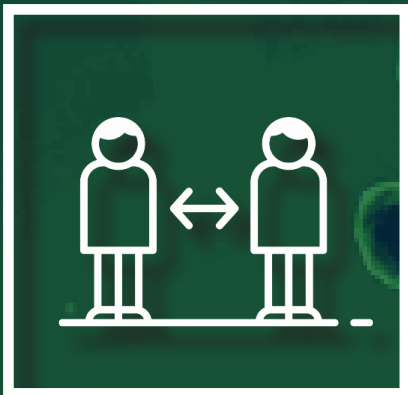

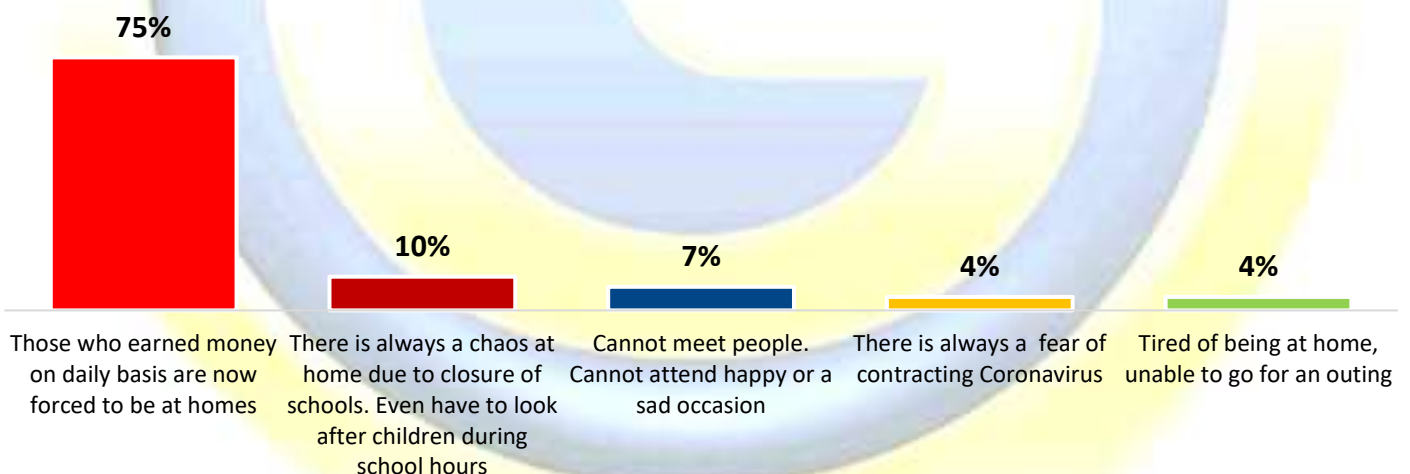
3 in 4 Pakistanis (75%) opine that daily wagers struggling to find work amid the lockdown is the most serious repercussion of the COVID-19 lockdown (Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Weekly Coronavirus Perception Tracker)

Islamabad, June 15th, 2020

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 3 in 4 Pakistanis (75%) opine that daily wagers struggling to find work amid the lockdown is the most serious repercussion of the COVID-19 lockdown.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“Rank the repercussions of lockdown: Those who earned money on daily basis are now forced to be at homes, There is always a chaos at home due to closure of schools. Even have to look after children during school hours, Cannot meet people & Cannot attend happy or a sad occasion, There is always a fear of contracting Coronavirus, Tired of being at home, unable to go for an outing?”* In response to this question, 75% ranked the inability of daily wage earners to work as the most serious repercussion of the lockdown, 10% rank the closure of schools and responsibility of children as the main repercussion, 7% chose inability to interact with people as the main drawback while 4% each ranked the fear of contracting coronavirus and the inability to go for an outing as the most serious repercussion.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,144 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 01 – May 20, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 5. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
