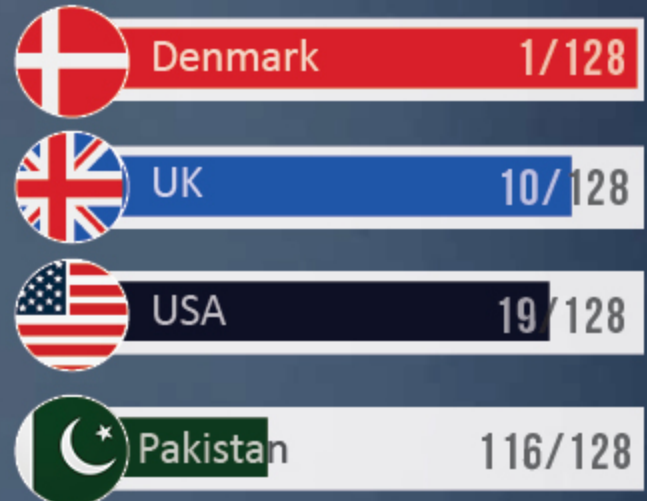

Pakistan ranks 116 amongst 128 countries in the world on absence of corruption index. (World Justice Project and Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)

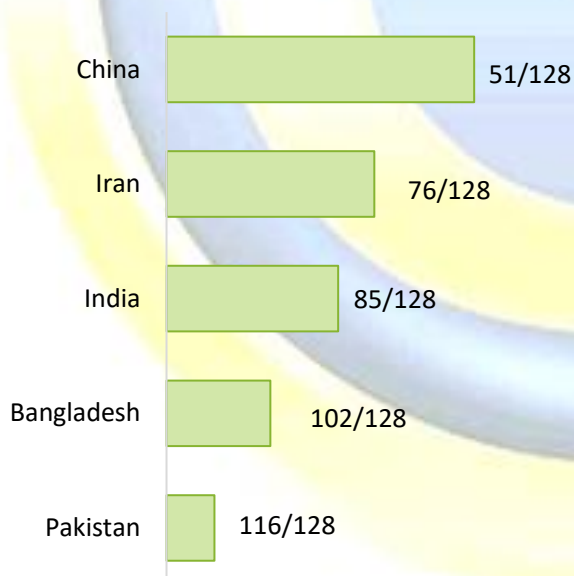
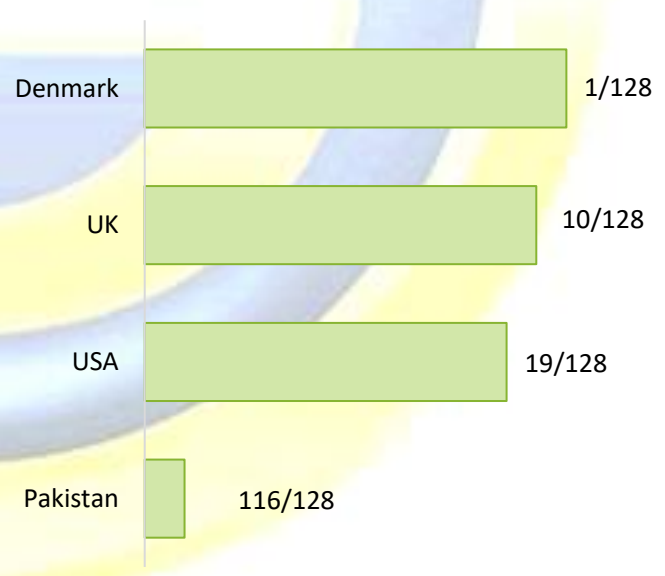

According to a World Justice Project (WJP) Survey conducted by Gallup Pakistan, Pakistan ranks 116 among 128 countries surveyed on the of absence of corruption index.

The global survey results are based on Factor 2 of the WJP Rule of Law Index which measures the absence of corruption in government. The factor considers three forms of corruption: bribery, improper influence by public or private interests, and misappropriation of public funds or other resources. These three forms of corruption are examined with respect to government officers in the executive branch, the judiciary, the military, police, and the legislature.

Pakistan's score on the index (0.31) fell in 2020 from (0.32) in 2019, thus indicating a fall in Pakistan's performance on the absence of corruption index.

The index is based on several indicators such as government officials in the executive offices, judiciary, police, military, and legislative branches not using offices for personal gains. Within the sub-factors, Pakistan ranks 101/128 in terms of executive branches not using office for personal gains, while Pakistan ranks 122/128 in terms of officials in police and military not using office for personal gains.

The study was released by World Justice Project and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The country scores and rankings presented in this report are built from more than 500 variables drawn from the assessments of more than 130,000 households and 4,000 legal practitioners and experts in 128 countries and jurisdictions. The study in Pakistan was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 2019. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
