they believe that relations between major world powers will become more cooperative, 17% believe they will become more confrontational while 32% say they don’t know/cannot say.

Global result: Respondents from Thailand & Indonesia are the most optimistic about relations between major world powers becoming more cooperative after the COVID-19 crisis. Russians & Koreans expect more confrontations. Pakistan ranks 6th out of 17 countries regarding hopefulness about increasing cooperation.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,014 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 04 – April 10, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 3. Gallup International conducted international fieldwork in a study comprised internationally of 24,652 respondents covering different ethnicities, regions, religions, age and gender. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
