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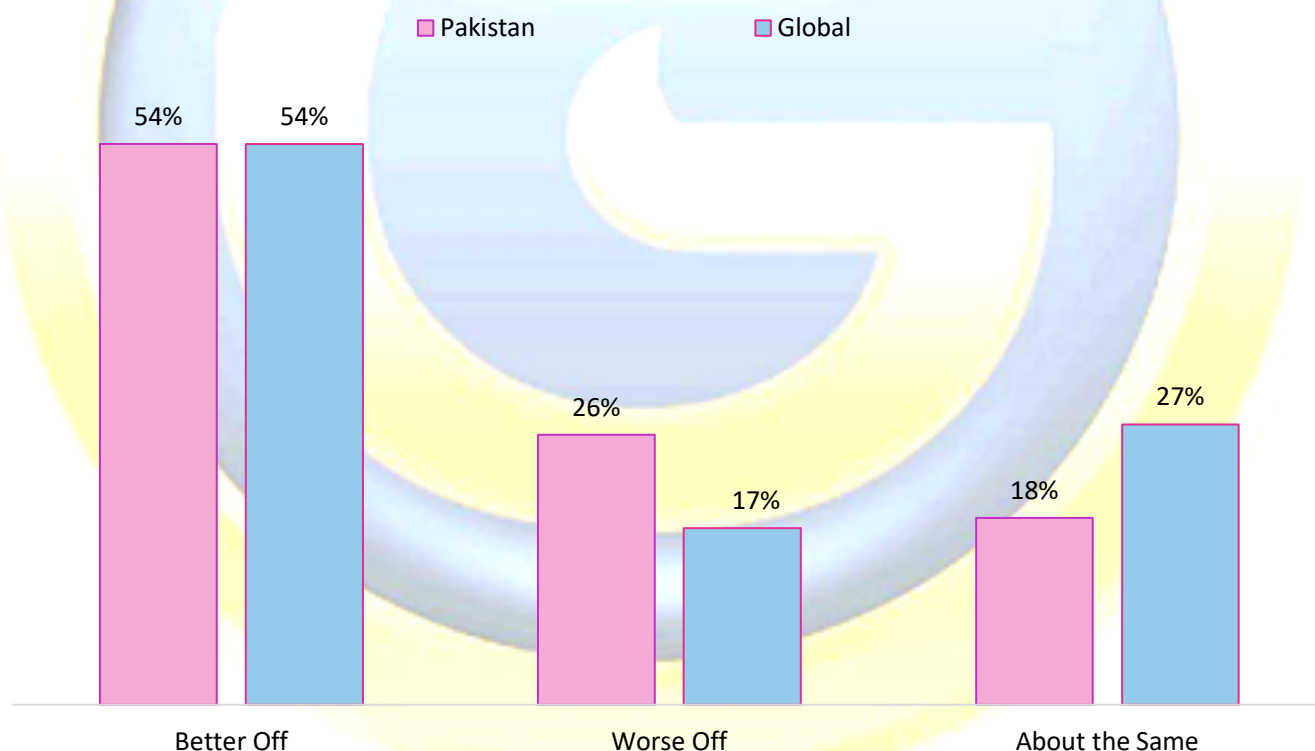

According to a World Values Survey and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Poll, 26% Pakistanis said their standard of living is worse off than their parents when they were the same age.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Comparing your standard of living with your parents’ standard of living when they were about your age, would you say that you are better off, worse off or about the same?” In response to this question, 54% said better off, 26% said worse off and 18% said about the same.

Global Results: Globally, 54% said they are better off.
