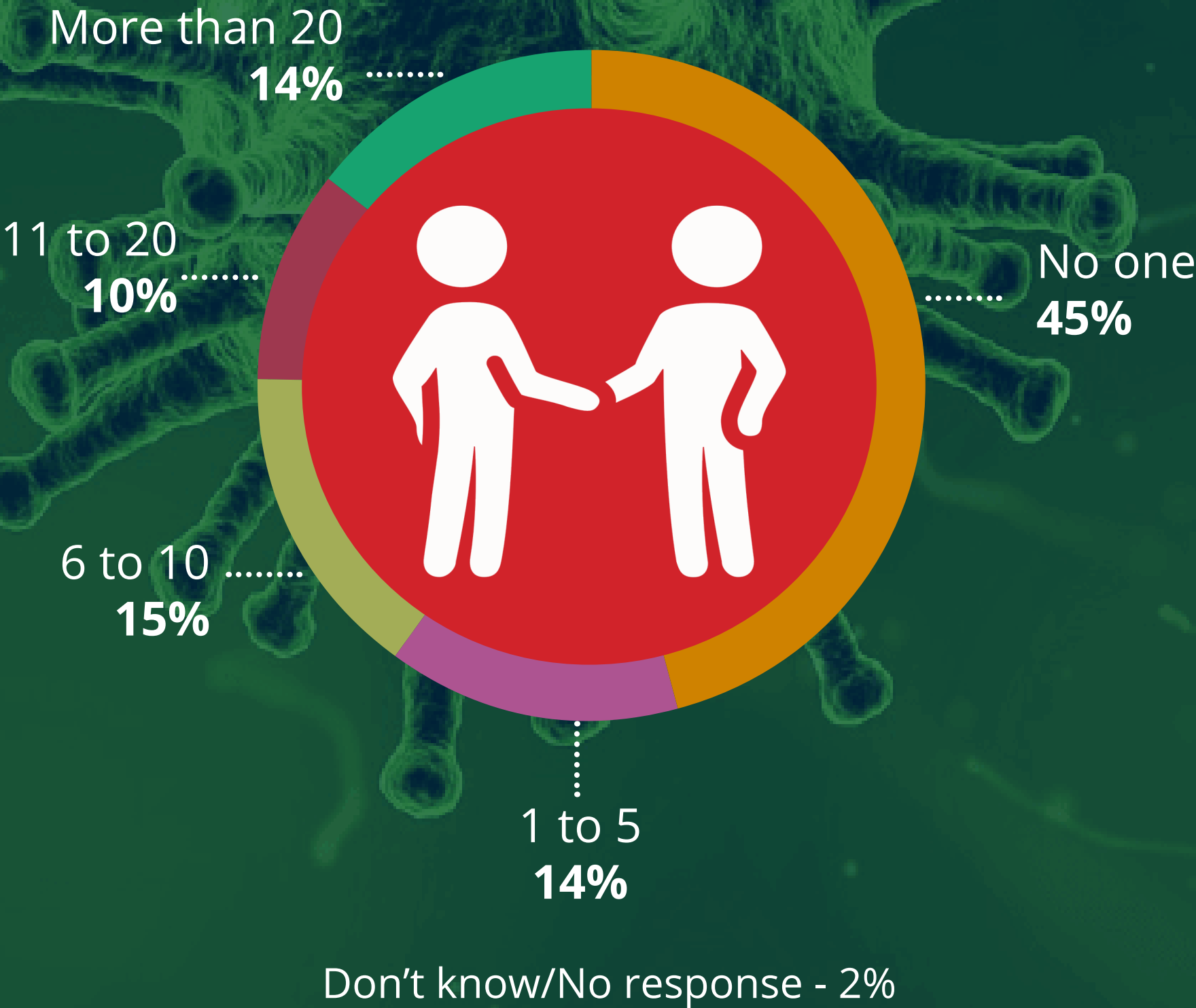

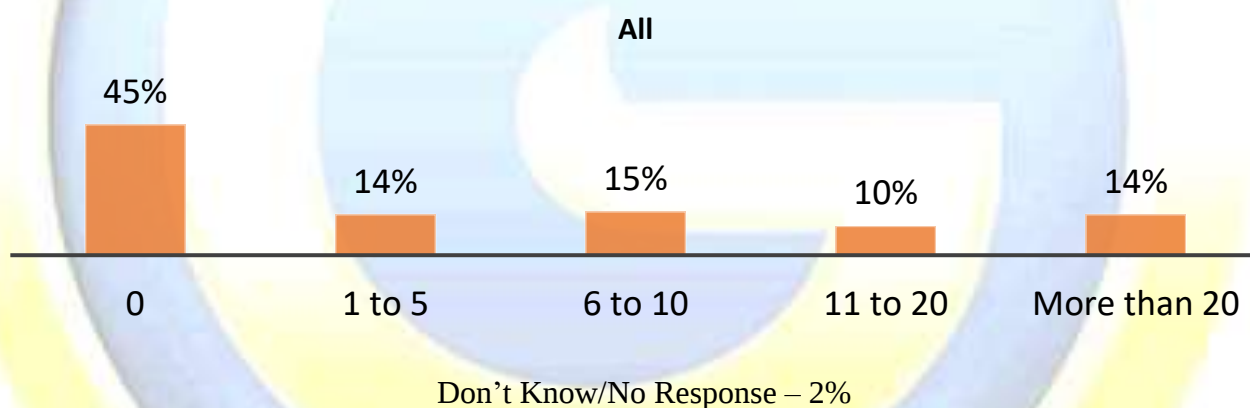

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 1 in 4 Pakistanis (24%) reported meeting more than 10 people apart from their household members in the past 4 weeks.

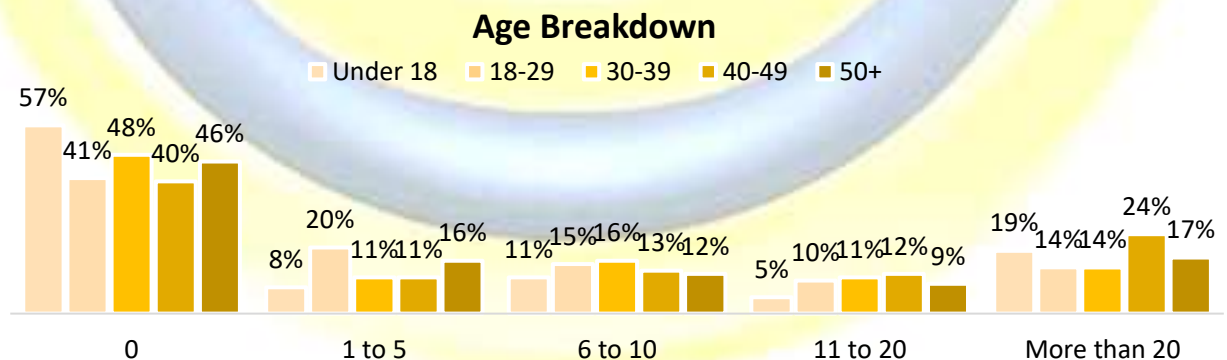
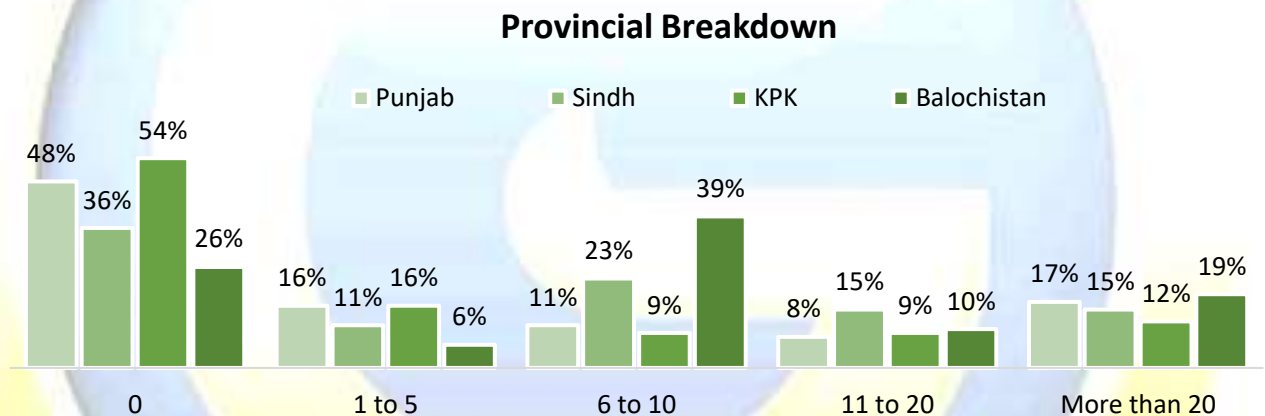
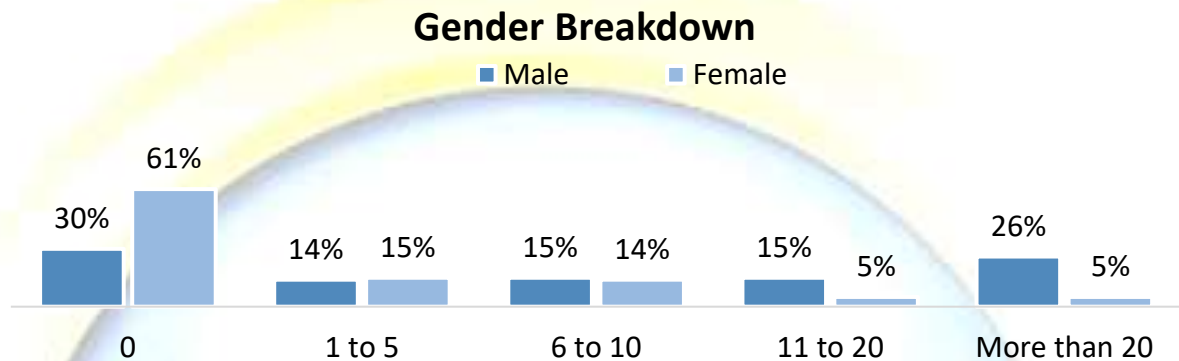
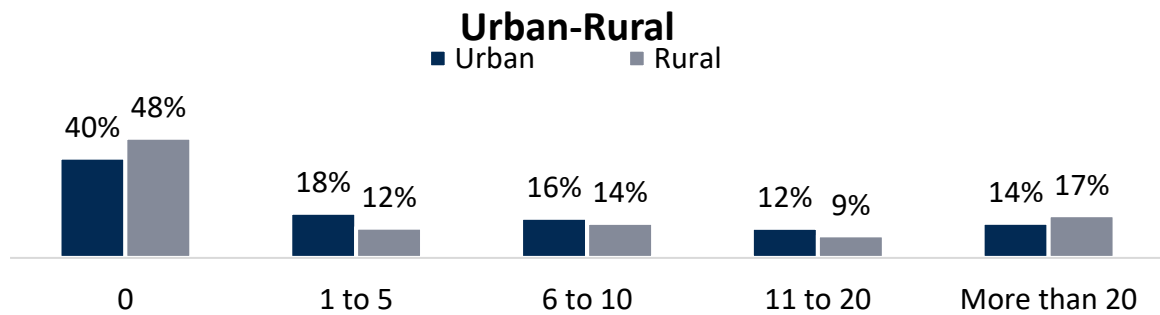
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*Apart from your household members, how many people have you met in the last 4 weeks?*” In response to this question, 45% Pakistanis said they had not met anyone except their household members, 14% said they met 1 to 5 people, 15% said they met 6 to 10 people, 10% reported meeting 11 to 20 people while 14% claimed they met over 20 people in the past 4 weeks.

Question: Apart from your household members, how many people have you met in the last 4 weeks?



Gallup Index of Compliance with Social Distancing Directives: Nearly half the respondents (45%) are classified as ardent adherents - those who did not meet anyone in the past 4 weeks. 24% are classified as doubters

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,144 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 01 – May 20, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 5. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
