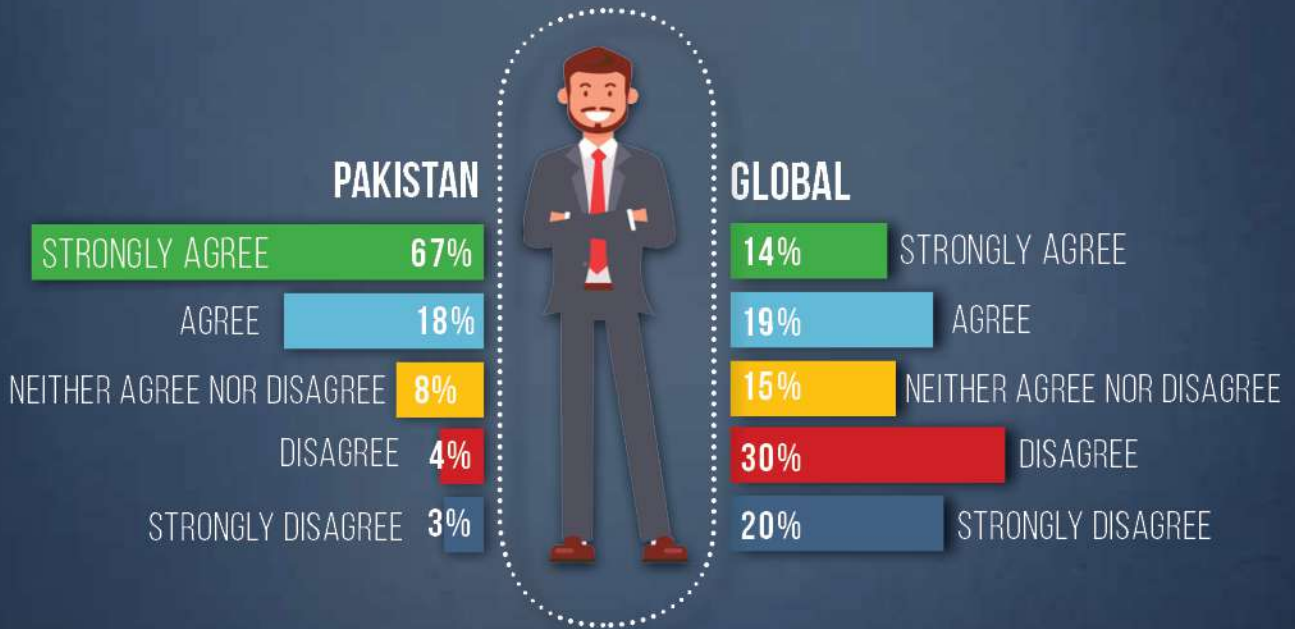

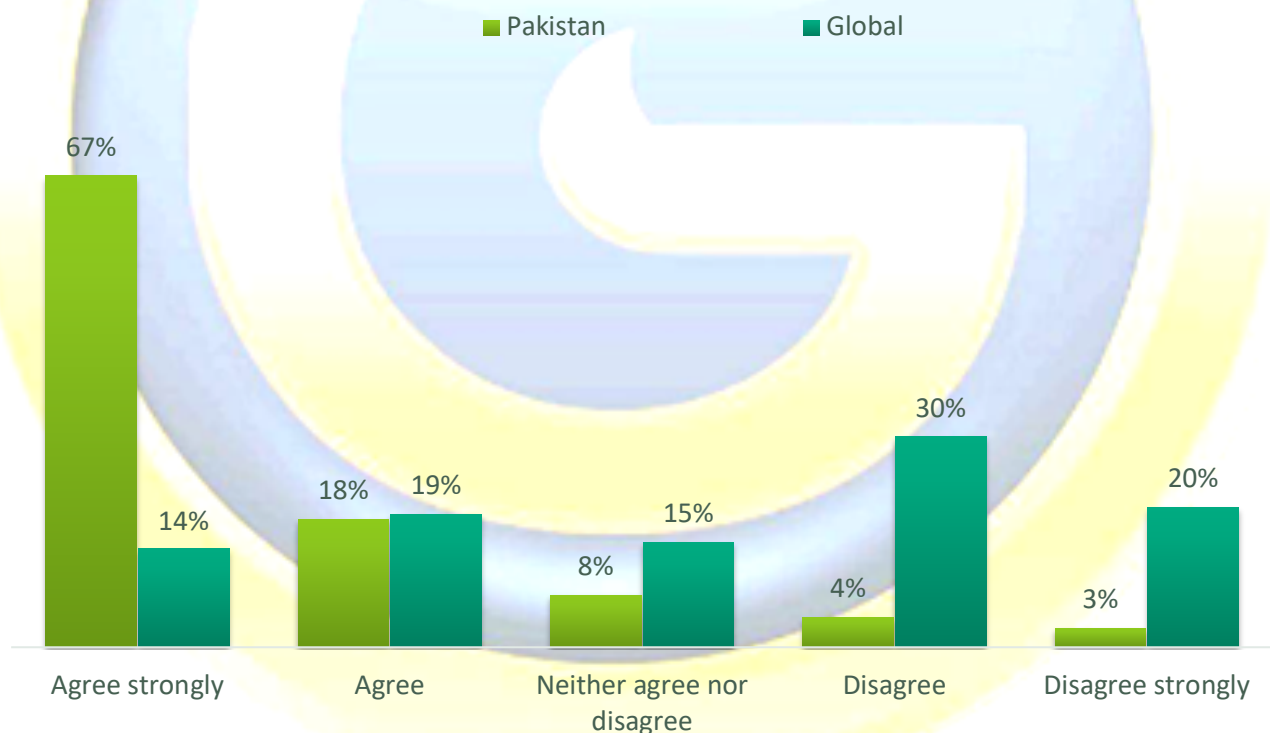

According to a World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Poll, 85% Pakistanis agree that men have more right to a job than women when jobs are scarce.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, "Do you think that when jobs are scarce, men should have more right to a job than women?" In response to this question, 67% strongly agreed, 18% agreed, 8% neither agreed or disagreed, 4% disagreed and 3% strongly disagreed.

Global Results: Globally, 33% respondents agree while 50% disagree with the statement.

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, between 2017 and 2019. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2-3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
