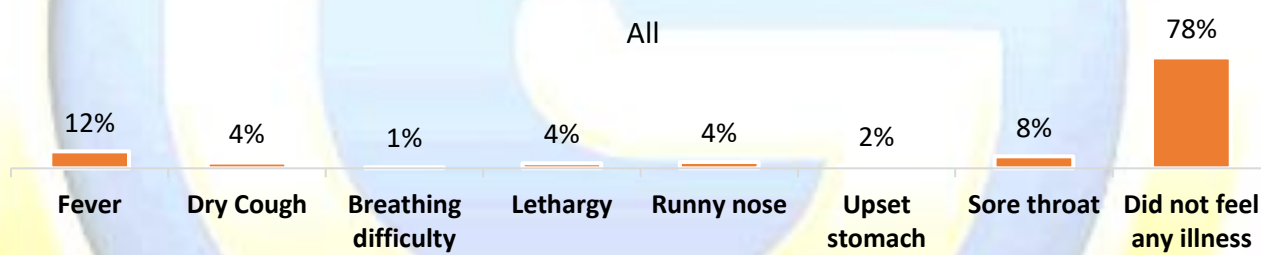

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 12% respondents reported that they suffered from fever in the last 4 weeks - one of the symptoms of COVID-19. A majority (78%) reported that they did not feel any illness.

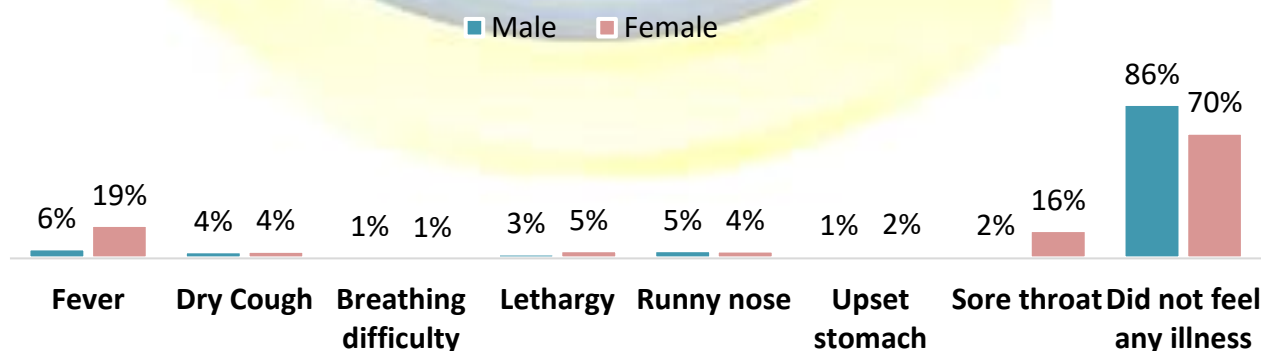
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“In the last 4 weeks, have you suffered from fever, dry cough, breathing difficulty, lethargy, runny nose, upset stomach, sore throat or did you not feel any illness?”* In response to this question, 12% said they suffered from fever, 4% from dry cough, 1% had breathing difficulty, 4% experienced lethargy, 4% had a runny nose, 2% reported an upset stomach, 8% had a sore throat and 78% did you not feel any illness

Question: “In the last 4 weeks, have you suffered from fever, dry cough, breathing difficulty, lethargy, runny nose, upset stomach, sore throat or did you not feel any illness?”

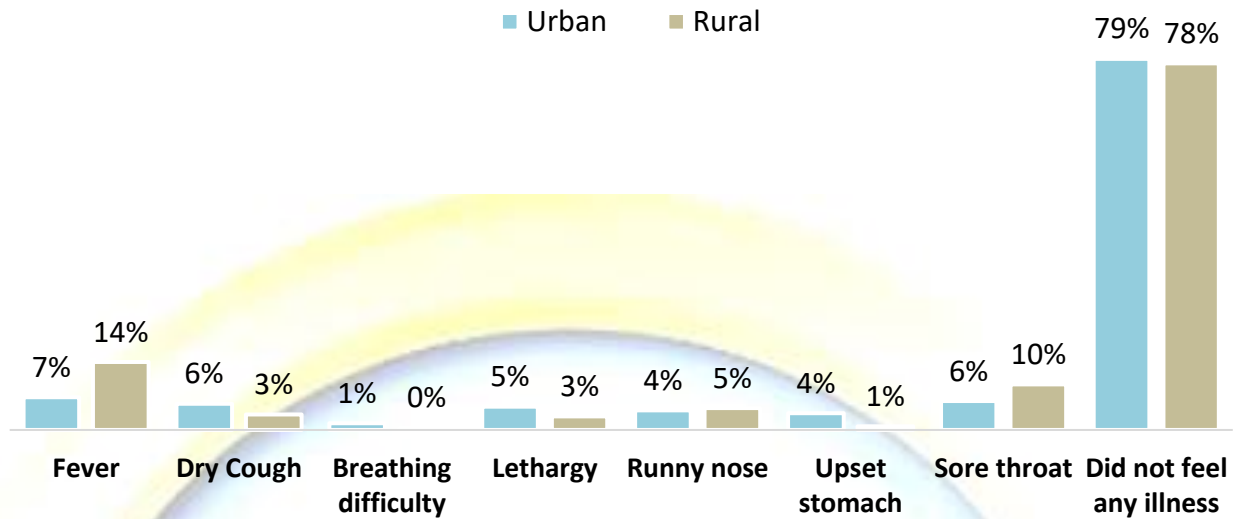

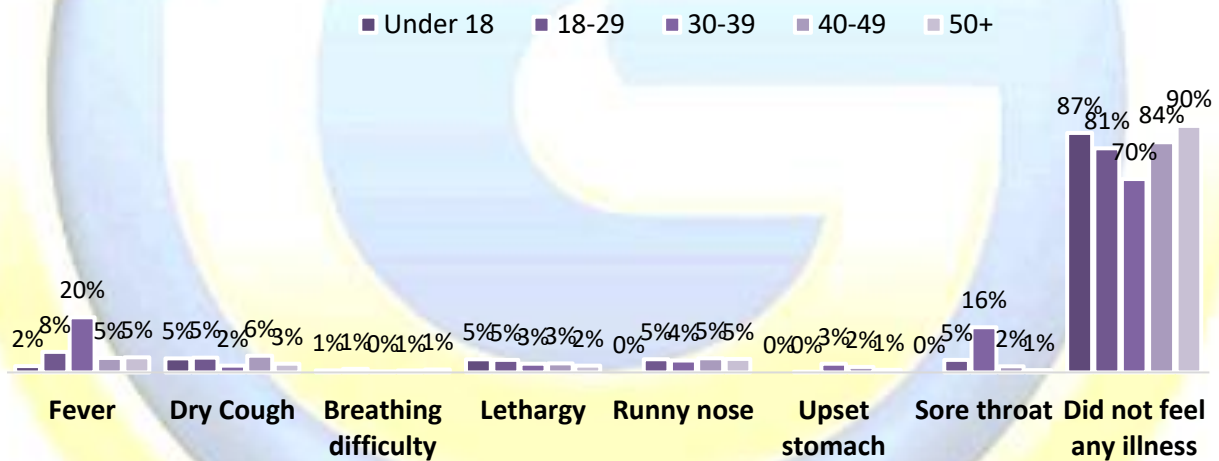
Gender Breakdown

The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,144 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 01 – May 20, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 5. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
