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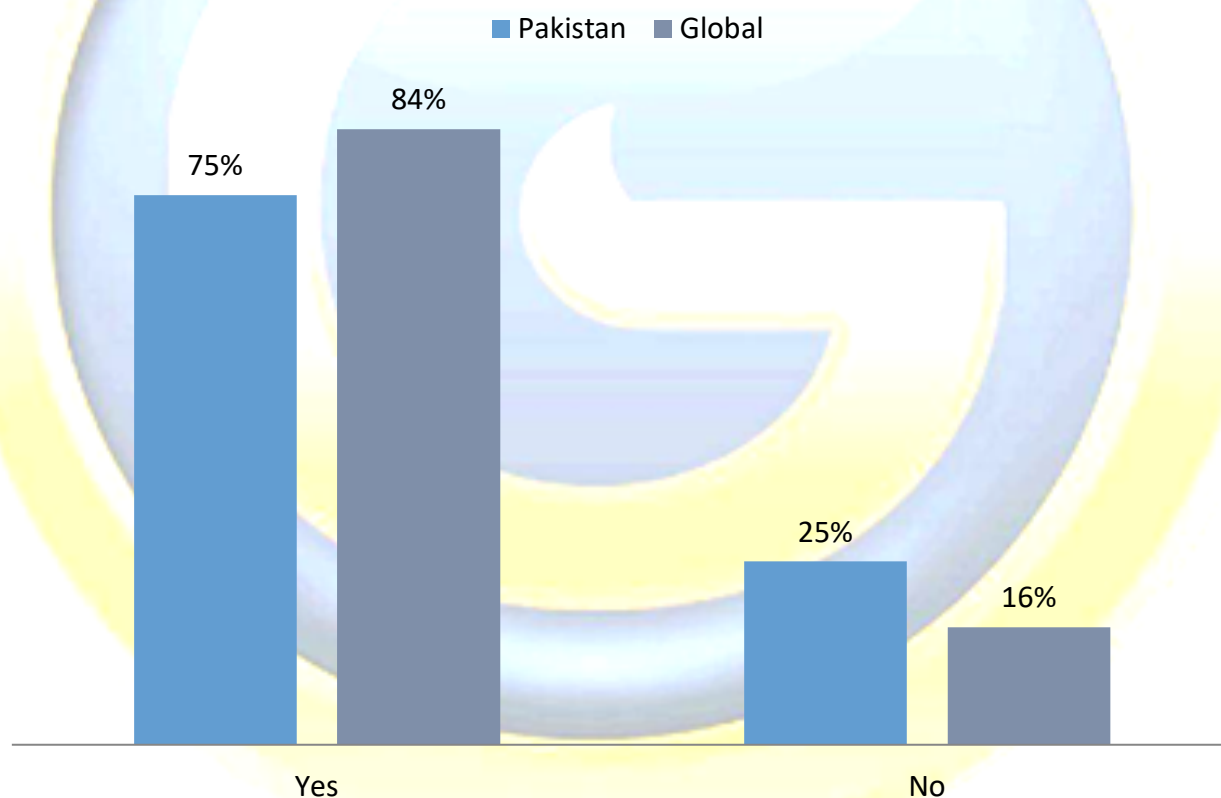

According to a World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Poll, 75% claim that they would like to have people from different race as their neighbors.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“Would you like to have people from different race as your neighbors?”* In response to this question, 75% said yes while 25% said no.

Global Results: Globally, 16% respondents would not prefer neighbors who are of a different race.

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, between 2017 and 2019. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
