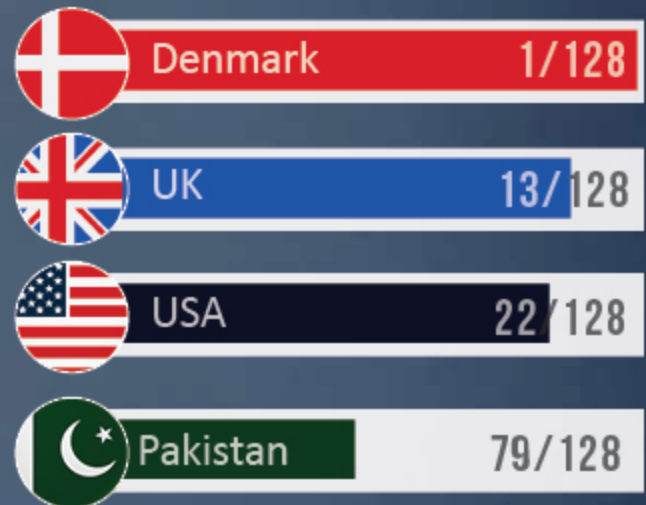

Pakistan ranks 79th across 128 countries in the world on constraints of Government Power index. (World Justice Project and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)

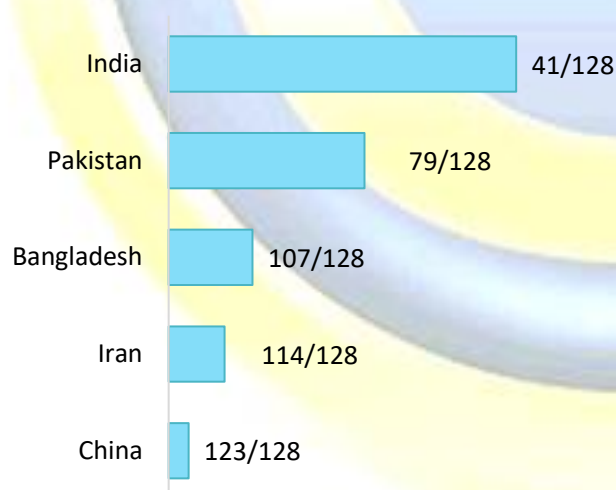
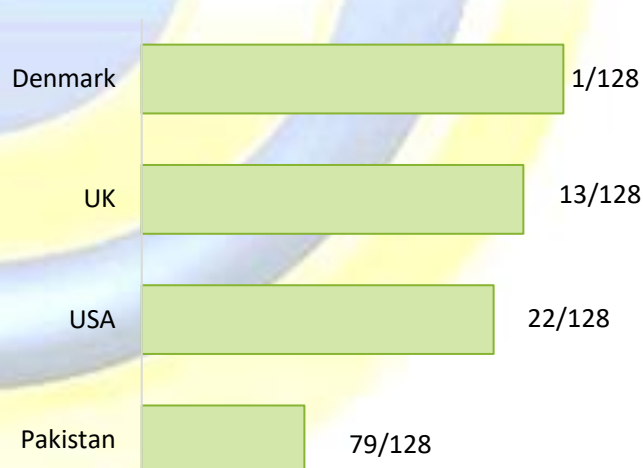

According to a World Justice Project (WJP) Survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, Pakistan ranks 79 among 128 countries surveyed in the world in terms of constraints on government power.

The global survey results are based on Factor 1 of the WJP Rule of Law Index that measures the extent to which those who govern are bound by law. It comprises the means, both constitutional and institutional, by which the powers of the government and its officials and agents are limited and held accountable under the law. It also includes non-governmental checks on the government's power, such as a free and independent press.

Pakistan's score on the index (0.49) fell in 2020 from (0.59) in 2019, thus indicating a fall in Pakistan's performance on the constraints of government power index.

The index is based on several indicators such as efficacy of legislative bodies, independent auditing and review of government, independence of judiciary and media, accountability of official misconduct, and integrity of electoral process. Within the sub-factors, Pakistan ranks 74/128 in terms of limiting government power via judiciary; 74/128 in terms of non-government checks on government power and 80/128 on independent government audits and reviews limiting government power.

The study was released by World Justice Project and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The country scores and rankings presented in this report are built from more than 500 variables drawn from the assessments of more than 130,000 households and 4,000 legal practitioners and experts in 128 countries and jurisdictions. The study in Pakistan was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
