This is a 4th report in a series of reports that Gallup Pakistan has been doing since the start of Coronavirus pandemic in Pakistan in early March.

The field dates for each wave are given below:

TRACKER WAVE 1: March 1st to March 8th, 2020

TRACKER WAVE 2: March 28th to April 3rd, 2020

TRACKER WAVE 3: April 4th to April 10th, 2020

TRACKER WAVE 4: April 14th to April 24th, 2020

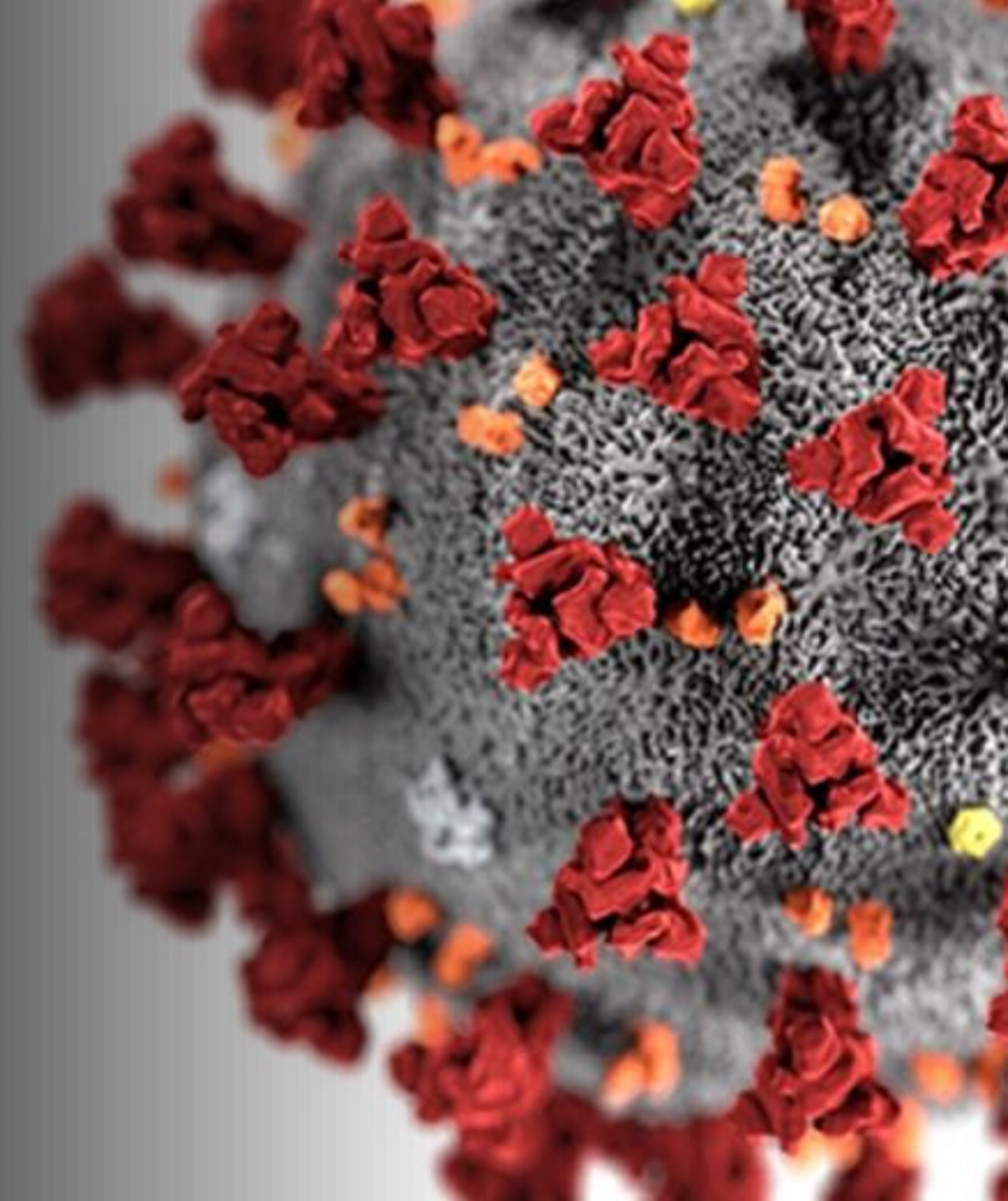
Why is Measuring Perception of Public Important? – 4 Important Reasons

1. **Voice of the people** is currently silenced due to lockdown. We are providing a conduit to policy makers, thinkers and the government in absence of other forums. Public Opinion polling in many parts of the world is considered an essential part and parcel of democracy. We are keeping that tradition alive here in Pakistan.
2. Policy makers need continuous **feedback loop** on successes and failures of their actions. Pakistan is a large country!
3. Corona is a novel virus. The novelty means that much is unknown – rate of transmission, means of transmission etc. Surveys such as ours provide an important **evidence** not just for Pakistan but for the international community.
4. **Impact Assessment** of the damages caused so that actions can be taken to correct and ameliorate. We are looking at **Economic Impact** as well as **Social Impact**.

We hope to provide the voice to the voiceless in the current pandemic!

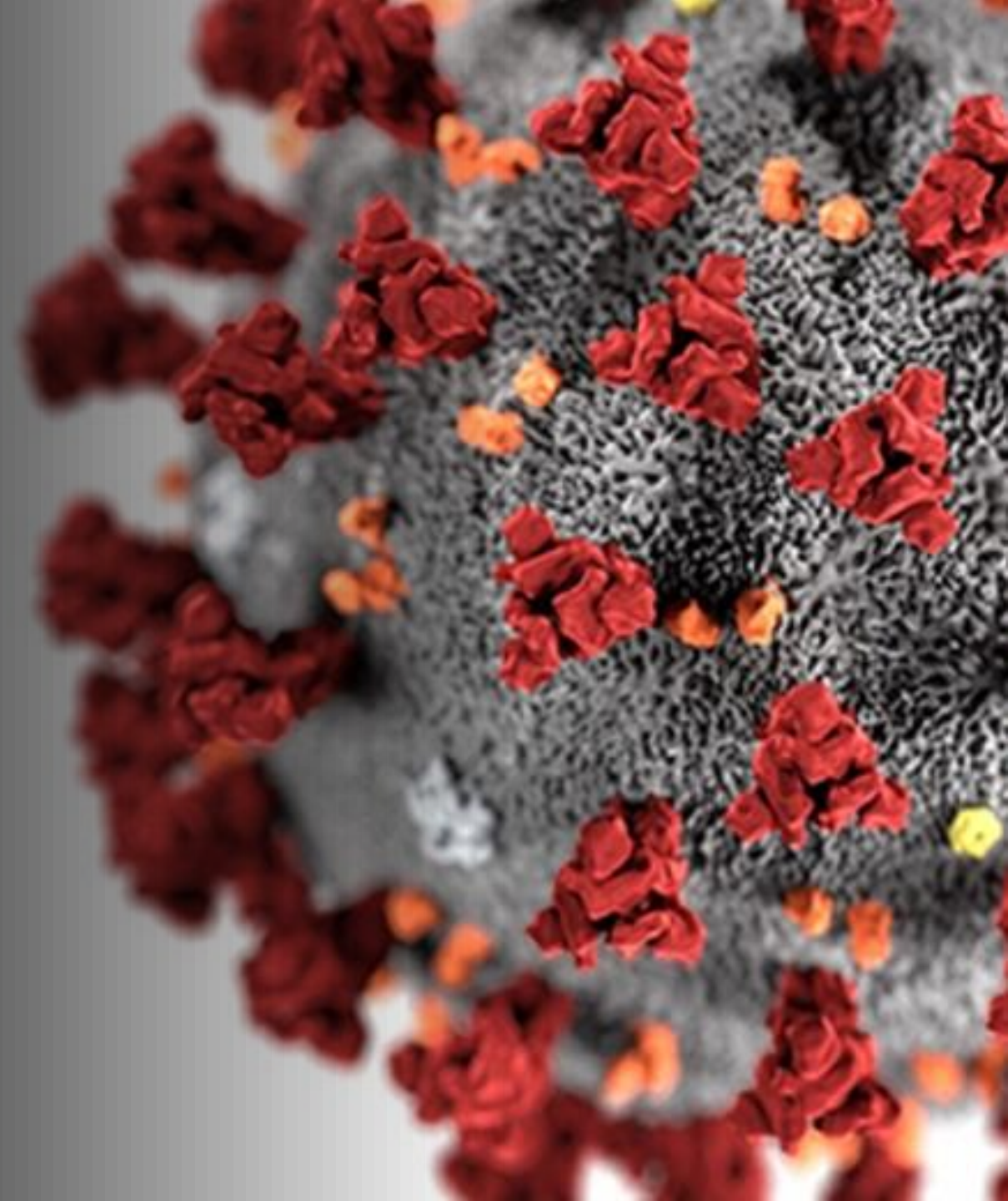

This is reflected in trend data measured by tracking 3 to 4 times during the last 8 weeks

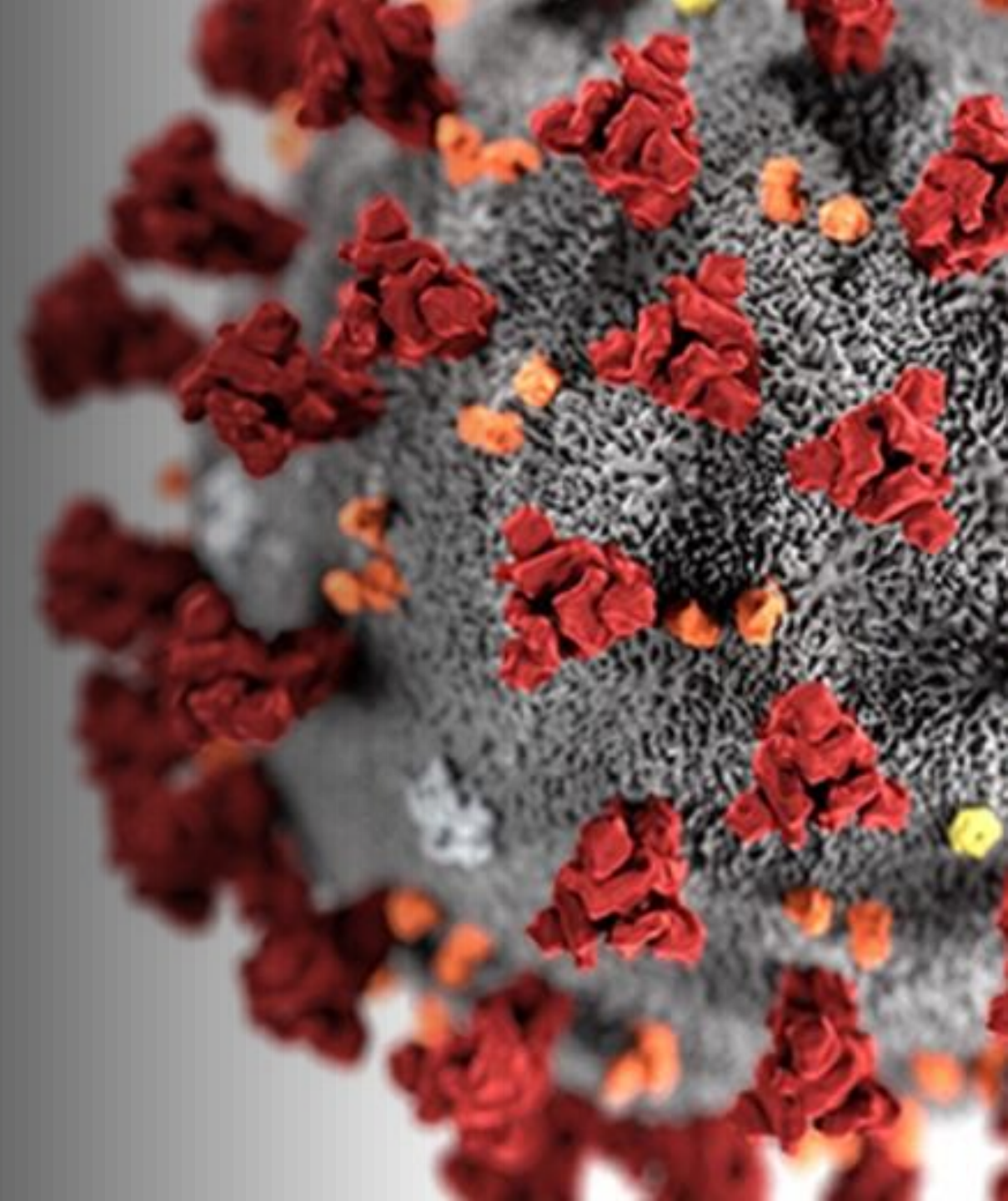

Large numbers are claiming to be taking precautions and significant are mentioning social distancing



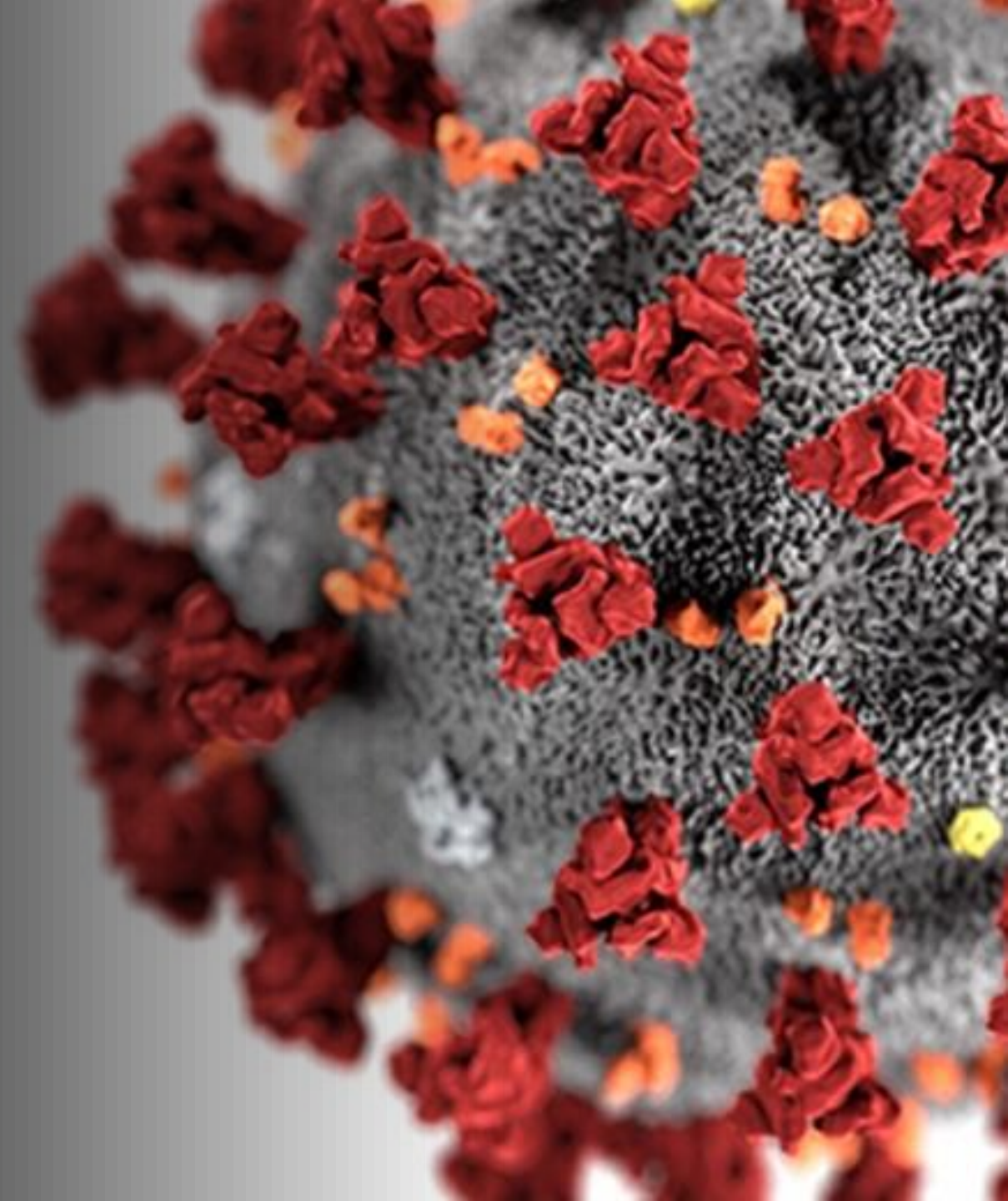

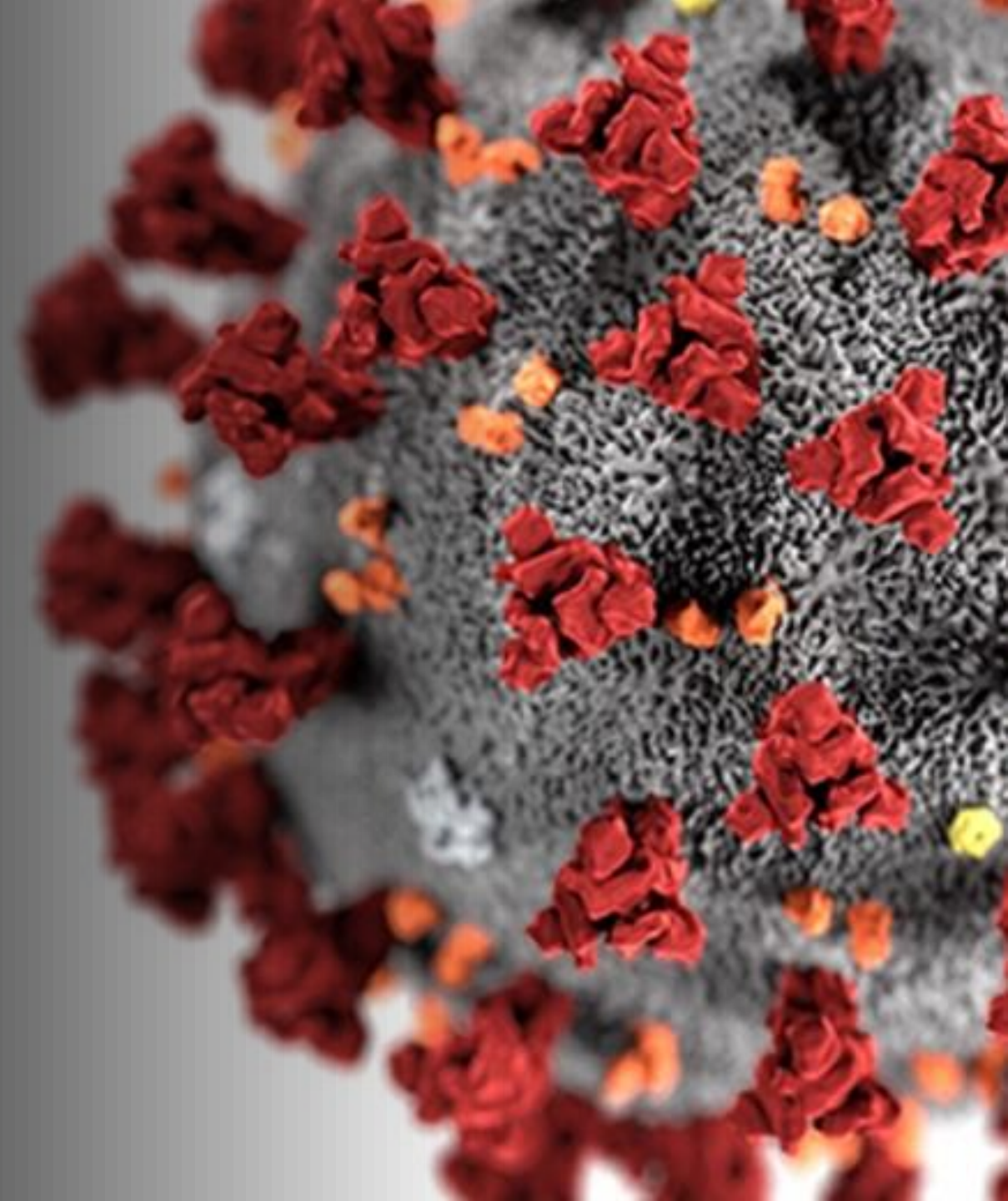
FINDING 7:

Our initial understanding based on the findings of this survey suggests it is not.

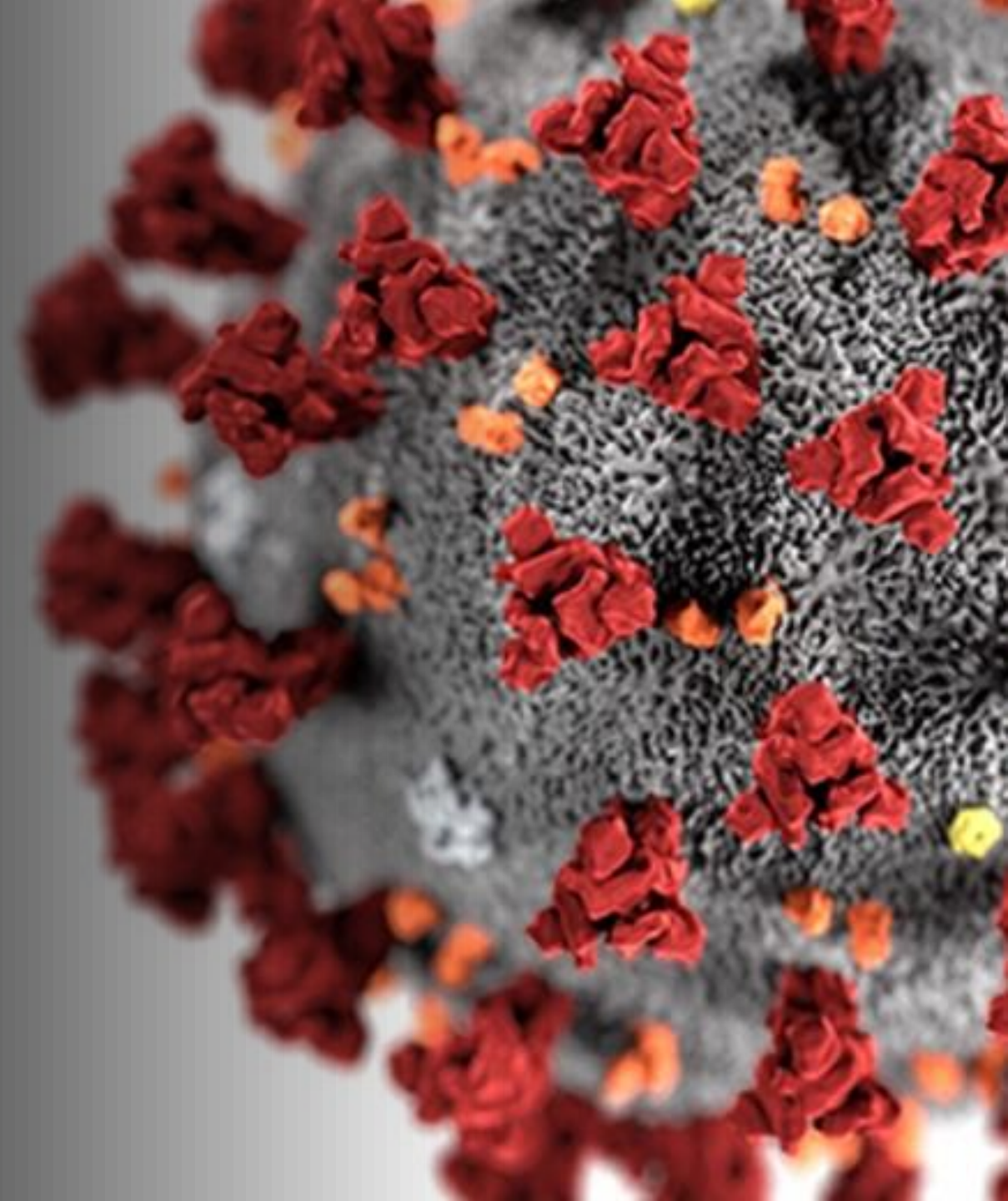
Hence the need for an Early Warning: Riding the crisis by previous formula of macro-management from the top of the pyramid by draining out authority initiative and capacity at the bottom of the pyramid may not work.

The solitary moments during lockdown will be a good time to reflect about rescuing itself from the vicious cycle of dwarfing the authority and capacity of a burgeoning bottom of the pyramid.



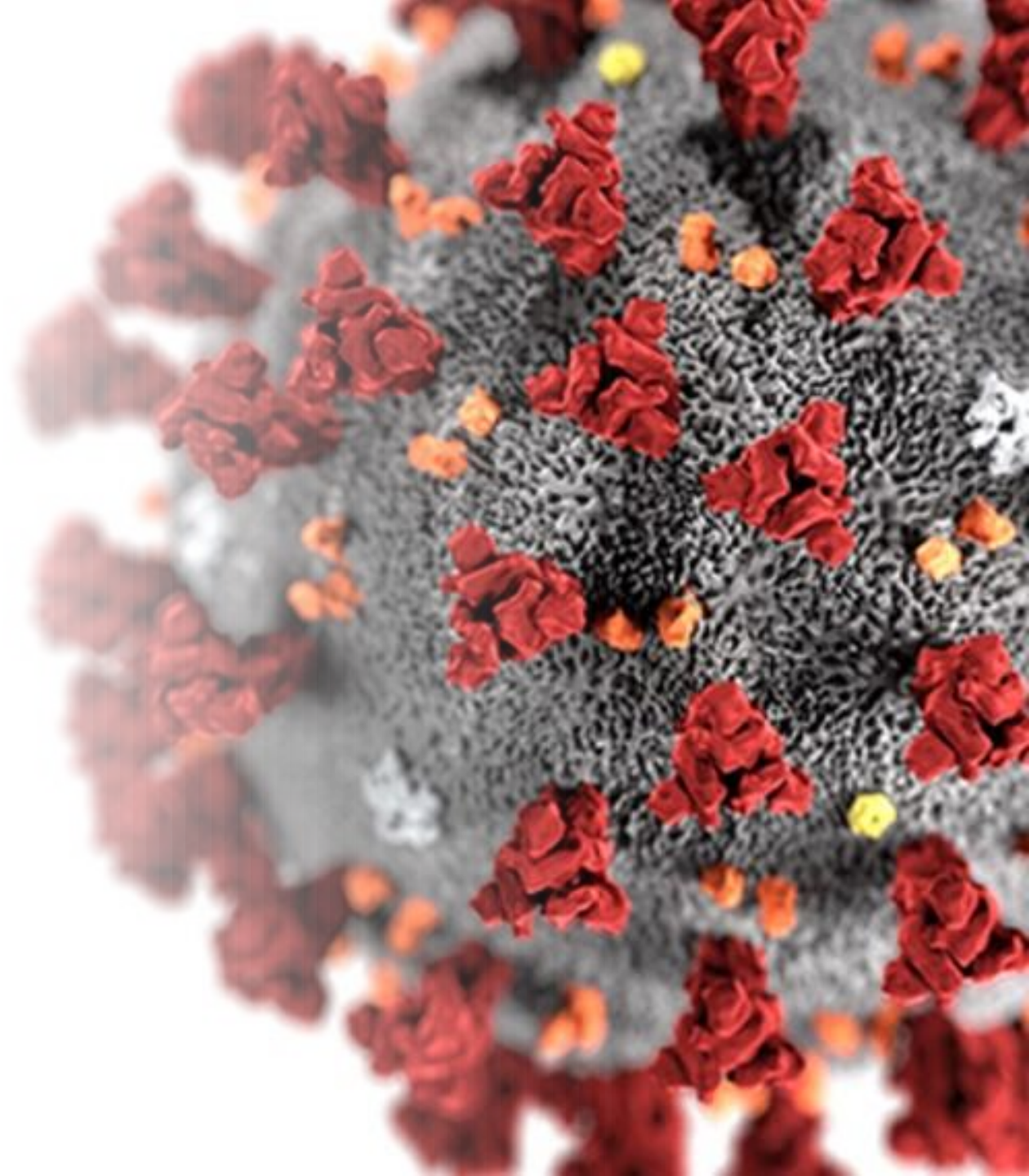

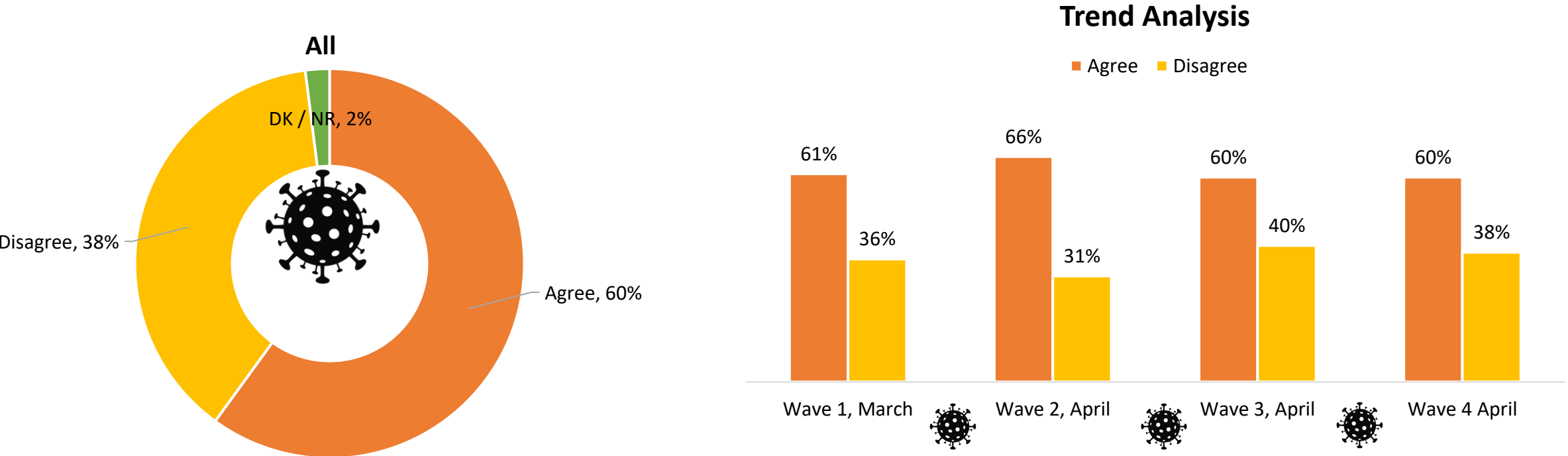

Question: To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement “I am afraid that myself & someone in my household will be infected by Coronavirus”?



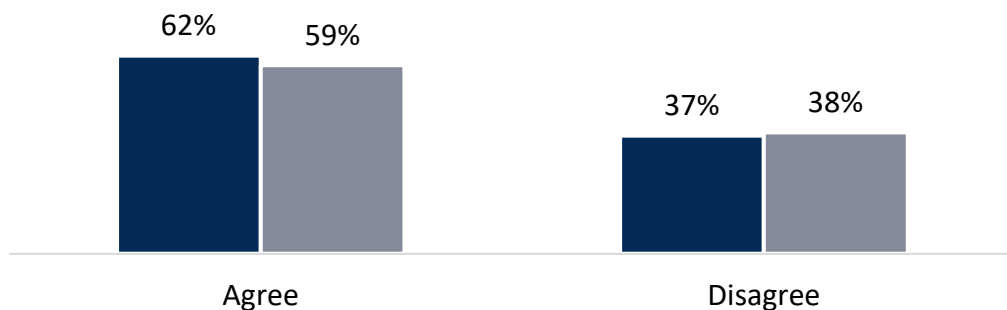
Since March, a consistent rise in fear about self or a family member contracting the coronavirus is observed among respondents from KP and Balochistan.
However Balochistan as compared to other provinces is showing lesser number of concerned individuals pointing to possible need for scaling up communication campaign.

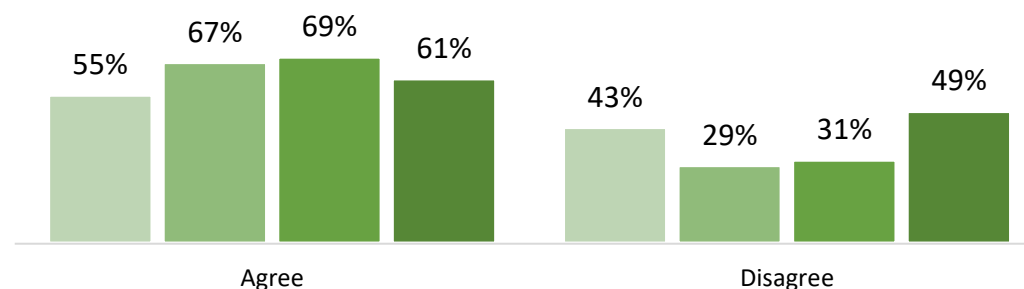

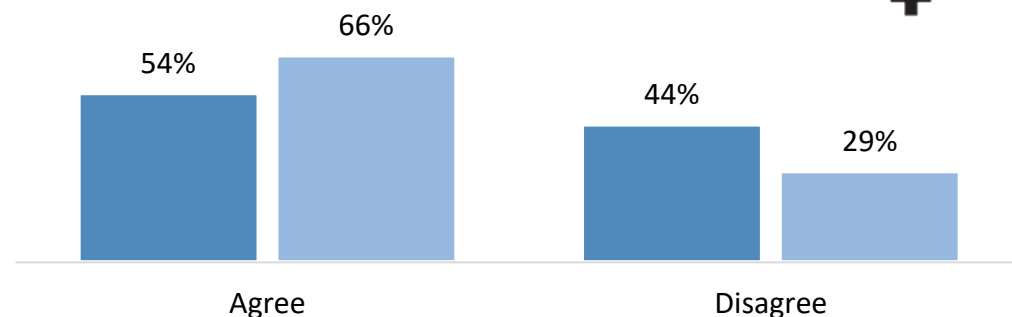

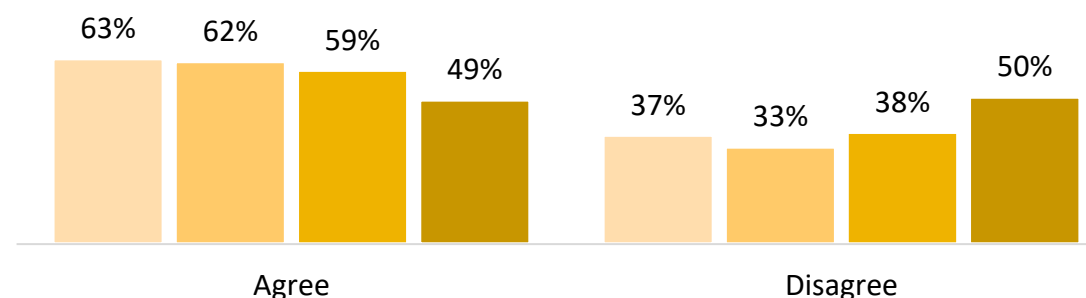

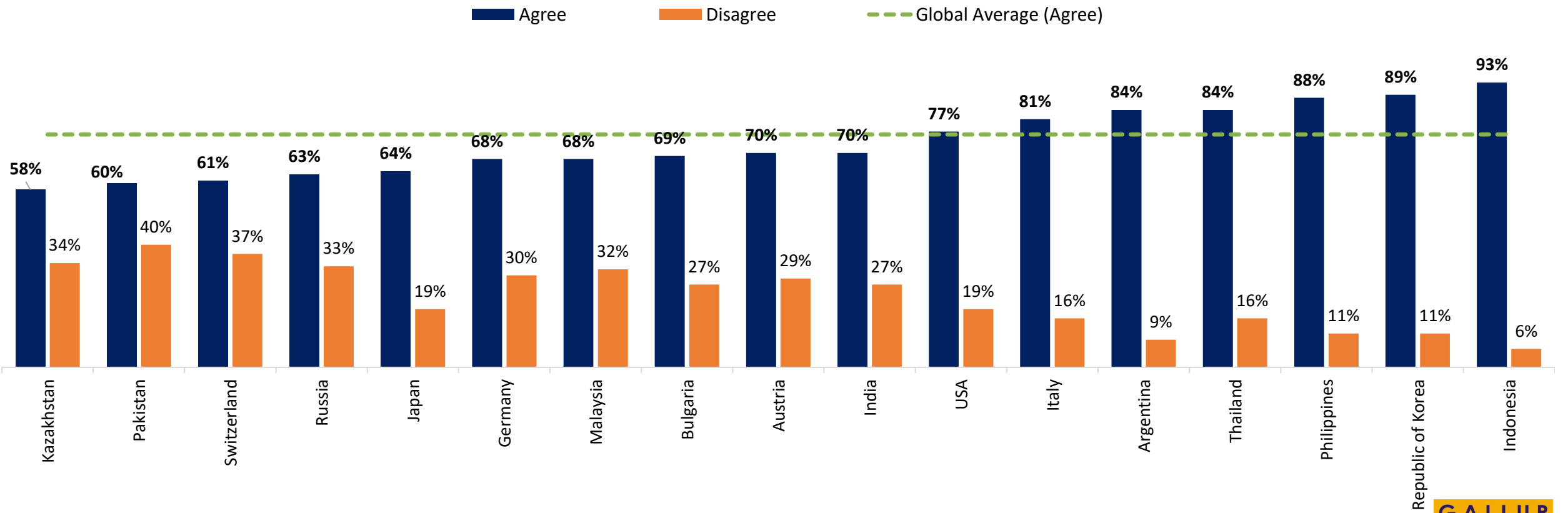

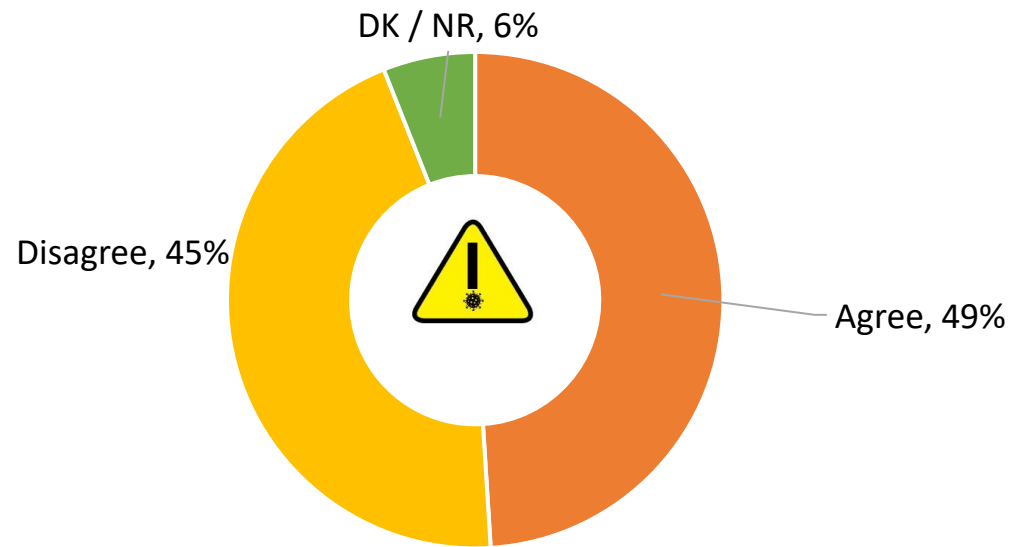

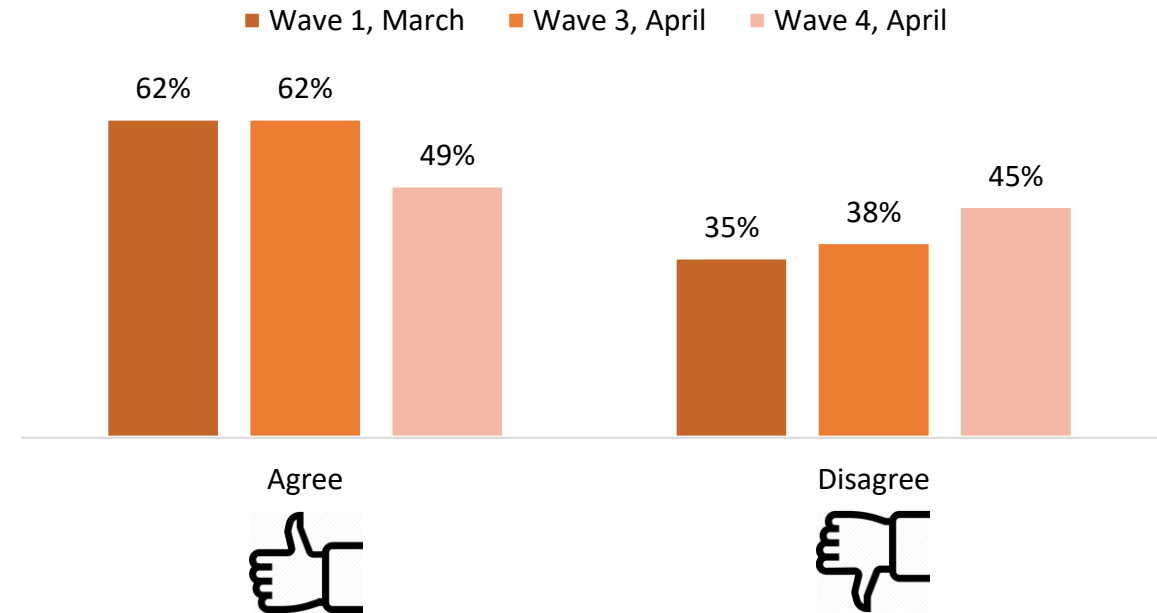

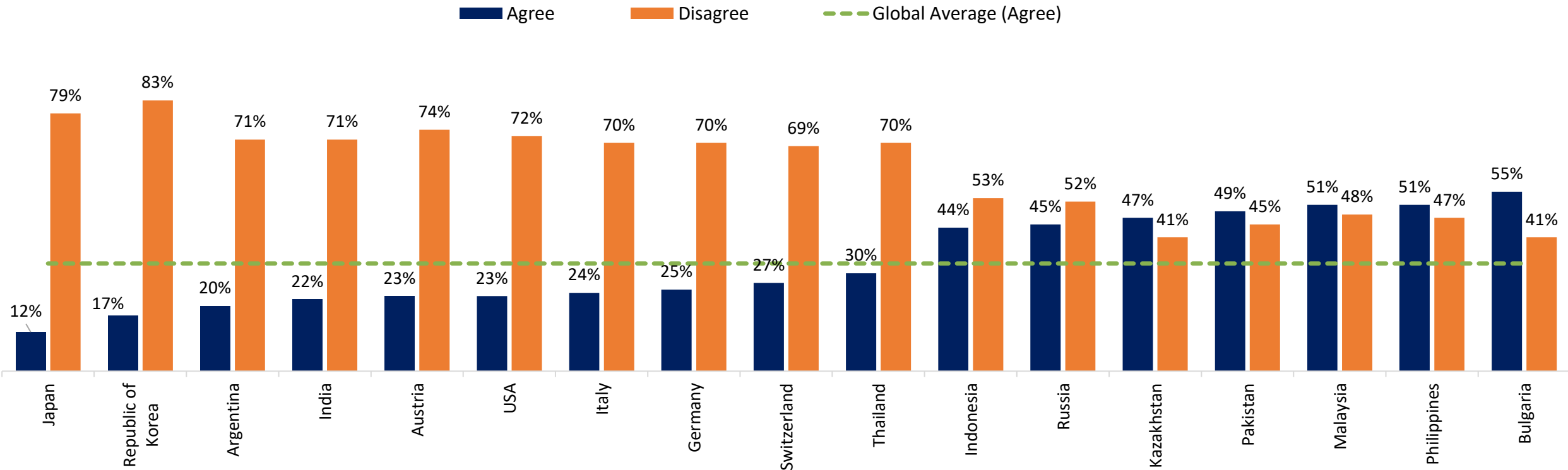

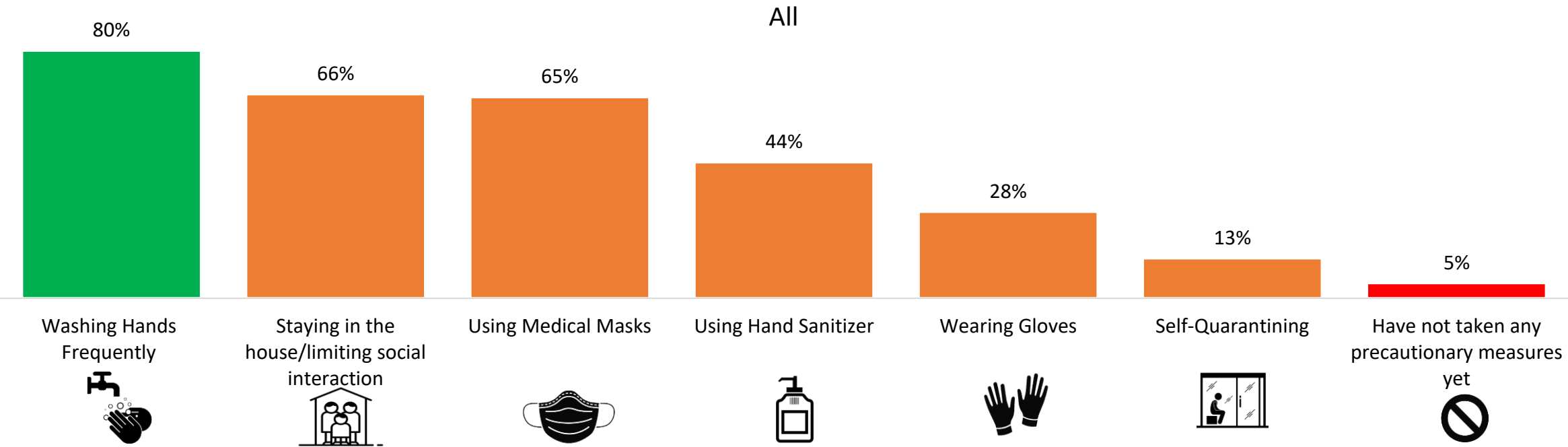

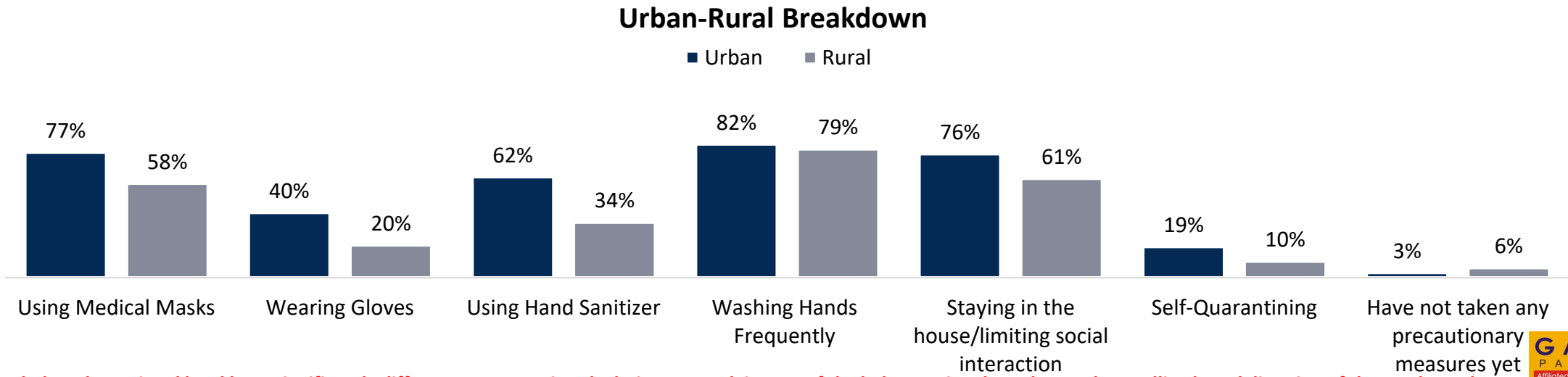
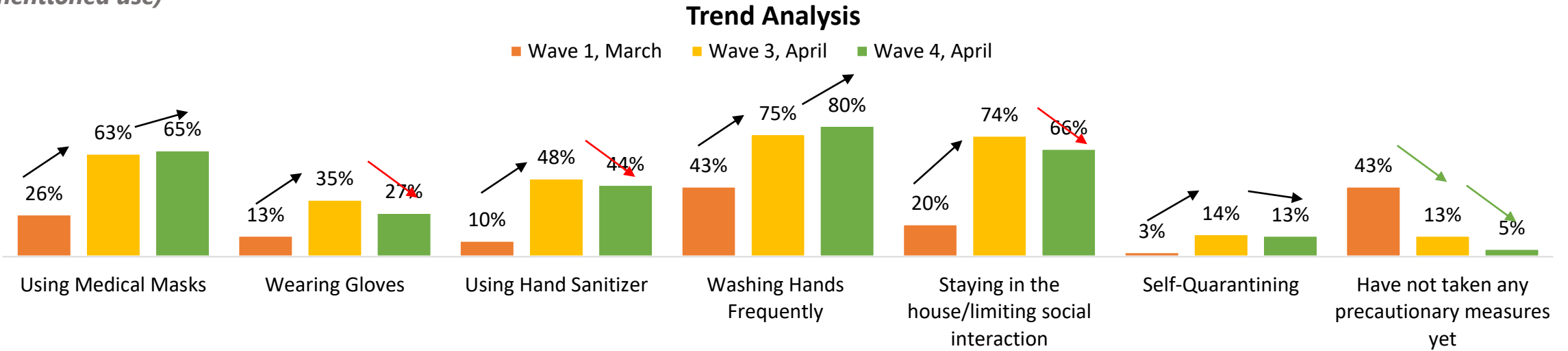


Following a consistent trend since W1, 'Washing Hands Frequently' remains the oft-cited precautionary measure taken across gender, age and provincial. On the other hand, there has been a consistent decline in proportion of respondents who claim not to have taken any precautionary measures yet.

Only 4% of respondents who have heard the entire Coronavirus awareness message a caller tune claim not to have taken any precautionary measures yet.

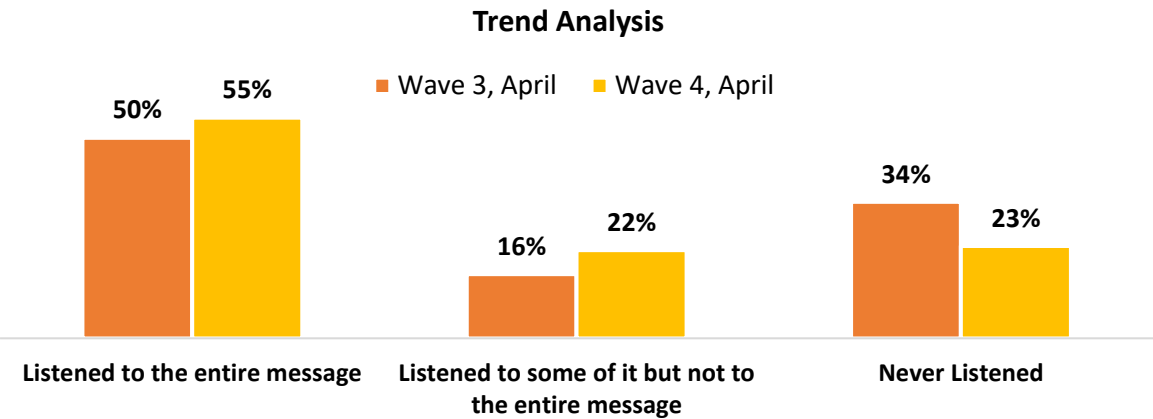
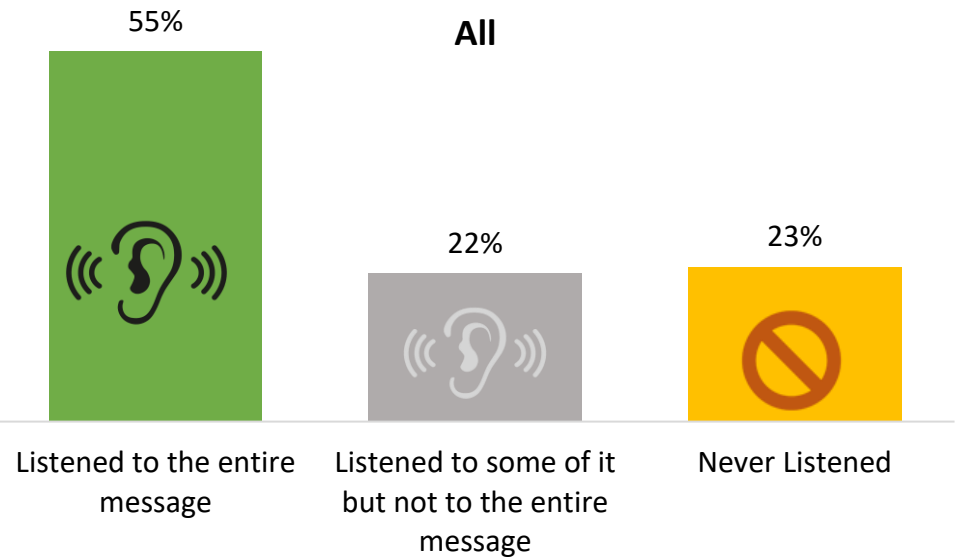

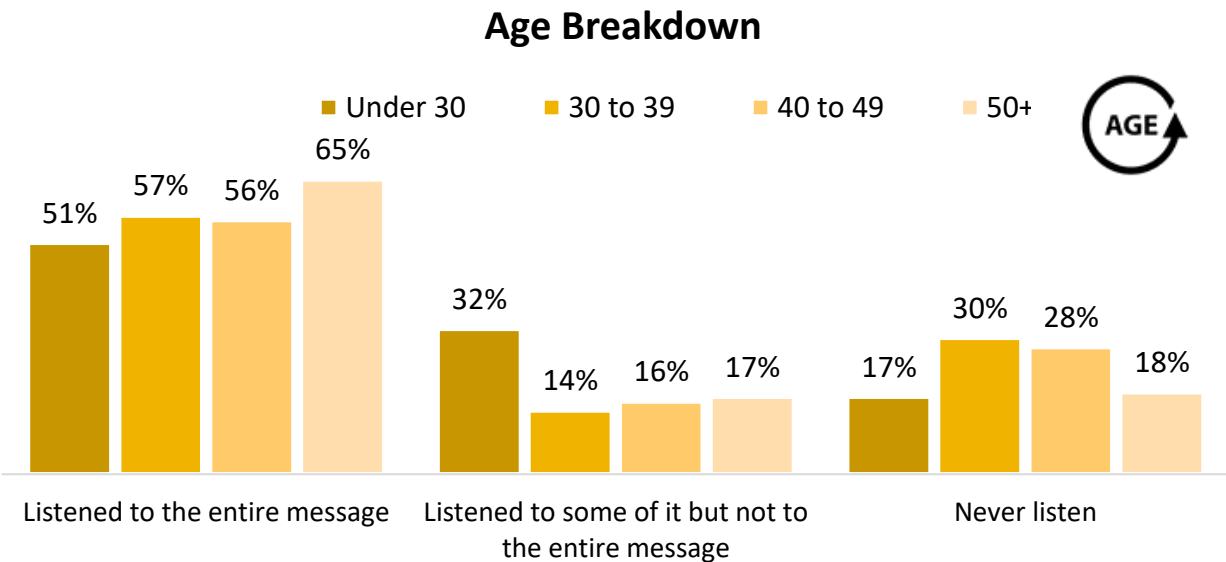

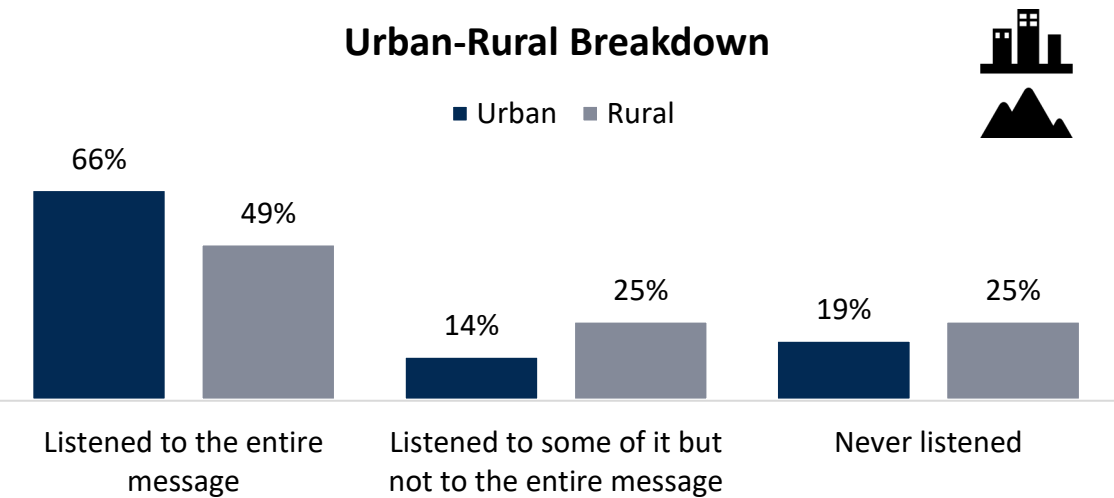

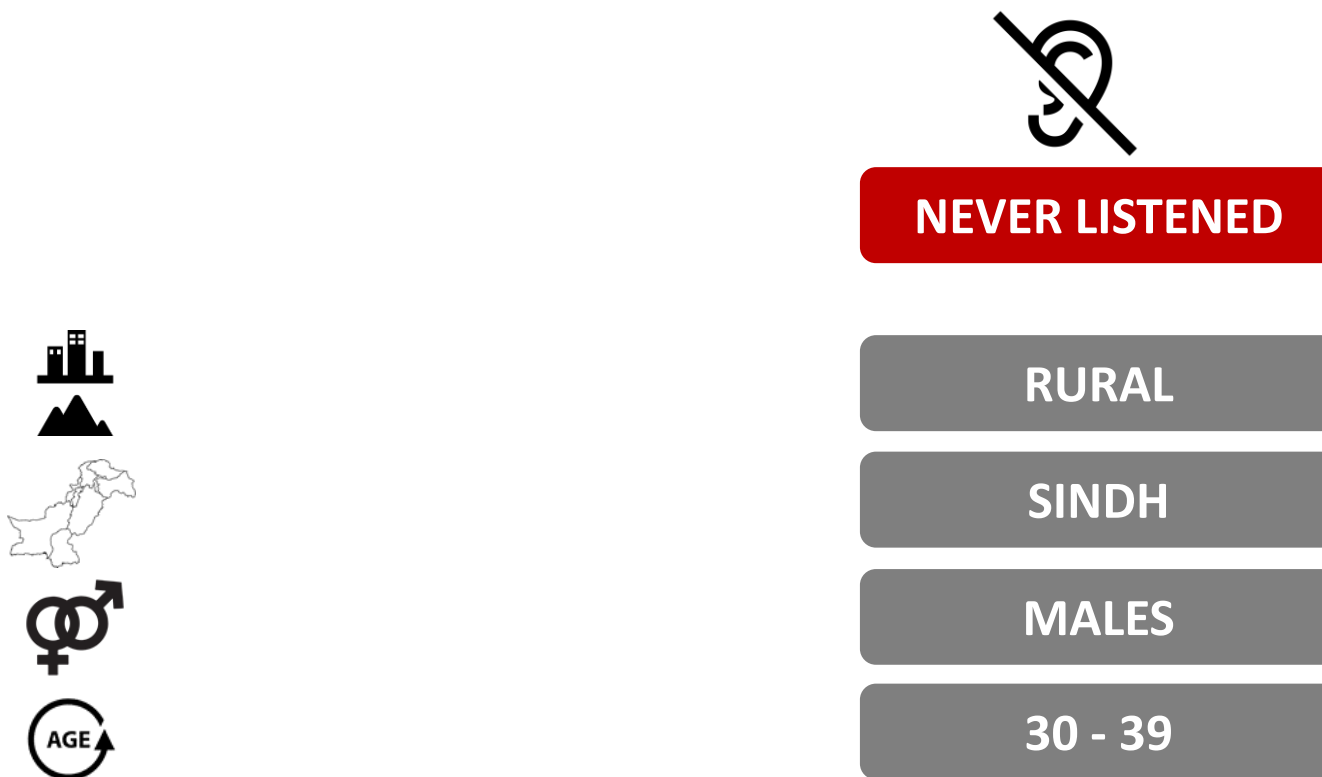

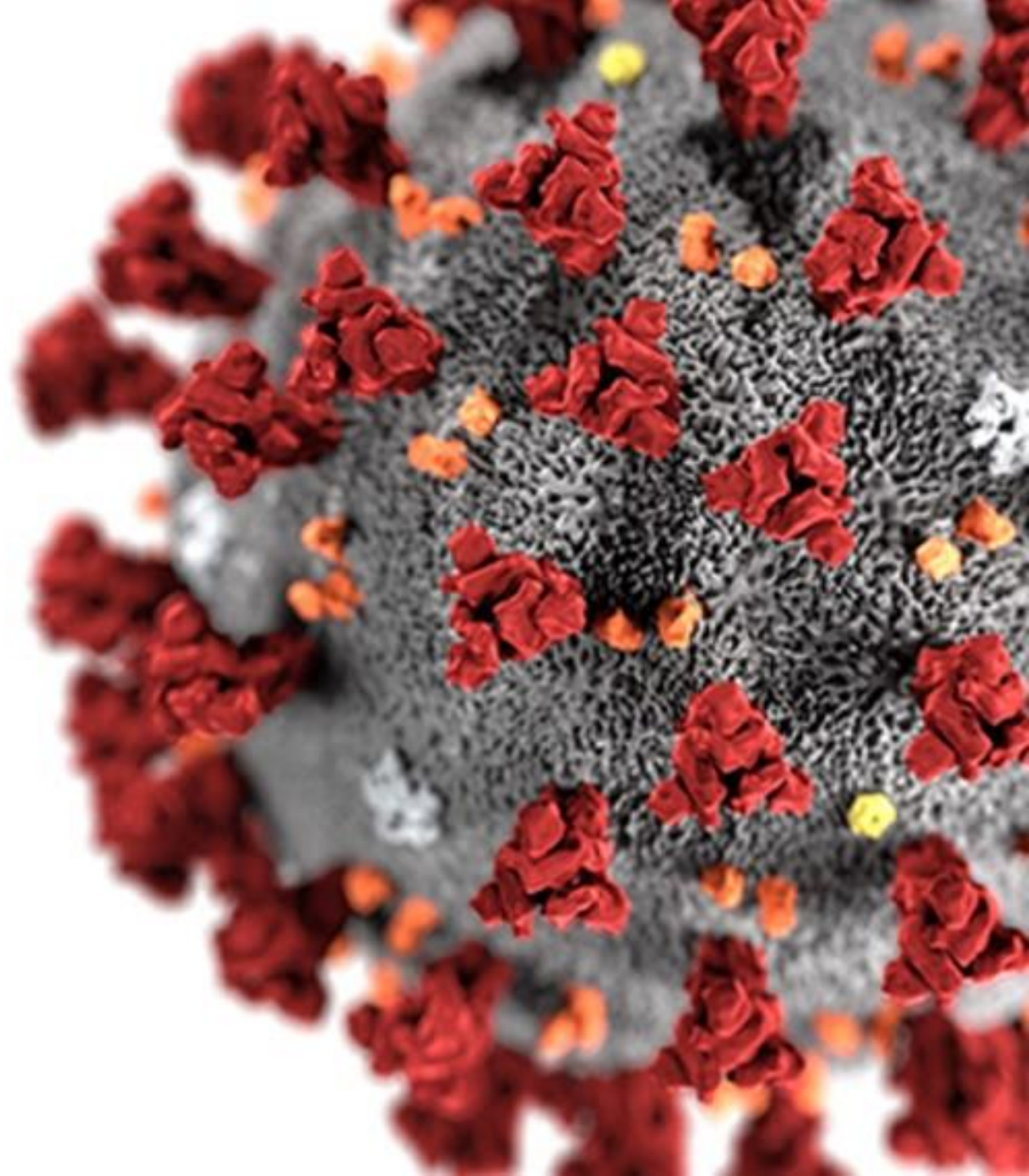

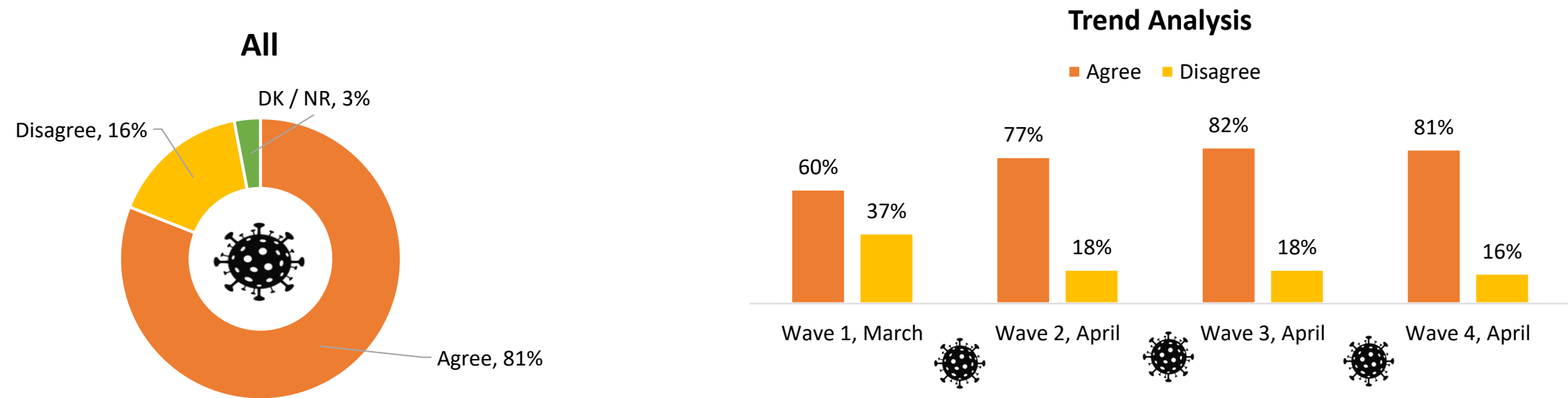

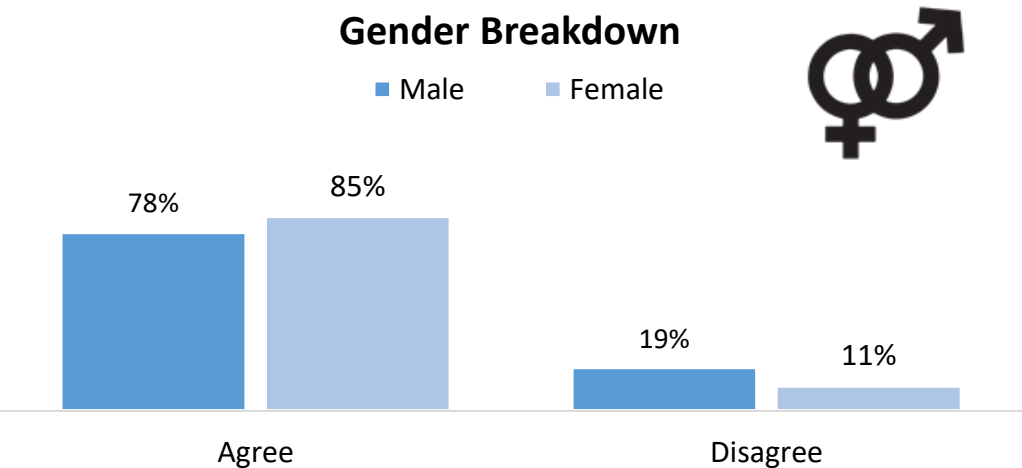

Question: To what extent do you agree/disagree that the Federal Government of Pakistan is controlling the Coronavirus situation very well?

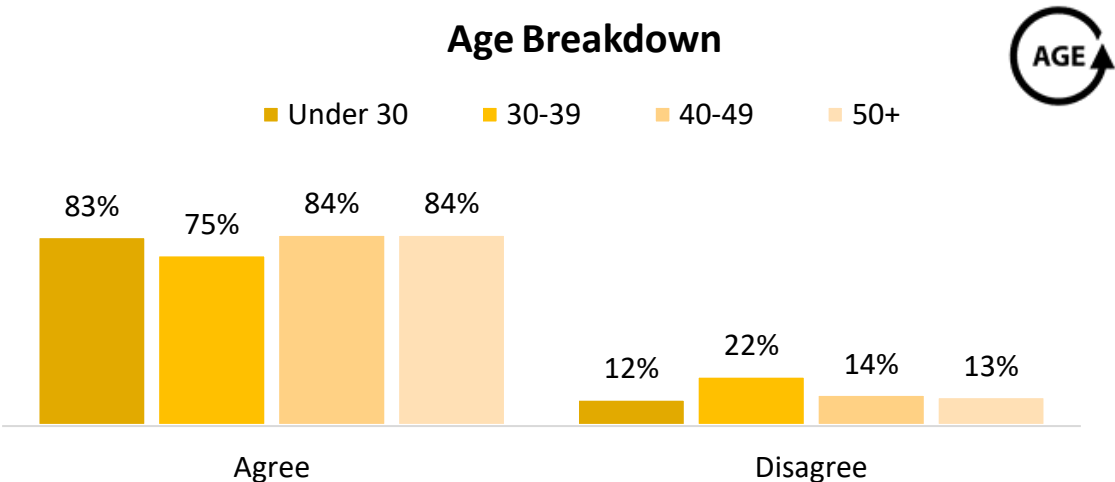

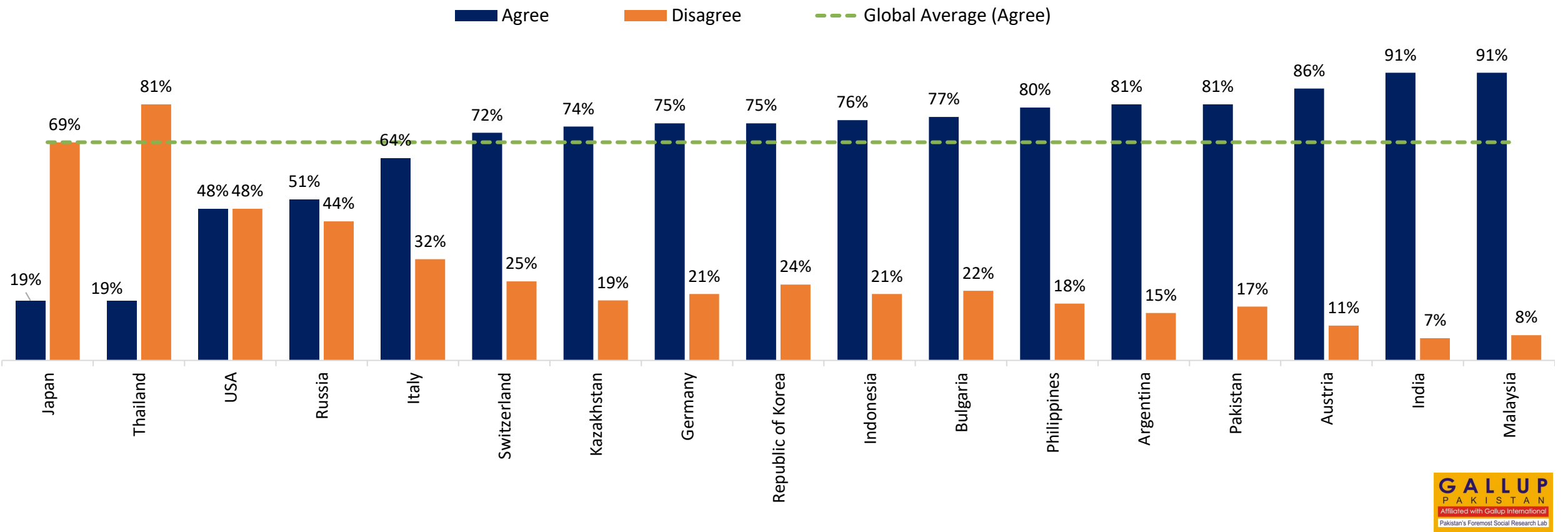
- Significant finding as PTI had 31% vote in 2018 elections. This shows cross partisan support for PTI on this issue.

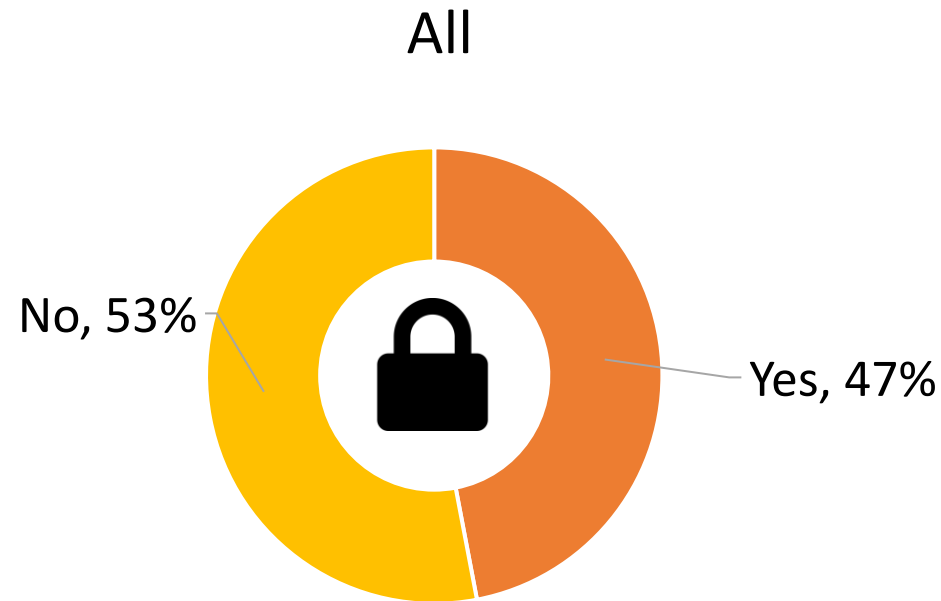

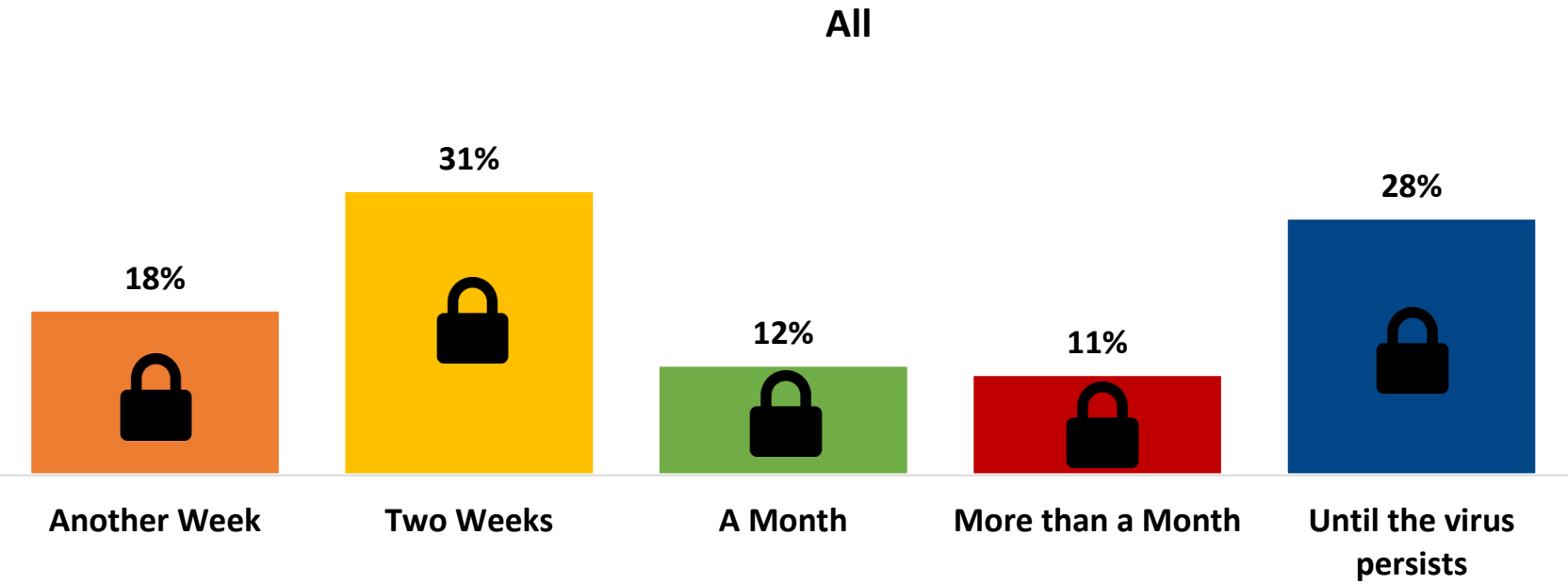

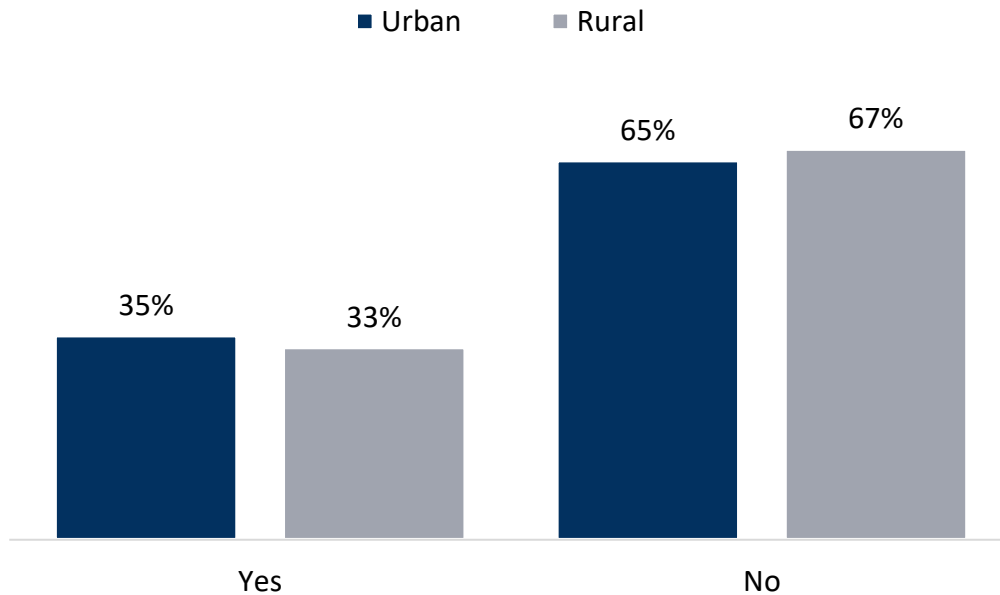
Since the first week of April (W2), a sharp **decline** in the proportion of respondents who report a male family member offering Jummah in a mosque has been observed across the four provinces.

However as opposed to wave 3, rise can be observed. It remains to be seen if the rise persists or its just a small uptick

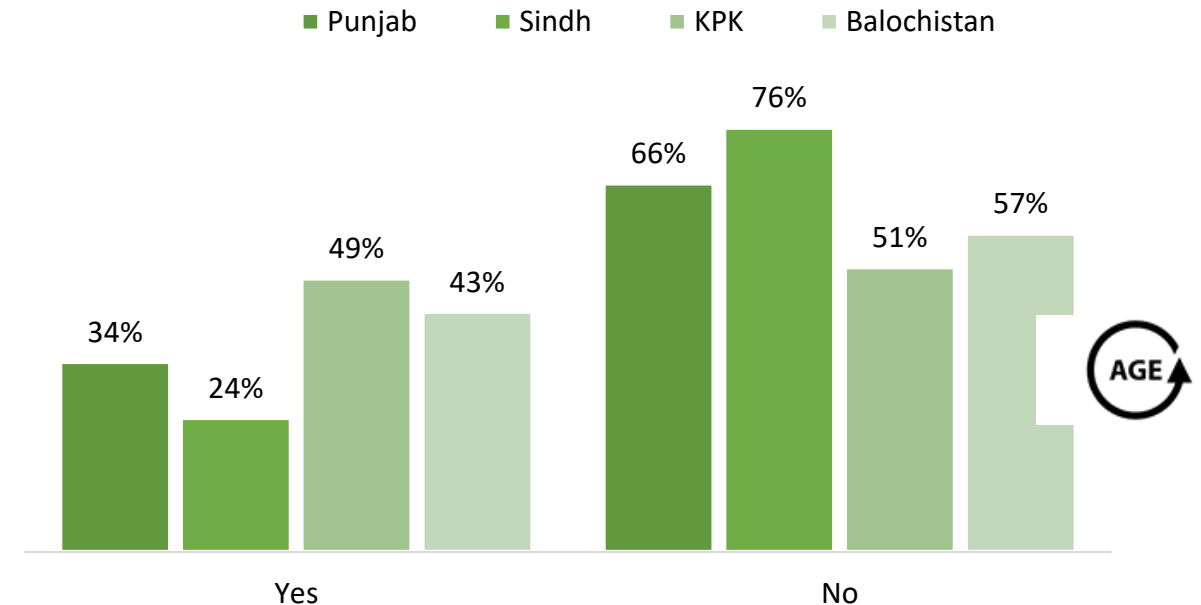

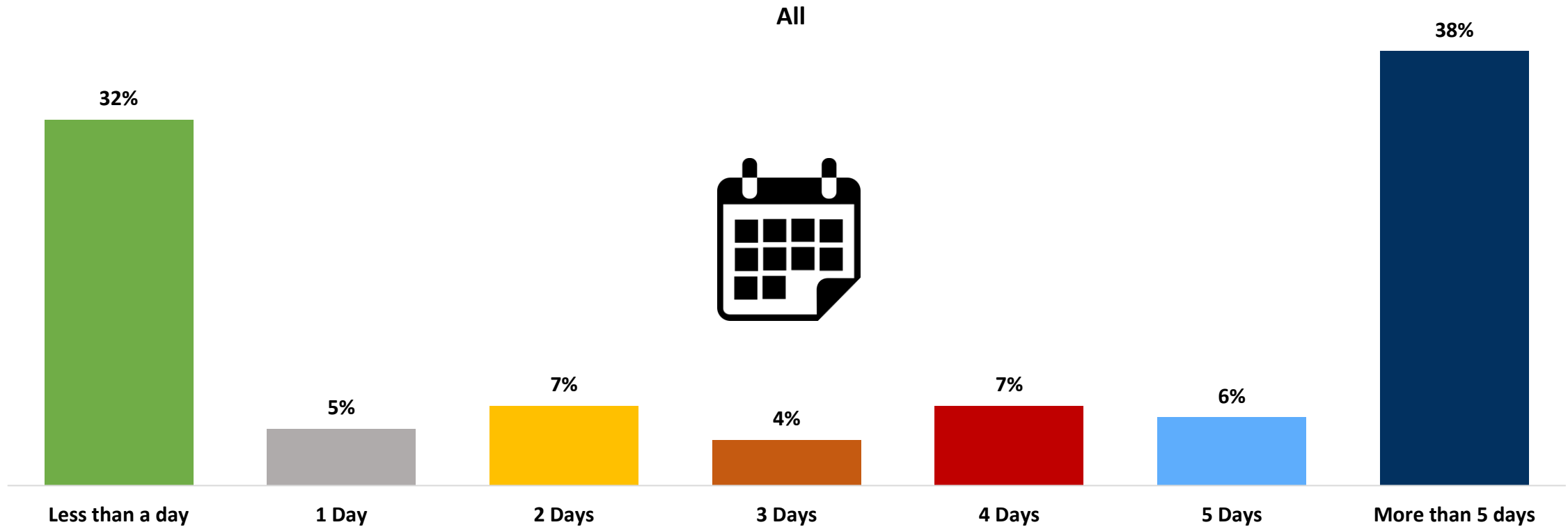

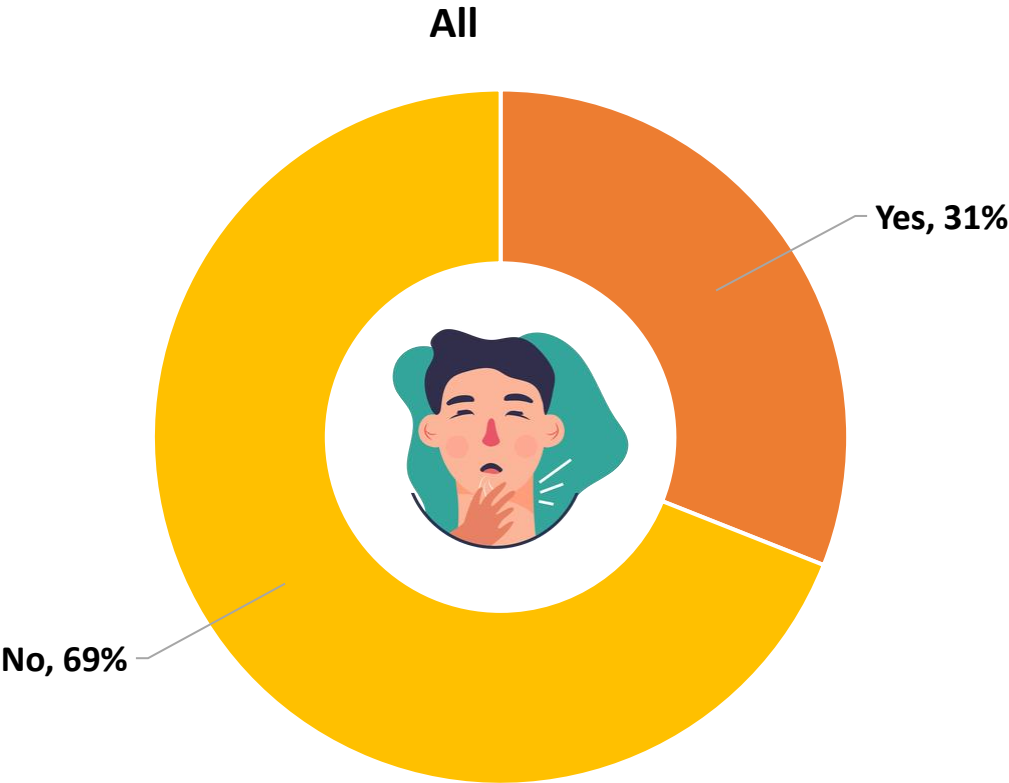

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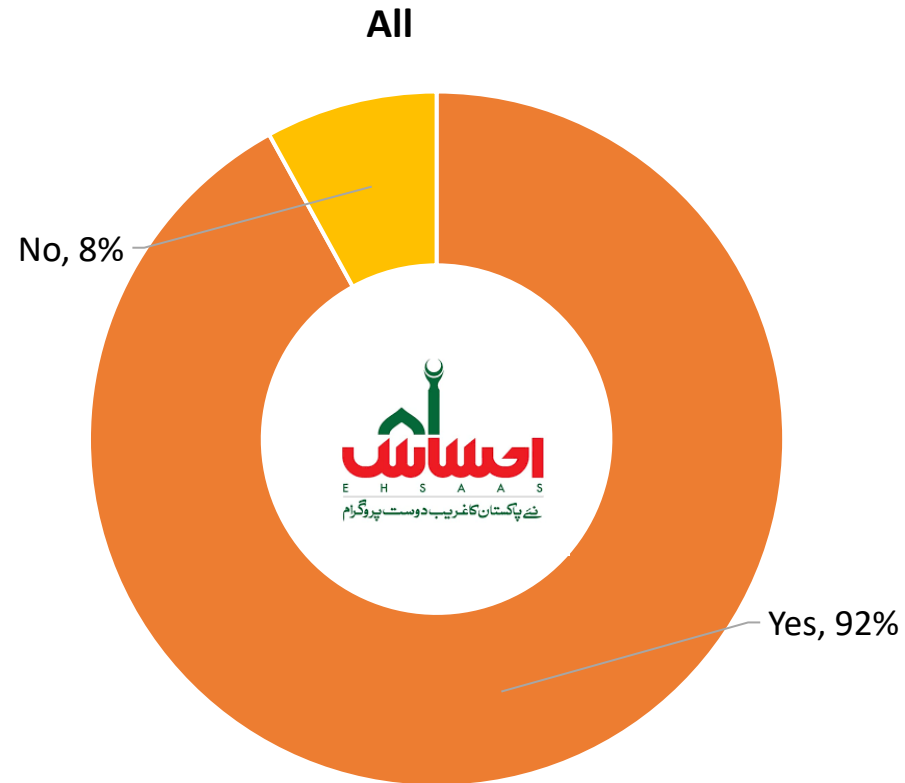

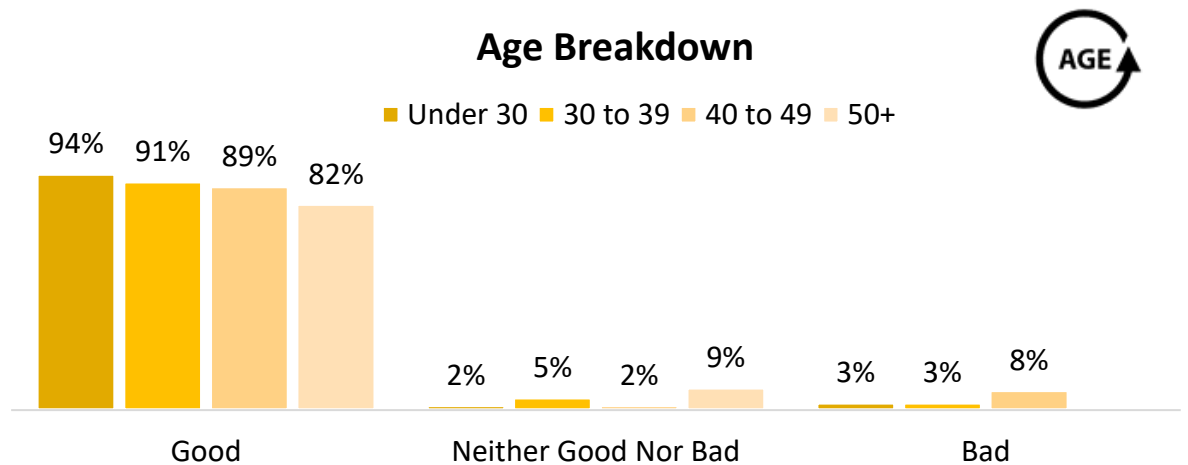

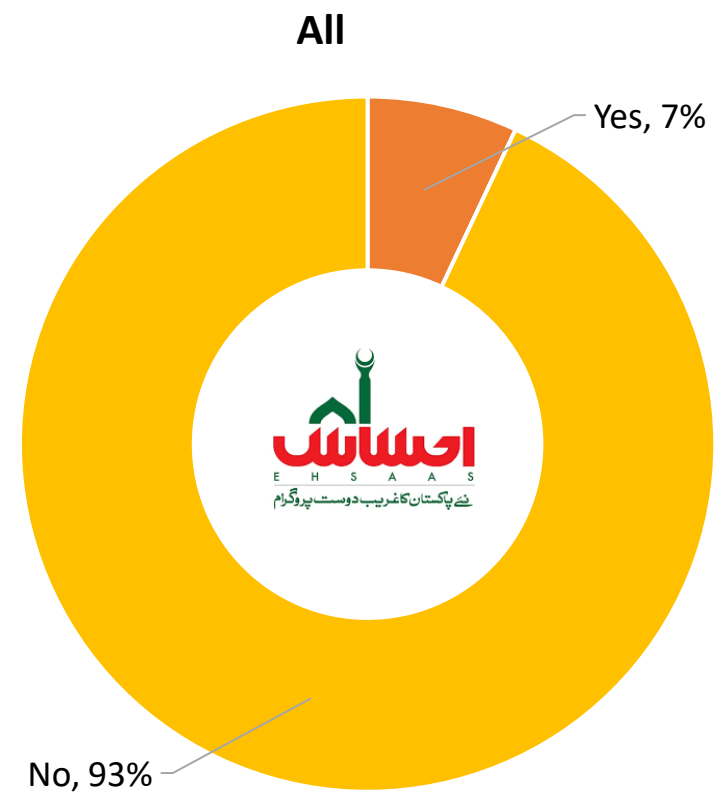

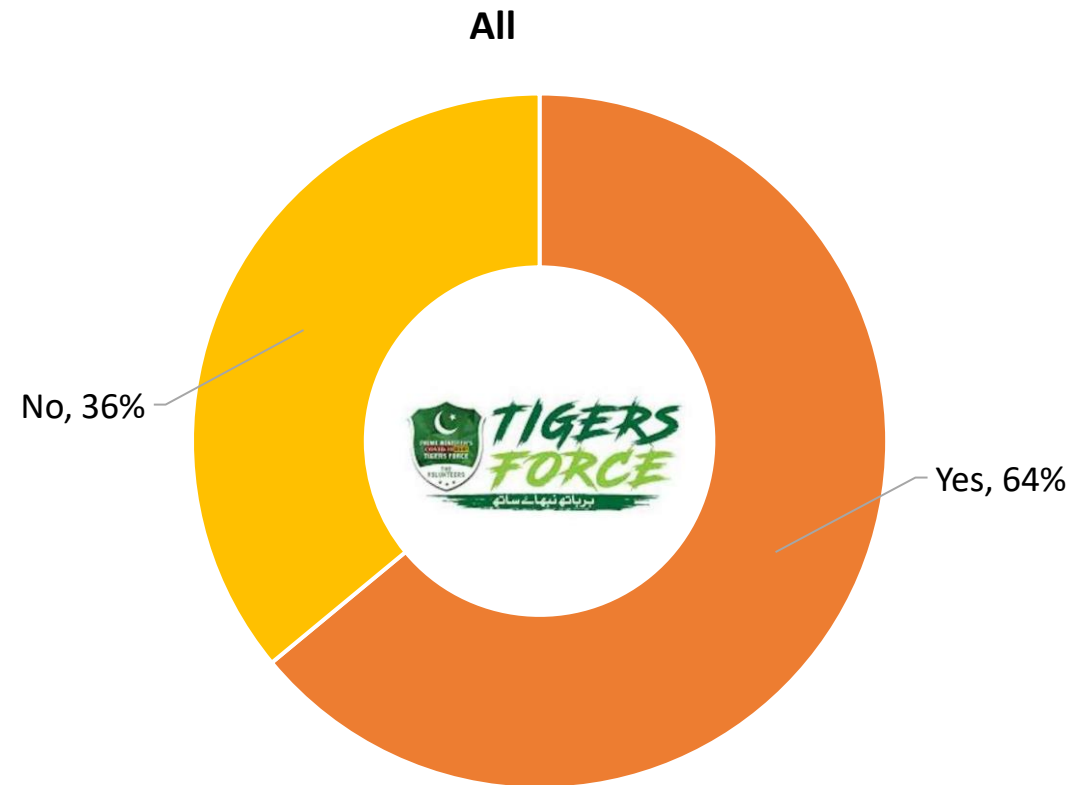

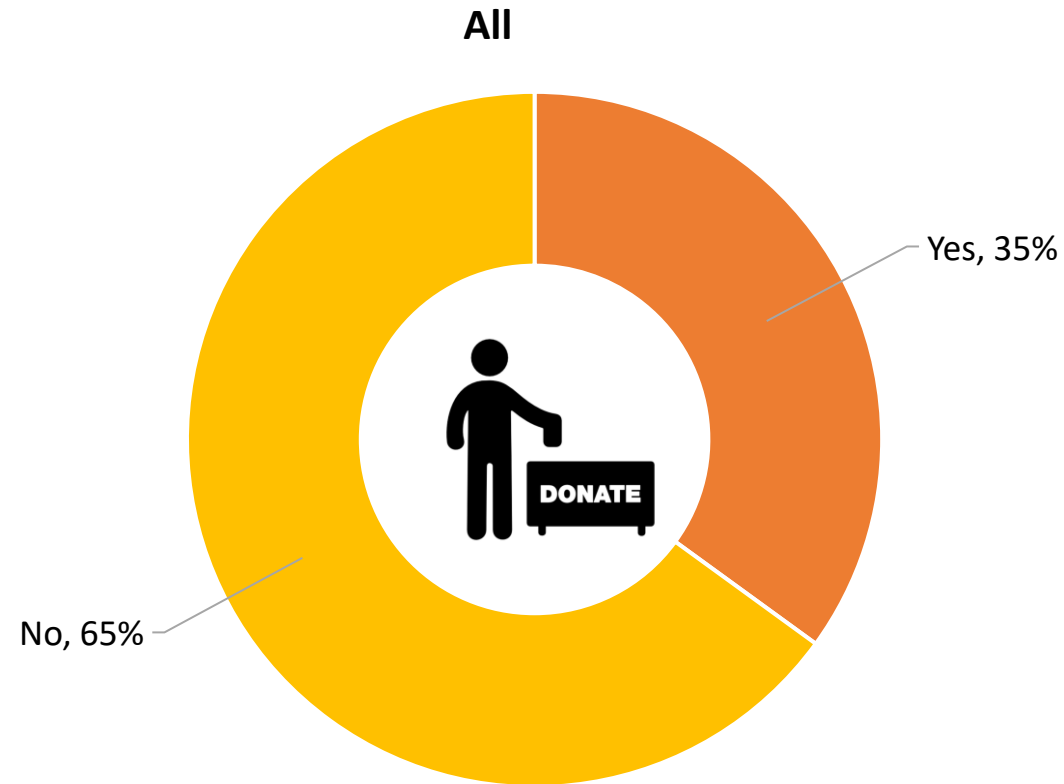

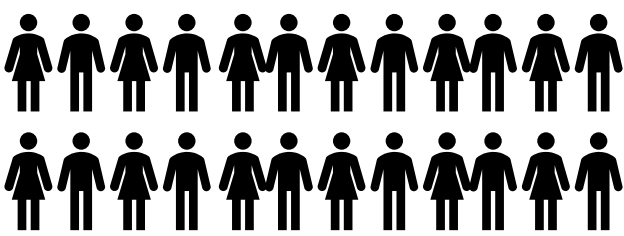

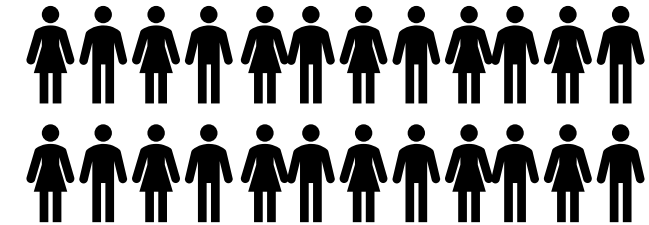

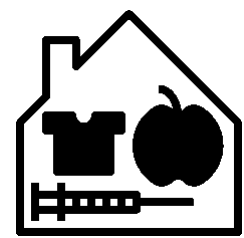

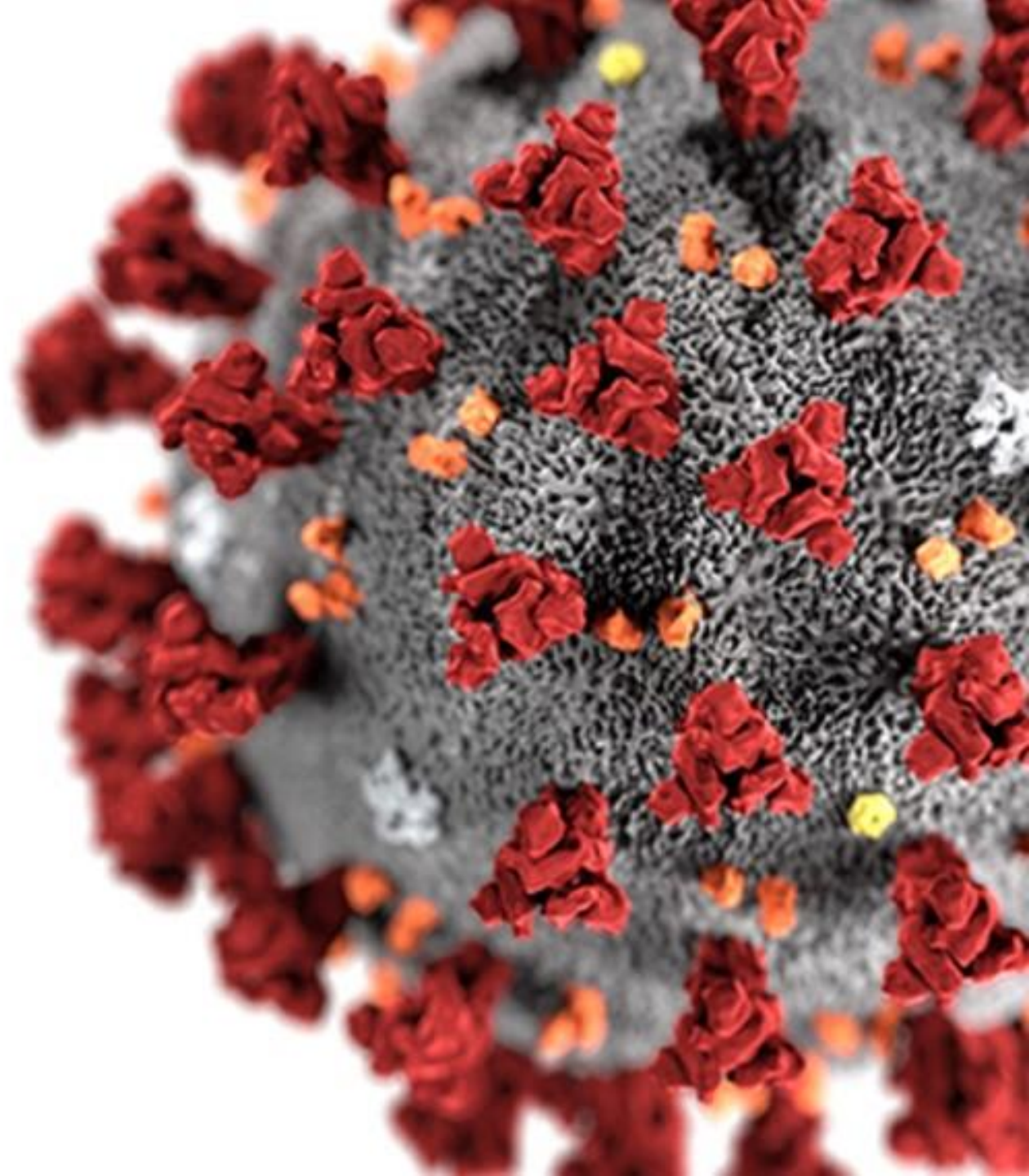

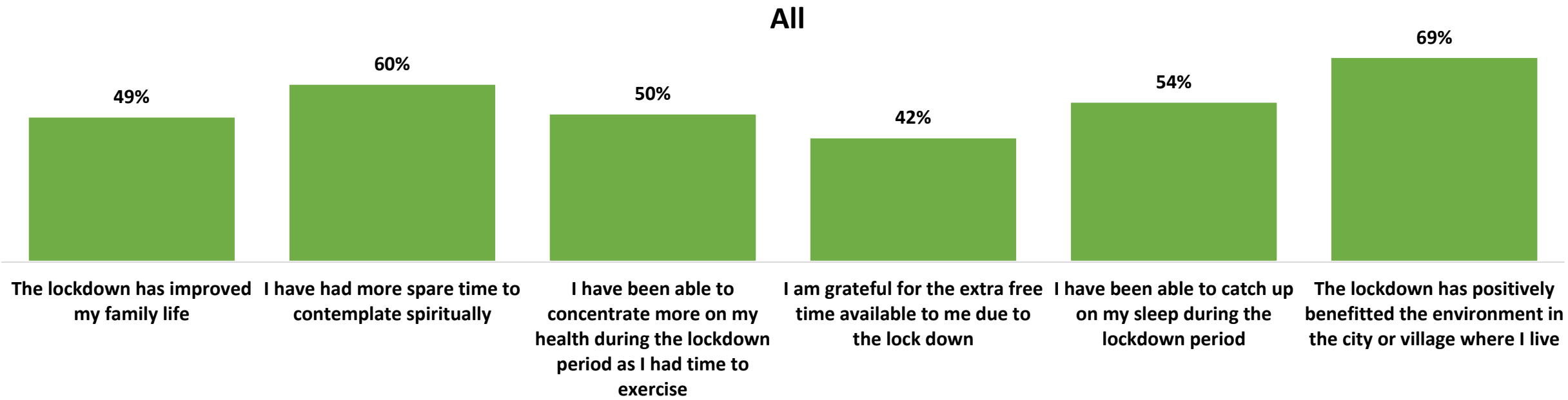

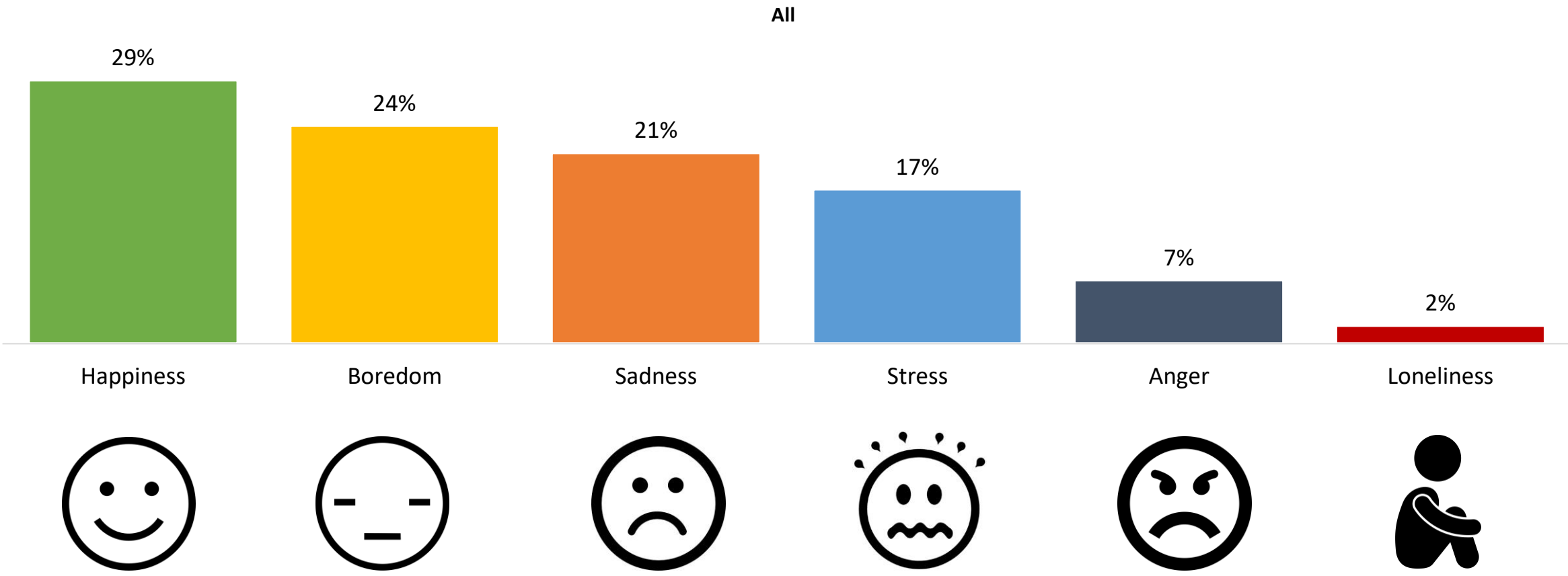

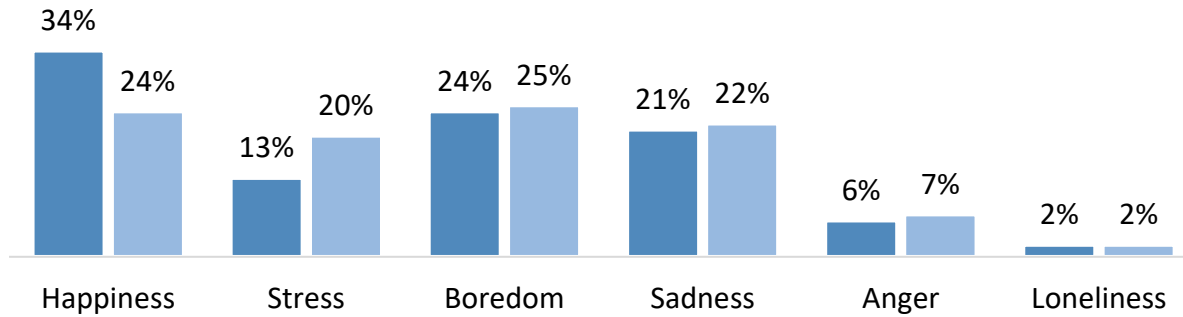

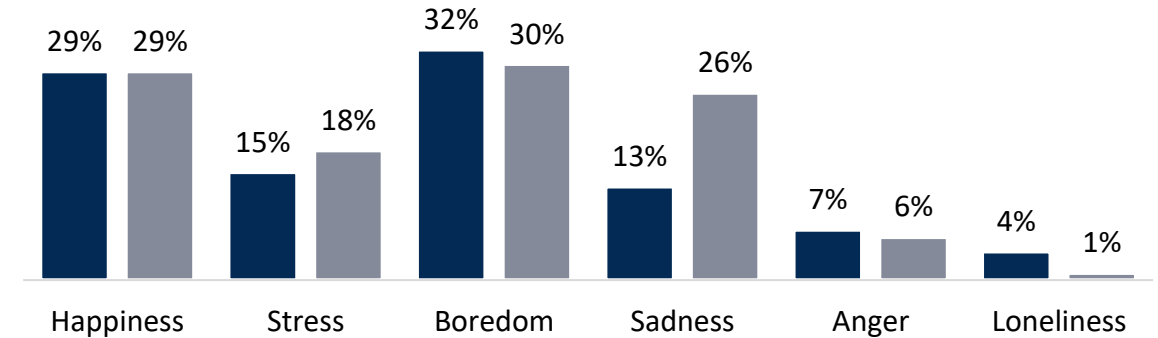

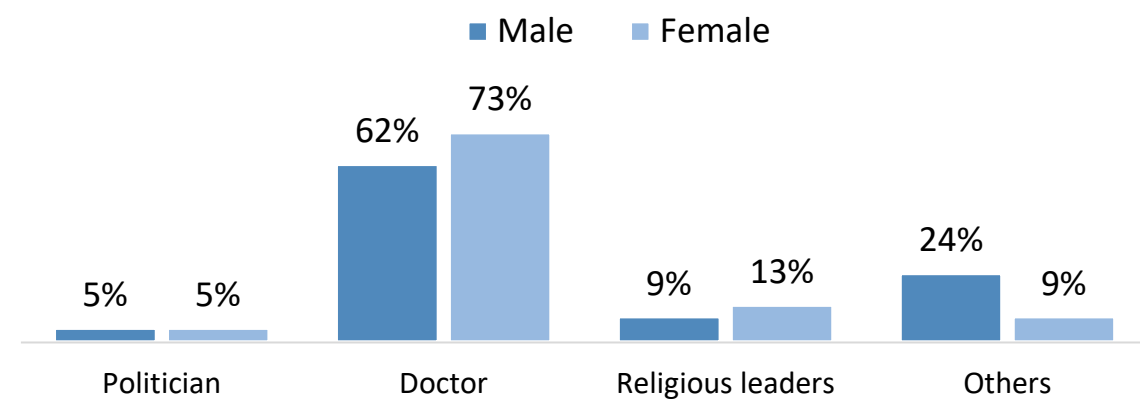
Question: Whose advice would you trust the most relating to Coronavirus?



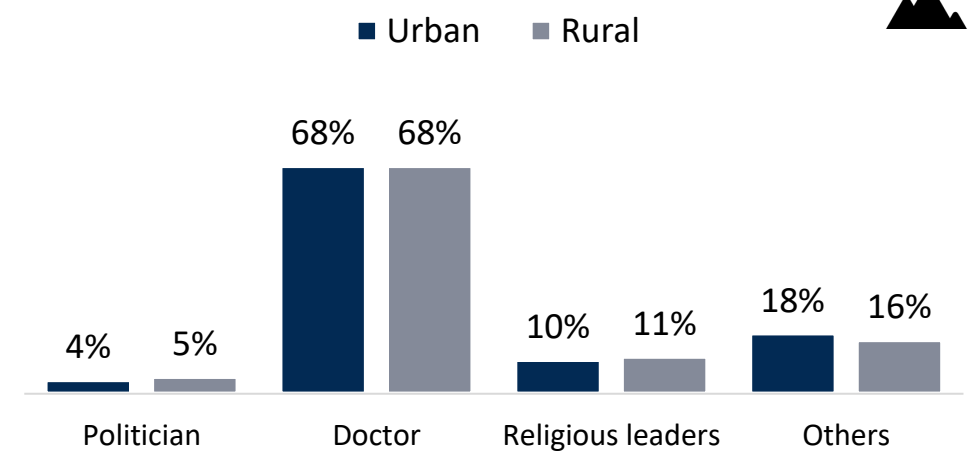

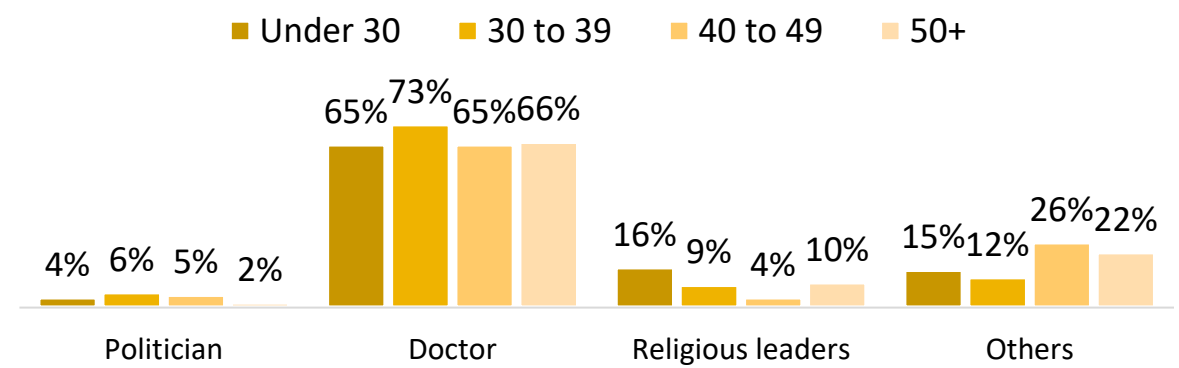
Gender Breakdown

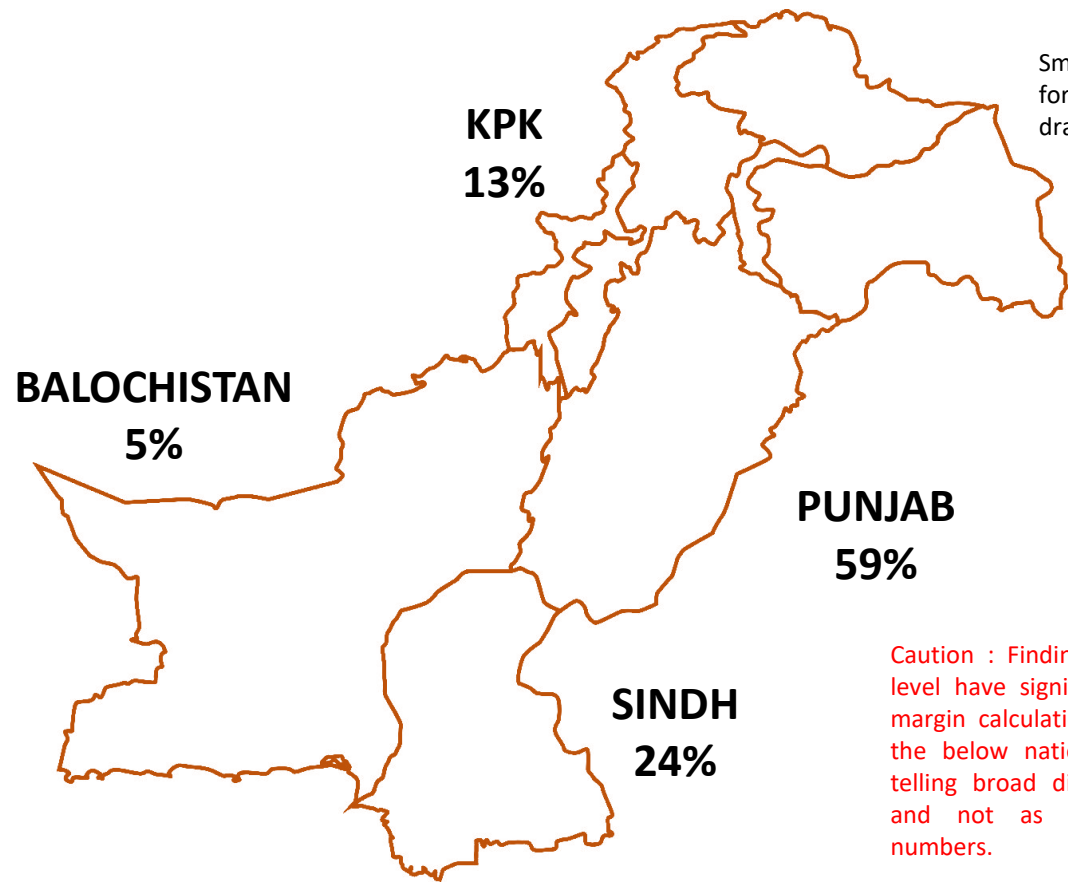

Detailed Note on Methodology

Gallup Pakistan's usual approach of fieldwork is conducting face-to-face interviews in households using geographical sampling. The sampling is done using the census as the frame. Due to coronavirus lockdown, as well as health and safety concerns, we have halted all face-to-face interviews, therefore CATI methodology has been employed.

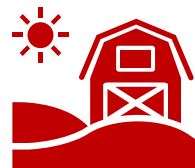
This methodology uses Random Digit Dialling approach where all mobile phone numbers in Pakistan (130 million active sims) are the universe.

Exclusion in sample: According to PSLM (a government survey), 90% of households in Pakistan claim someone in their household owns a mobile phone. This means that 10% households are excluded from the sample.



Small samples accounting for less than 1% were also drawn from GB and AJK

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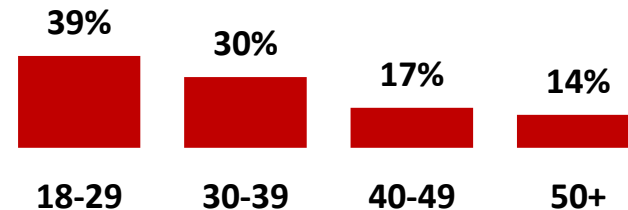
