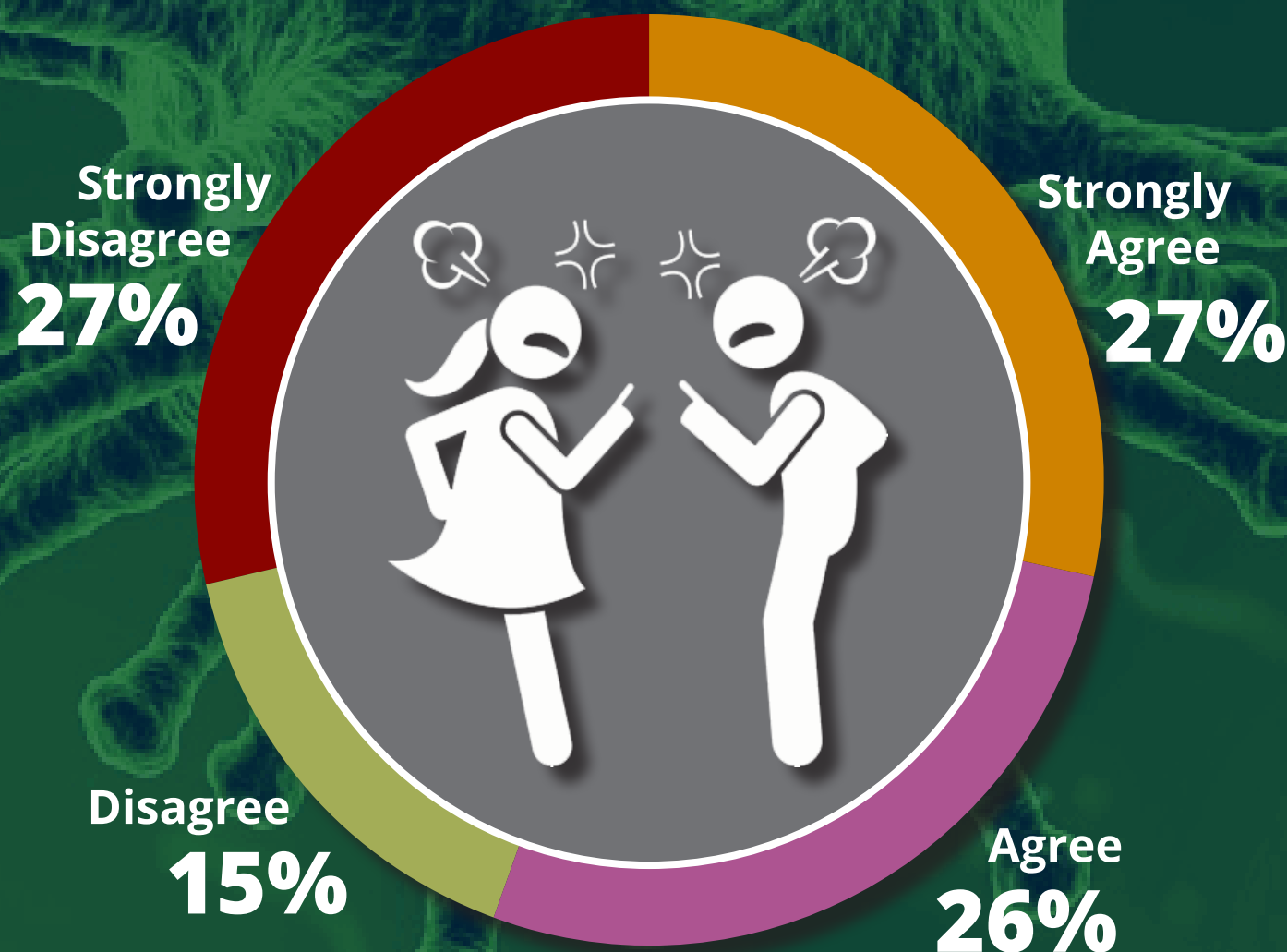

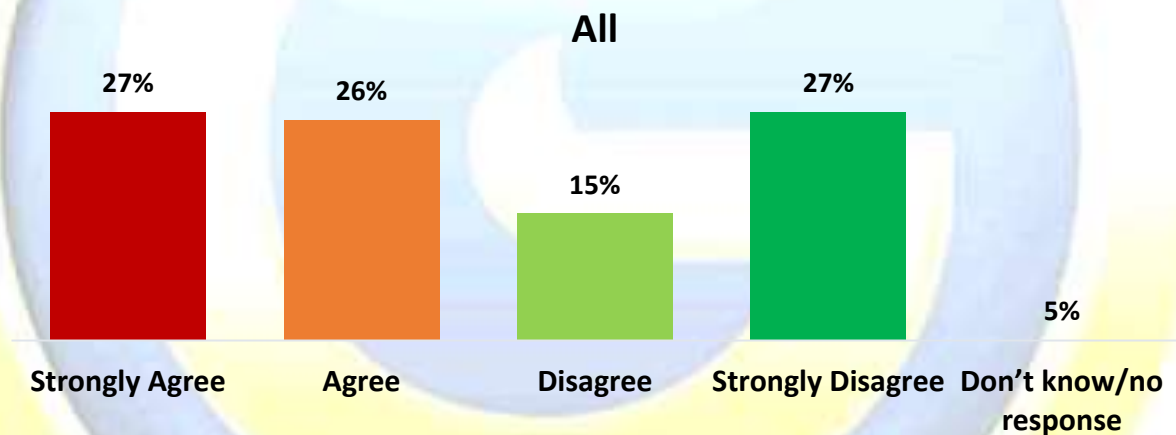

Islamabad, June 17th, 2020

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, more than half Pakistanis (53%) agree that lockdown has increased domestic fights between married couples.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“To what extent do you agree/ disagree with the following statement: Lockdown has increased domestic fights between husband/wife?”* In response to this question, 27% strongly agreed that the lockdown has increased domestic fights, 26% agreed, 15% disagreed and 27% strongly disagreed. 5% did not know/did not respond.

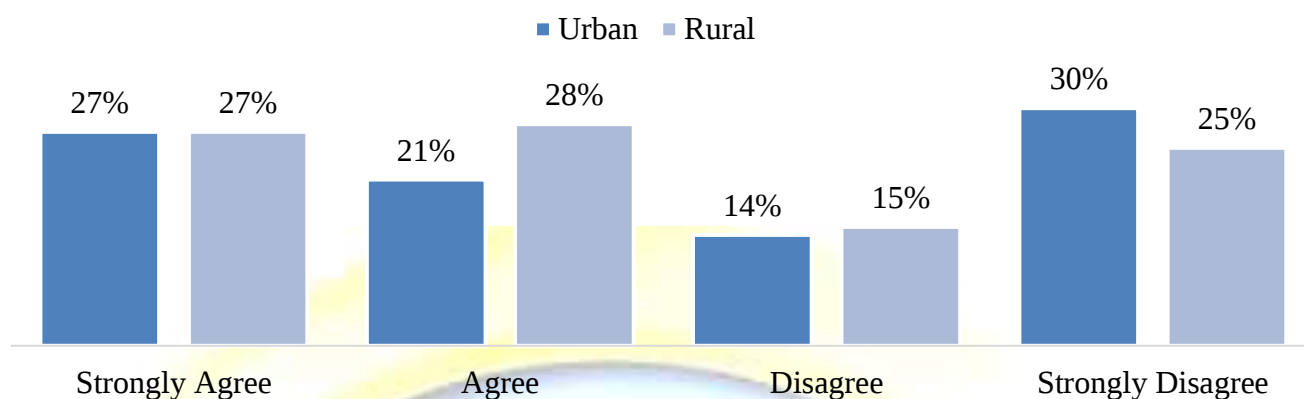
Question: “To what extent do you agree/ disagree with the following statement: *Lockdown has increased domestic fights between husband/wife?*”



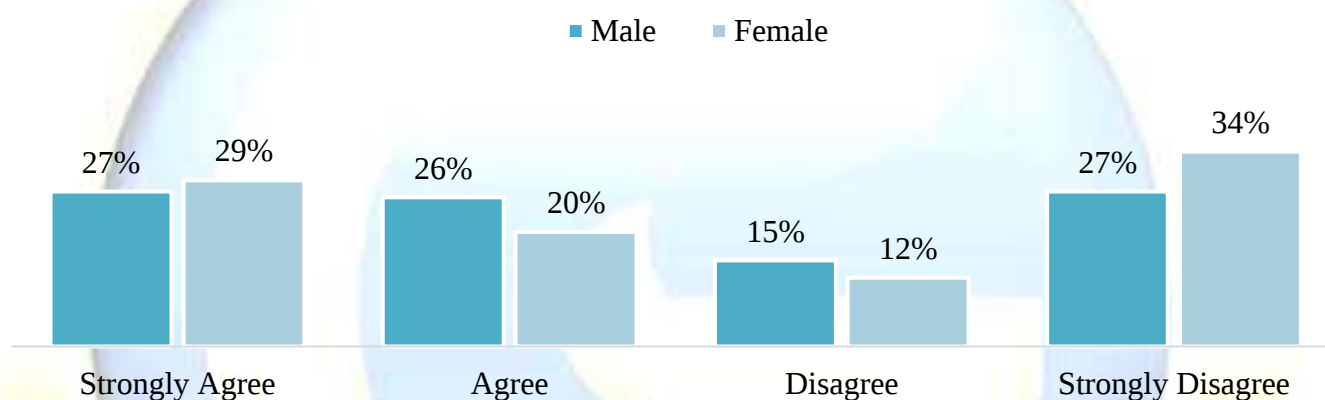

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,144 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 01 – May 20, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 5. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
