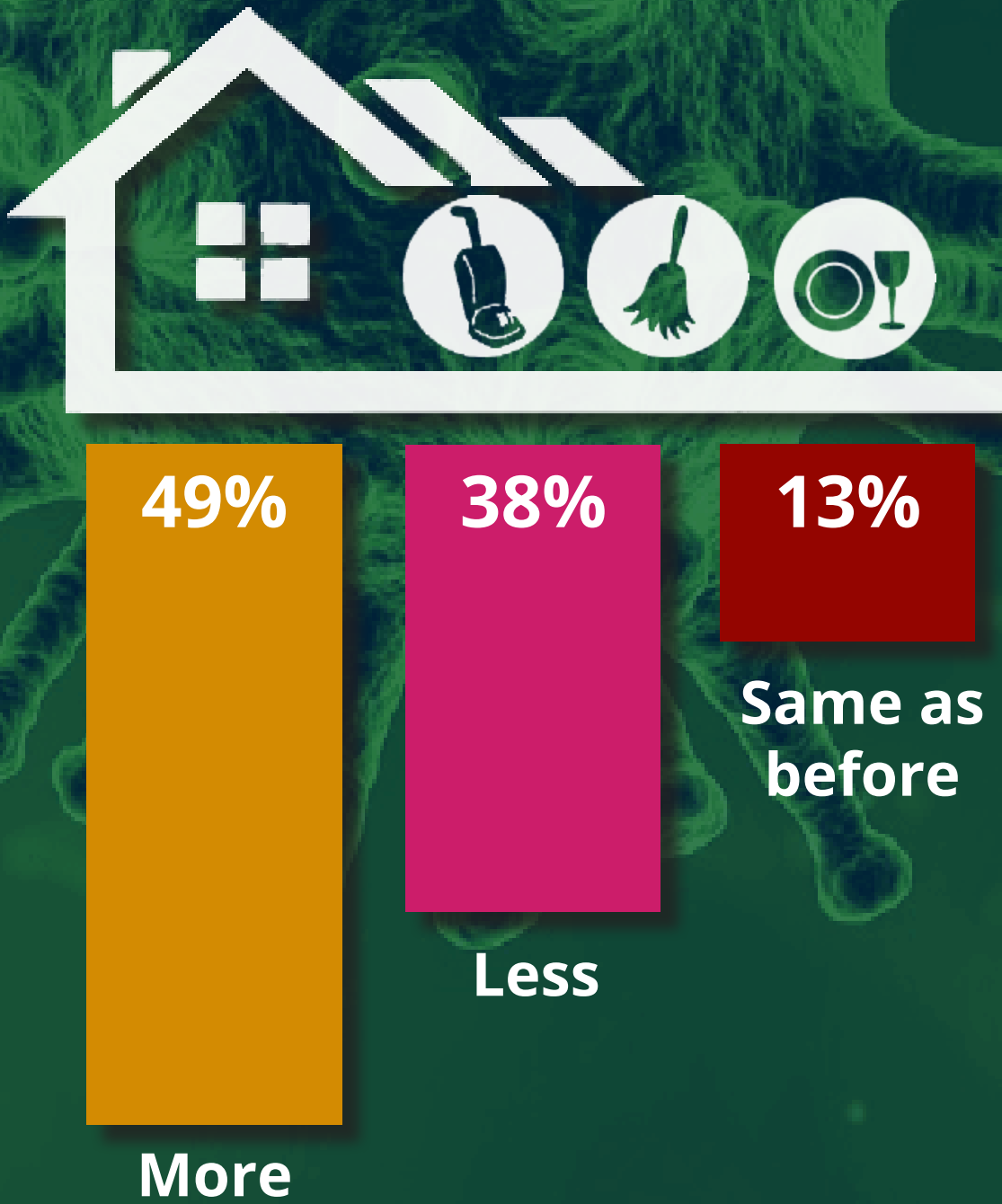

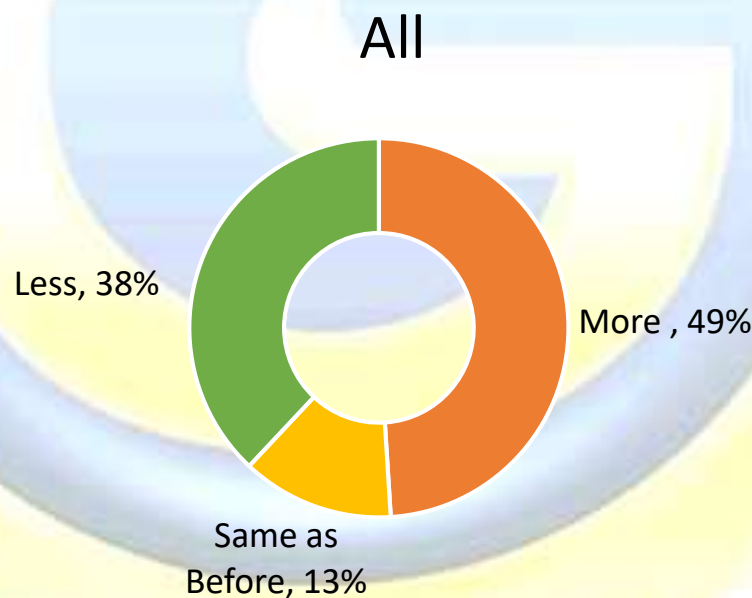

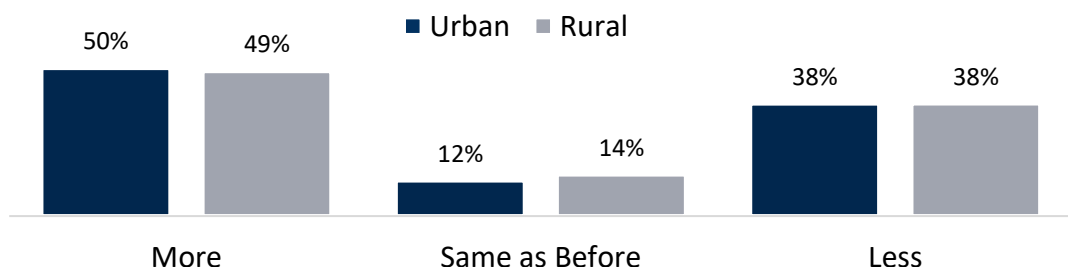
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 1 in 2 Pakistanis (49%) claim they are now spending more time doing household chores than before the imposition of lockdown. 20% more females than males report the same.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*Since the start of lockdown, are you doing household chores e.g. cleaning, cooking etc more, same as before or less as compared before imposition of lockdown?*” In response to this question, 49% say they are doing more household chores than before the lockdown, 13% say they are the same as before, 38% say they are doing less chores than before.

Question: “Since the start of lockdown, are you doing household chores e.g. cleaning, cooking etc more, same as before or less as compared before imposition of lockdown?”

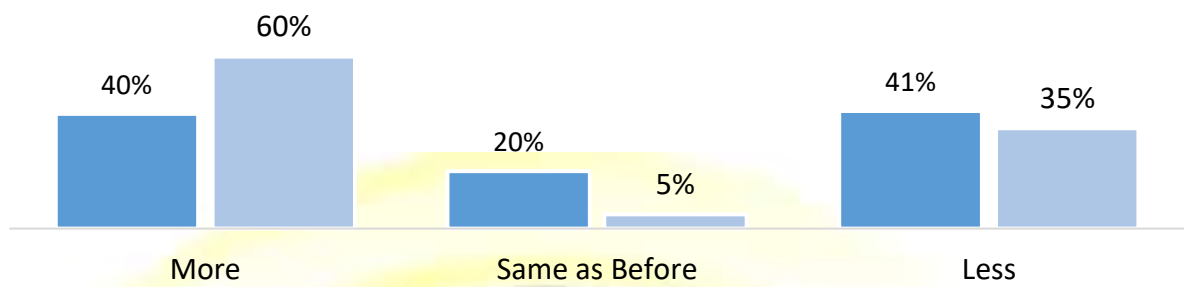

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,144 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 01 – May 20, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 5. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
