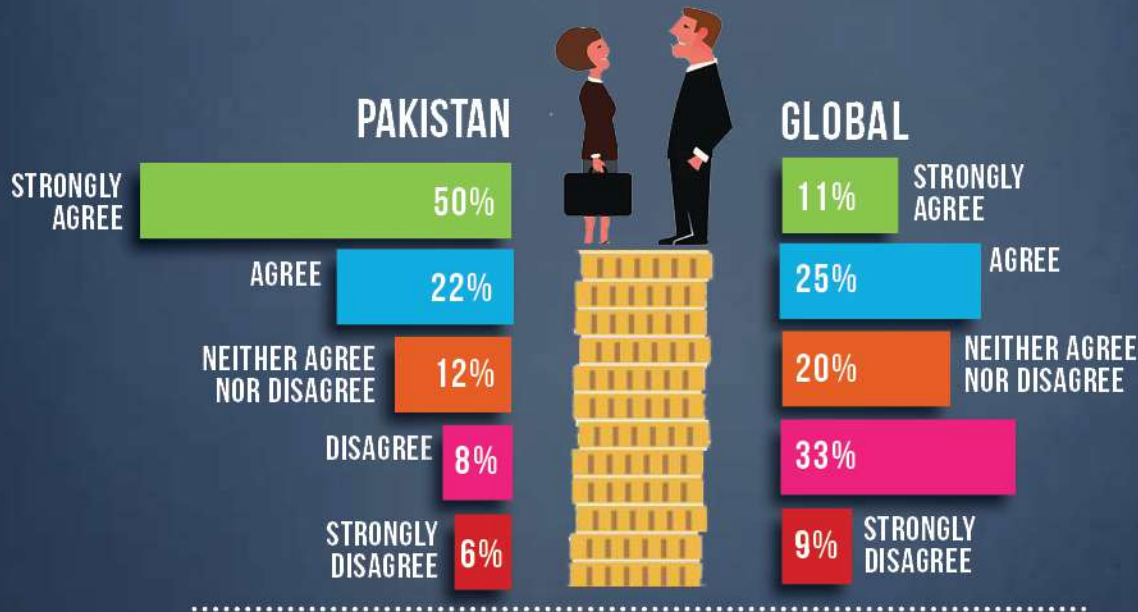

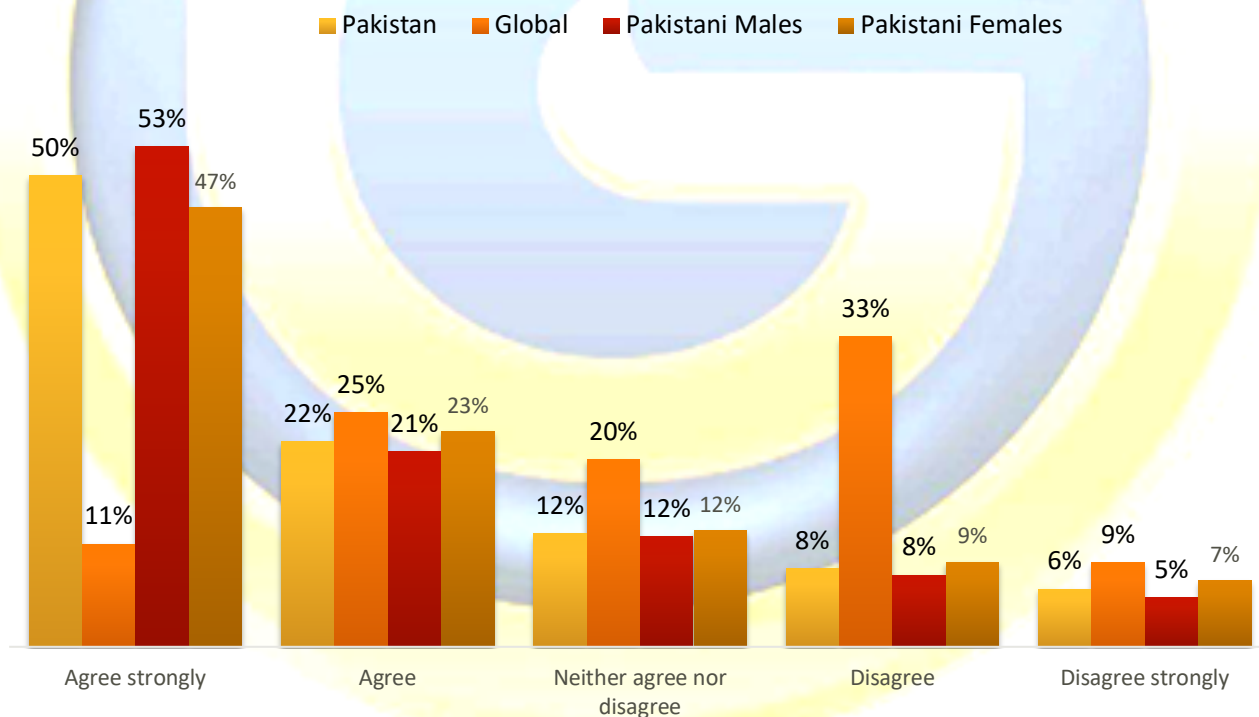
According to a World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Poll, 72% Pakistanis think it is a problem when women earn more than their husband.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*Do you think it is a problem if women have more income than husband?*” In response to this question, 50% strongly agreed, 22% agreed, 12% neither agreed or disagreed, 8% disagreed and 6% strongly disagreed.

Gender Breakdown: 70% Pakistani females and 74% Pakistani males agree with the statement.

Global Results: Globally, 36% respondents agree while 41% disagree with the statement.

The study was released by World Values Survey and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1995 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, between 2017 and 2019. The global sample was 125,098. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
